This 1958 Agricultural Report is being submitted in accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code. It reports on the condition, acreage, production and value of the agricultural products produced in this County, and every effort has been made to make it as accurate as possible.


The total value of our agricultural production decreased in 1958 by \$391,689. The crops showing major decreases were: Walnuts were down \$1,349,313 mainly due to a reduced price. Apricot values declined \$392,348 due to adverse weather conditions which cut production almost in half. Sweet corn showed a decrease of \$391,168 which was mainly a result of a lower price received. Asparagus showed a loss of \$249,182 which was due to less acreage in production and consequently less production.

Some of the more important increases in values were in Livestock up \$1,054,130, Pears up \$393,469, and Almonds up \$268,715, all due to a better price received by the producer. Lettuce values increased by \$393,917 due to additional acreage and increased production.

All values are gross receipts received by the producer at roadside or the first point of delivery and do not include the cost of production.

Many individuals and organizations have contributed information which was used in this report and we are very grateful for their assistance. The data used in this report was gathered by the staff members and assembled by Mr. K. E. Danielson, Assistant Agricultural Commissioner.

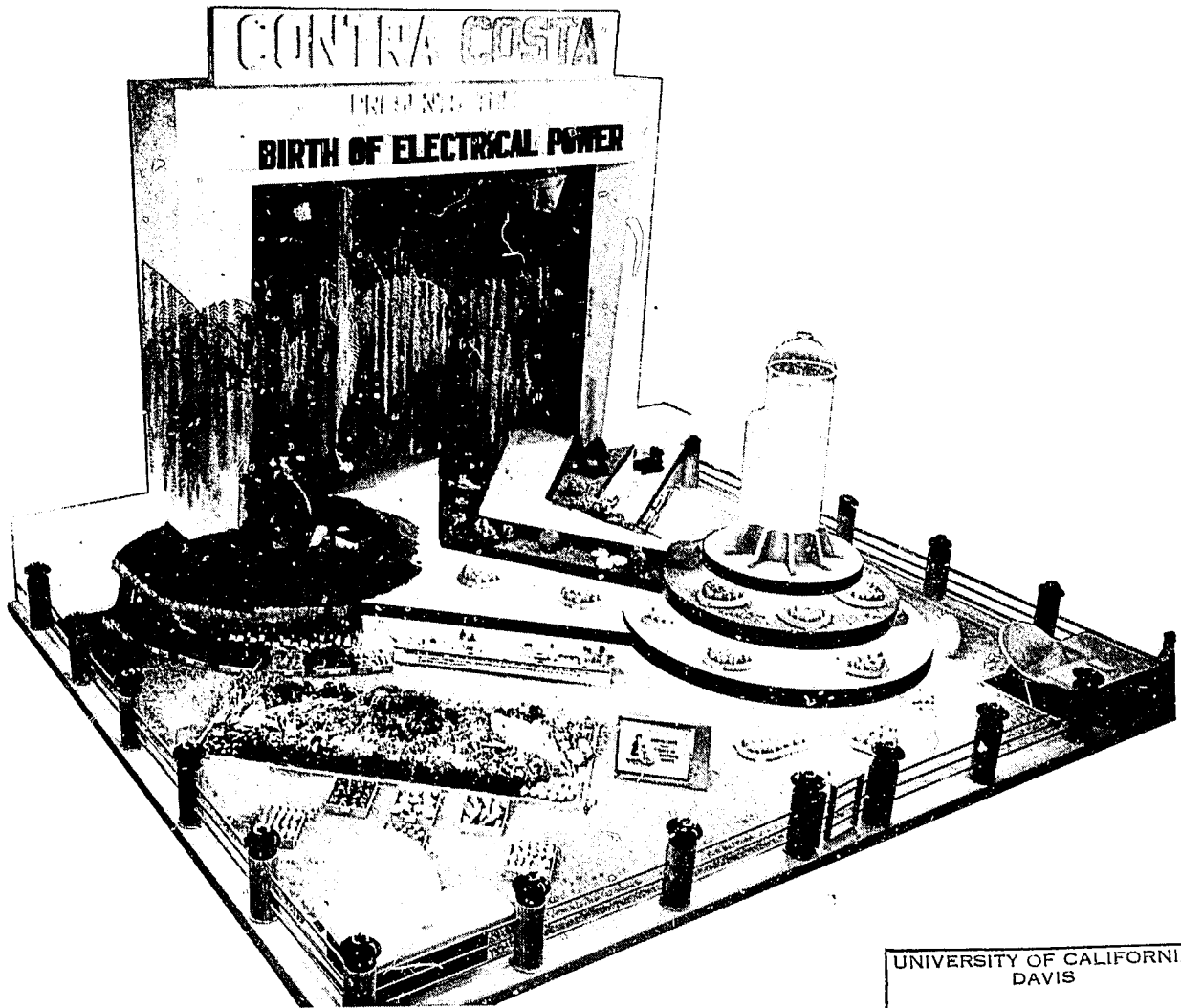

This 1959 Agricultural Report is being submitted in accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code. It reports on the condition, acreage, production and value of the agricultural products produced in this County.

The form of our report has been changed to conform as nearly as possible to the recommendations of the State Association of County Agricultural Commissioners and the California Department of Agriculture. 1958 figures are also given to show a comparison. The acres listed represent bearing acres rather than total acres for a crop as was shown in previous reports.


The 1959 total shows an increase in value of \$1,884,427. The major crops accounting for this increased value were: Asparagus, Lettuce, Almonds, Apricots, and Nursery Stock. Generally the increase was a result of increased production.

Agricultural items showing a decrease in value were: Sweet Corn, Tomatoes, Pears, Walnuts, Livestock and Poultry. Lower prices or lower production were responsible for the decreased value.

All figures represent gross receipts received by the producers and do not take into account the cost of production and marketing.

We are grateful to all individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report. The data used in this report was gathered by the staff members and assembled by Mr. James M. Moon, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner.



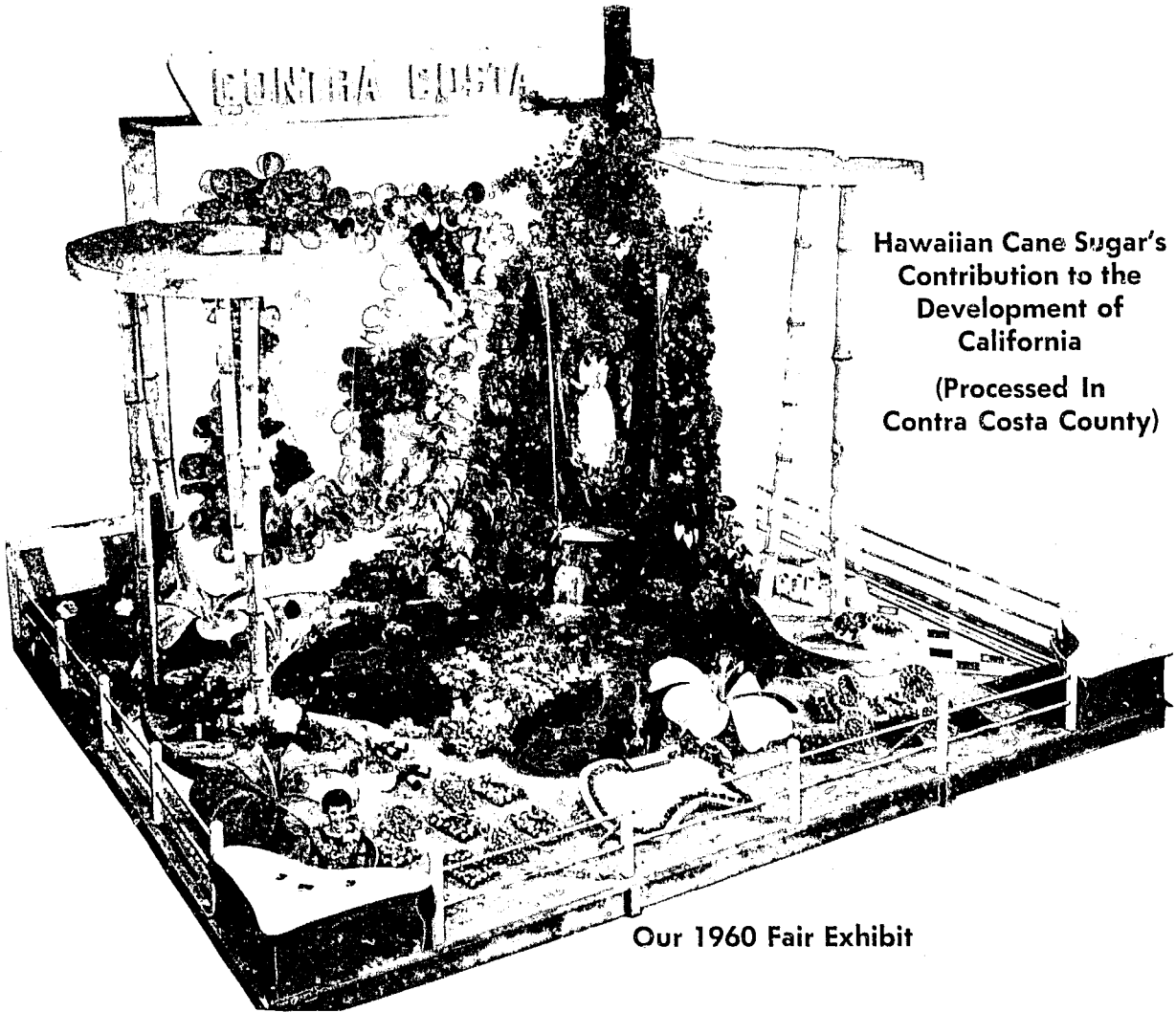

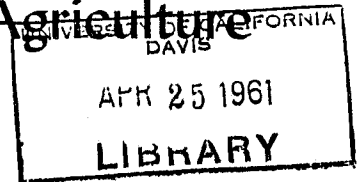

I am pleased to submit the 1960 Agricultural Report as required by Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code. This report covers the acreage, production, and value of agricultural products in the County. The values shown are based on gross income and do not represent net income received by the farmers.

The 1960 total shows an increase in value of \$1,603,663 over 1959. A higher price received for Walnuts, Sweet Corn, Lettuce, and Asparagus accounted for the major part of the increase in value. Agricultural items showing a major decrease in value were: Apricots and Almonds, due to lower production and Cattle and Calves, due to a low feed supply.

Our report shows that the following grossed more than \$1,000,000: Lettuce, Asparagus, Almonds, Apricots, Walnuts, Cattle and Calves, and Milk.

I wish to express my appreciation to all individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report and to the members of the staff who gathered the information which was assembled by Mr. James M. Moon, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner.

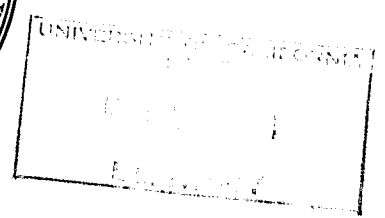

Total gross value for this year was down \$1,927,057 from the previous record year.

Million dollar crops showing an increase in value and the reasons are as follows:

- Asparagus - increase in harvested acreage.
- Almonds - increased yield per acre.
- Pasture and range (non-irrigated) - increased rainfall extending the time for pasturing cattle.

Million dollar crops showing a decrease in value and the reasons are as follows:

- Lettuce - less acreage and a lower price.
- Tomatoes - extensive reduction in acreage.
- Apricots - less tonnage and lower price.
- Walnuts - lower total tonnage.
- Milk - less production.
- Cattle (all) - lower price.

This report represents the gross income to producers and does not take into consideration the cost of production.

The 1964 report shows an increase of \$1,154,718 over the previous year. Major crops contributing to this increase in value were almonds, apricots, asparagus, cherries, pears, walnuts, sweet corn, sugar beets and tomatoes. A decrease in the value of livestock was due to reduced production and/or less market value.

I would like to extend my appreciation to all who contributed information that made this report possible.



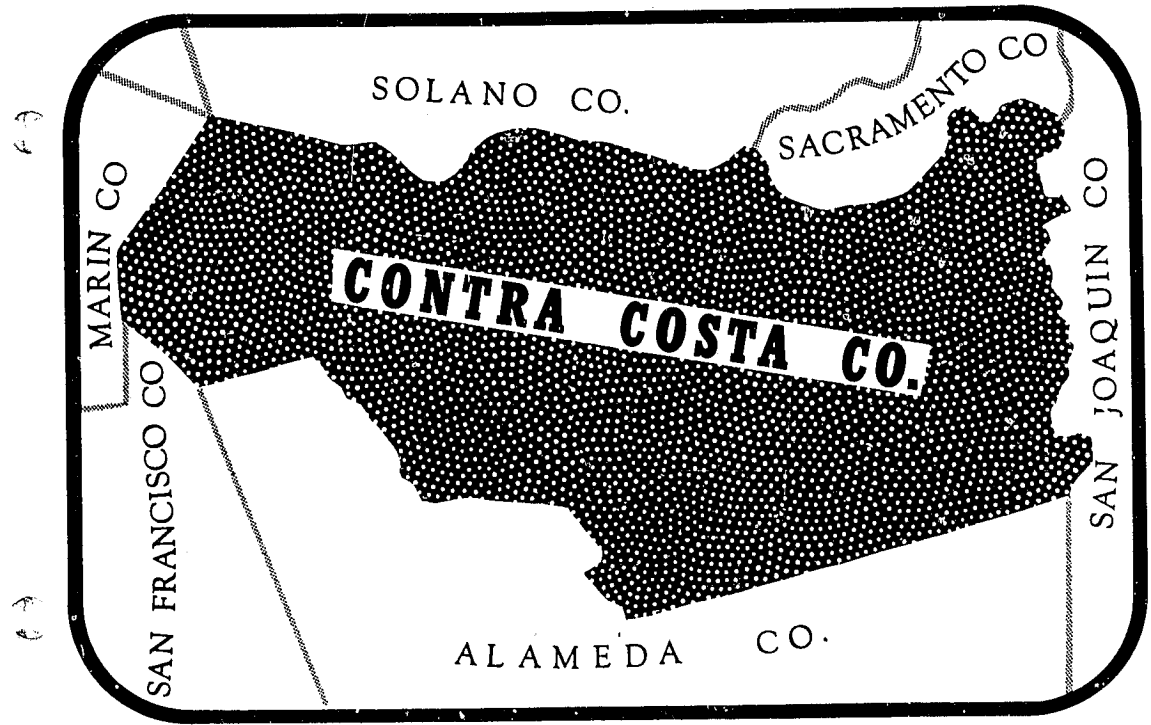

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1965 Agricultural Crop Report for Contra Costa County. It must be emphasized that these figures represent gross farm value, that includes growing, harvesting and packing costs, and do not reflect net returns to the growers.

The annual income for 1965 was \$999,079 higher than the preceding year. Increased production and value of livestock returns were due to favorable range conditions and an improved market. Notable increases were also registered in the production and/or value of grapes, head lettuce and tomatoes. However, these increases were offset by lower production and/or value of apricots, asparagus, cherries, pears, walnuts and sugar beets.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to all who have furnished information that made the compilation of this report possible.

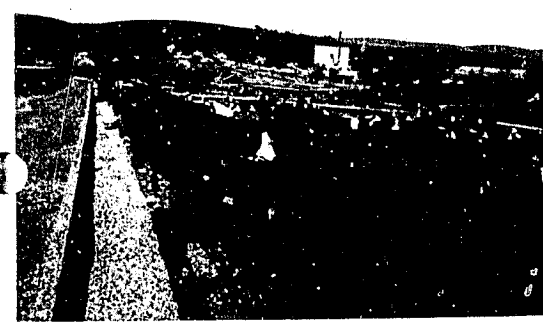
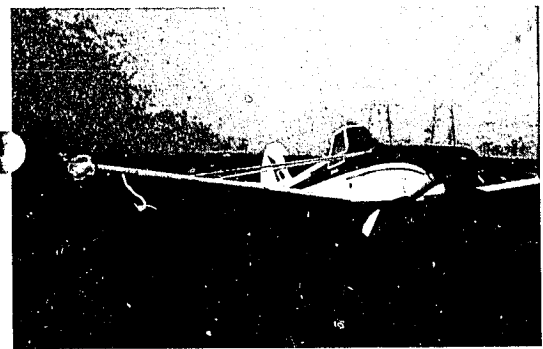

I am pleased to submit the 1967 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

This report covers the acreage, production and value of agricultural products grown in the county. The values shown represent gross value of production and do not reflect net income received by the farmers.

The gross value of agricultural production in Contra Costa County during the year 1967 was \$29,443,660, which was a decrease of \$8,151,912 below the 1966 value.

Major decreases in value of head lettuce, tomatoes and almond crops accounted for over half of the total decrease in value of the crops. Current inventorying of all livestock categories and review of all known sales indicate a lower gross value for the production of cattle and calves than previously reported.

I wish to express my appreciation to all who contributed information for this report and to the members of the staff who gathered and assembled it.

I am pleased to submit the 1970 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

This report, covering acreage, production and value of all agricultural products, including livestock, represents the gross value of production, and does not reflect net income received by producers.

The total gross value of agricultural production in Contra Costa County during the year of 1970 was \$30,797,886, which is a decrease of \$1,142,217 from the 1969 value.

Severe spring frosts and poor pollination resulted in a major reduction in the total production and value of the fruit and nut crops. Categories showing increases in total value include Livestock and Poultry, Livestock and Poultry Products, Nursery, Vegetable and Field Crops.

I would like to express my appreciation to all individuals who contributed information for this report, and to the staff members responsible for compiling the data.
