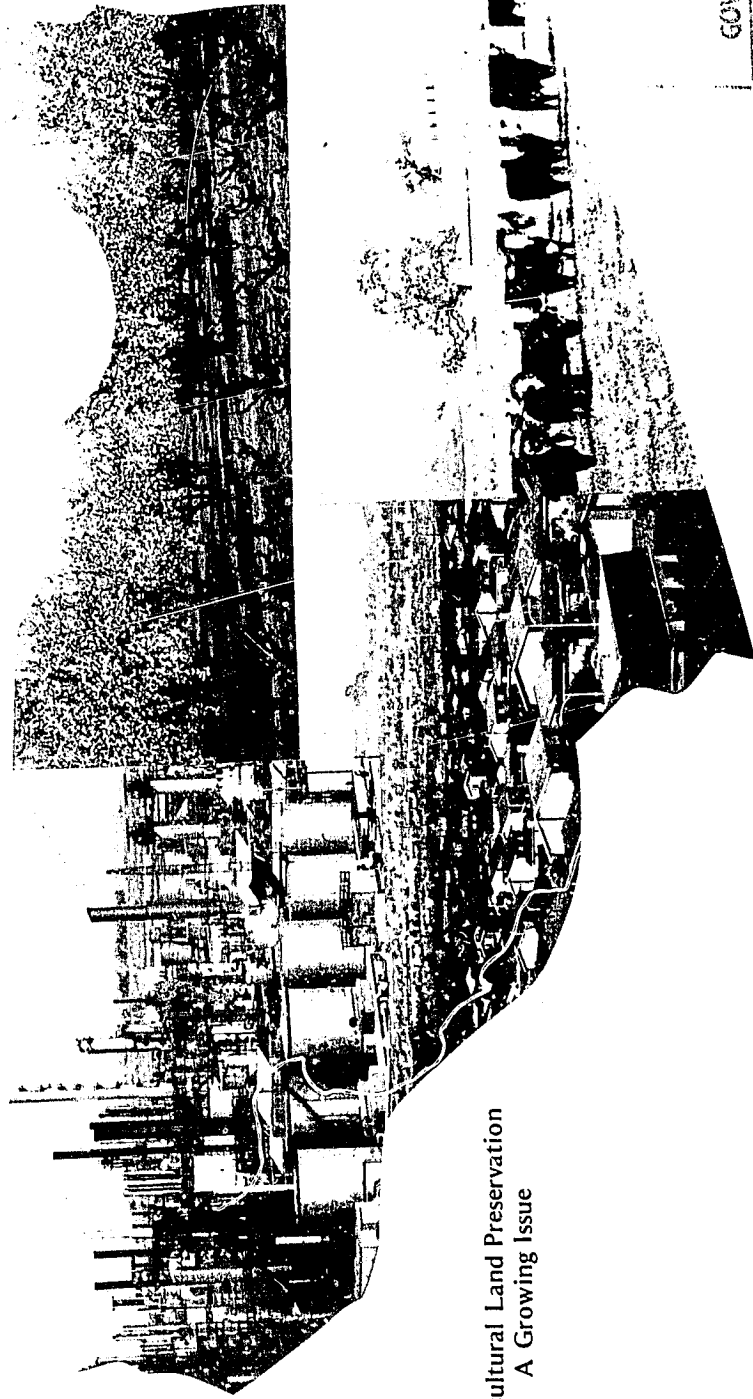

I am pleased to submit the 1971 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code. This report represents the gross income to producers and does not consider the cost of production.

The total gross value of all agricultural production in Contra Costa County for 1971 was \$32,946,735, resulting in a \$2,498,649 increase over the 1970 value.

All categories except Livestock and Poultry and Livestock Products showed increases in total value. Record lettuce prices and increased yields of many fruit and nut crops contributed largely to the increase in total value for 1971. Over 1,000 acres of apricot and almond trees were removed during 1971 with anticipation of changing to crops with higher market value.

I would like to express my appreciation to all individuals who contributed information for this report, and to the staff members responsible for compiling the data.



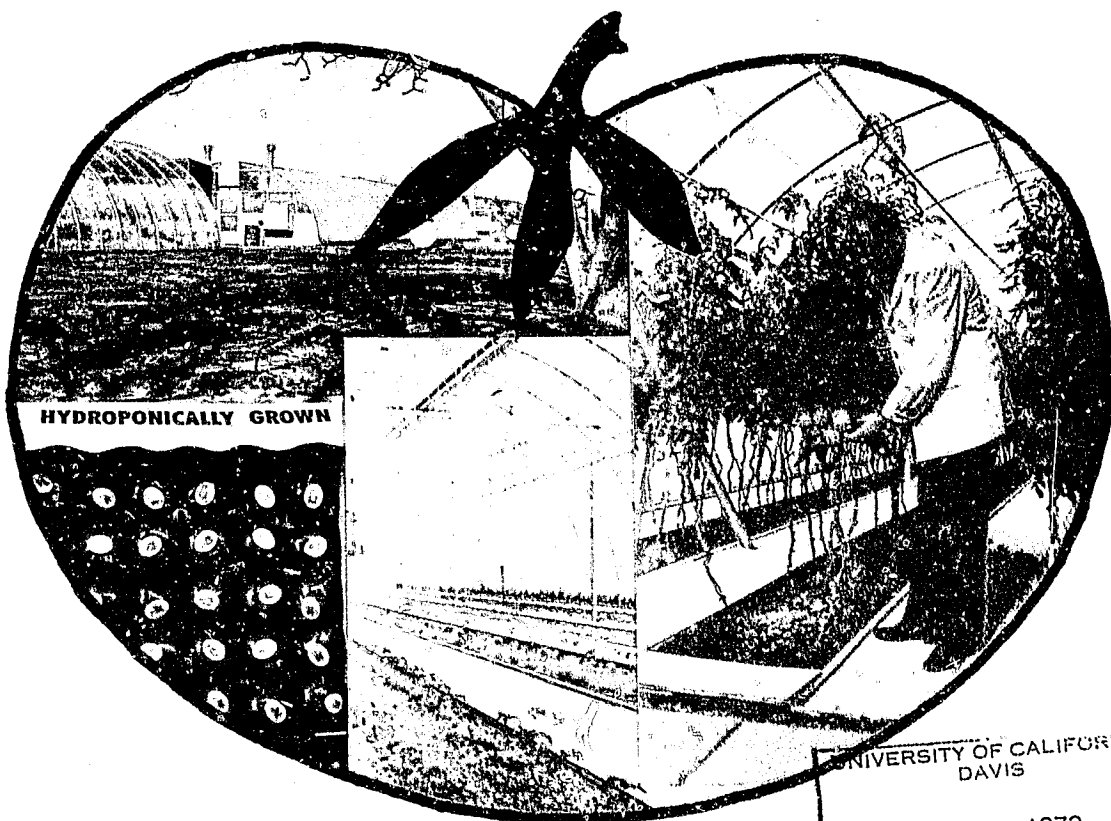

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1972 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County.

It must be emphasized that this report represents the gross value of the products and does not reflect profits to the producer.

The 1972 total gross value of agricultural production in Contra Costa County was \$31,878,566, a decline of \$2,585,469 from the previous year.

Increases in beef prices and nursery production increased the gross value for Livestock and Nursery \$2,647,670 over 1971. Extreme weather conditions throughout the year caused lower yields and increased expenses for most producers. A drop in price and early fall rains resulted in a \$5,684,000 reduction in value for lettuce.

We are grateful to all individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report, and to the staff members for compiling the data.



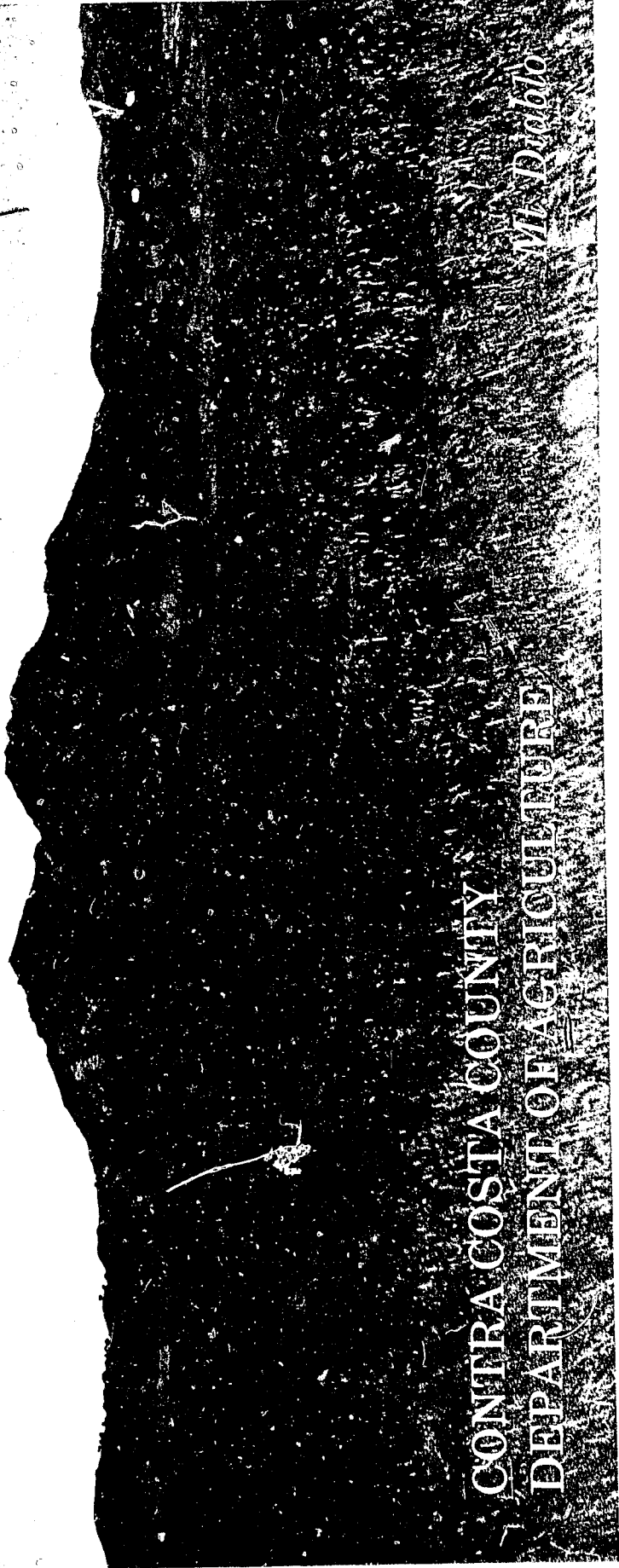

I am pleased to submit the 1973 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

The total gross value of agricultural crops and products was a record breaking \$40,233,486 in 1973, an \$8,171,920 increase over 1972.

It must be emphasized that the values in this report reflect only the gross receipts and do not reflect net profits to the producer.

Rapidly increasing production costs and rising prices were major contributors to the value increases for most categories in 1973. Five categories, including Livestock and Poultry, Nursery Products, Fruit and Nut Crops, Vegetable Crops and Field Crops registered increases exceeding \$1,000,000 over 1972.

Christmas tree production has been included under Nursery Crops for the first time this year.

I wish to express my appreciation to all individuals who contributed information for this report and especially to the members of my staff who assisted in obtaining and compiling the data.

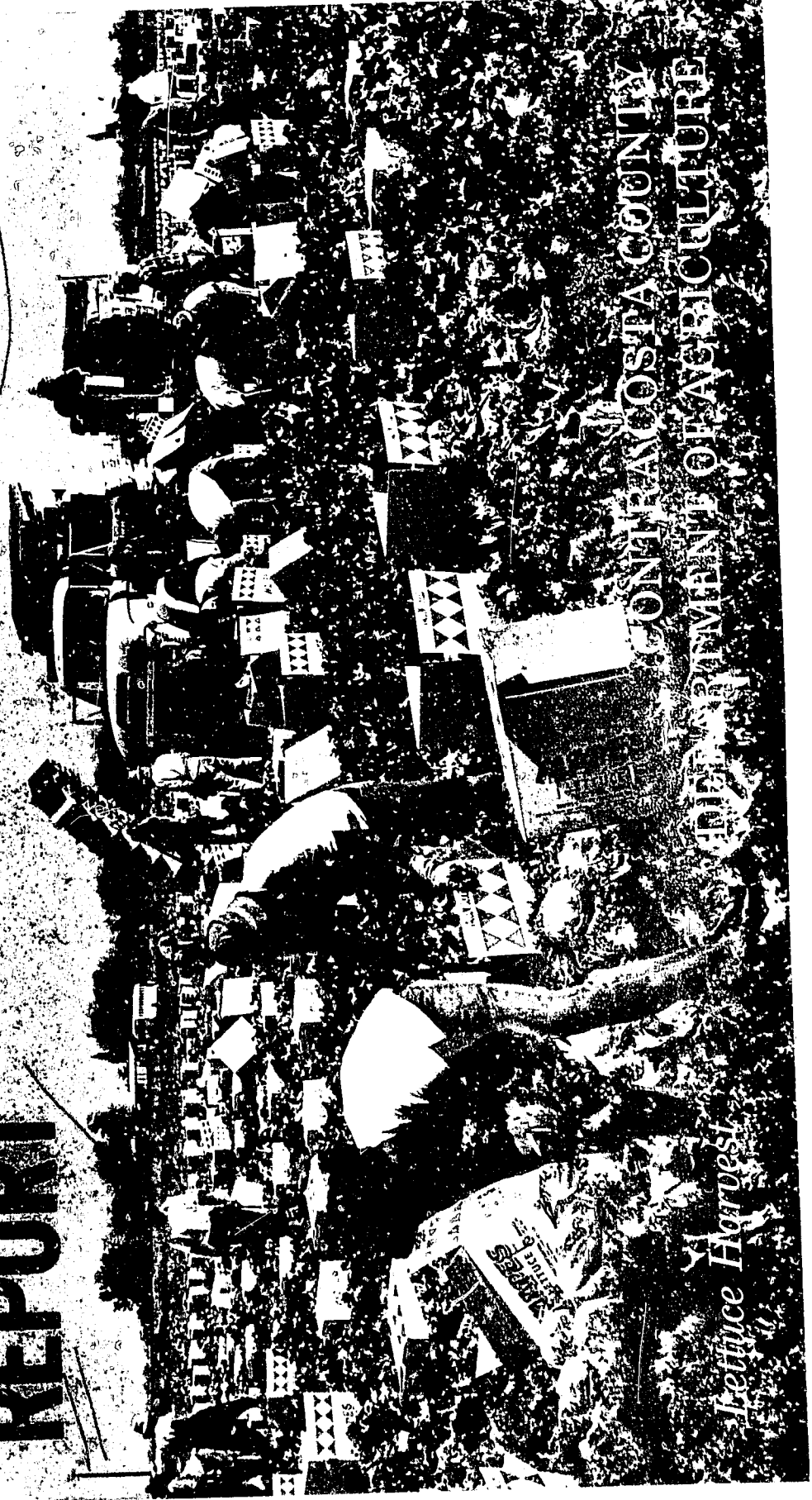

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1974 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County.

The 1974 total gross value of agricultural crops and products jumped \$12,268,828 to a new record of \$53,222,814. This increase in gross receipts primarily reflects the continuing increases in production costs, rising prices, and larger acreages being planted.

Most of the general categories increased in gross value with Field Crops, Vegetable Crops, and Nursery Products each showing advances exceeding \$2,000,000. Tomatoes, sugar beets, head lettuce, miscellaneous nursery crops and milk were the major contributors to the rise in gross value.

It must be emphasized that the values shown in this report are gross receipts and do not indicate net profits received by the producers.

We are grateful to all individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report, and to the staff members for compiling the data.



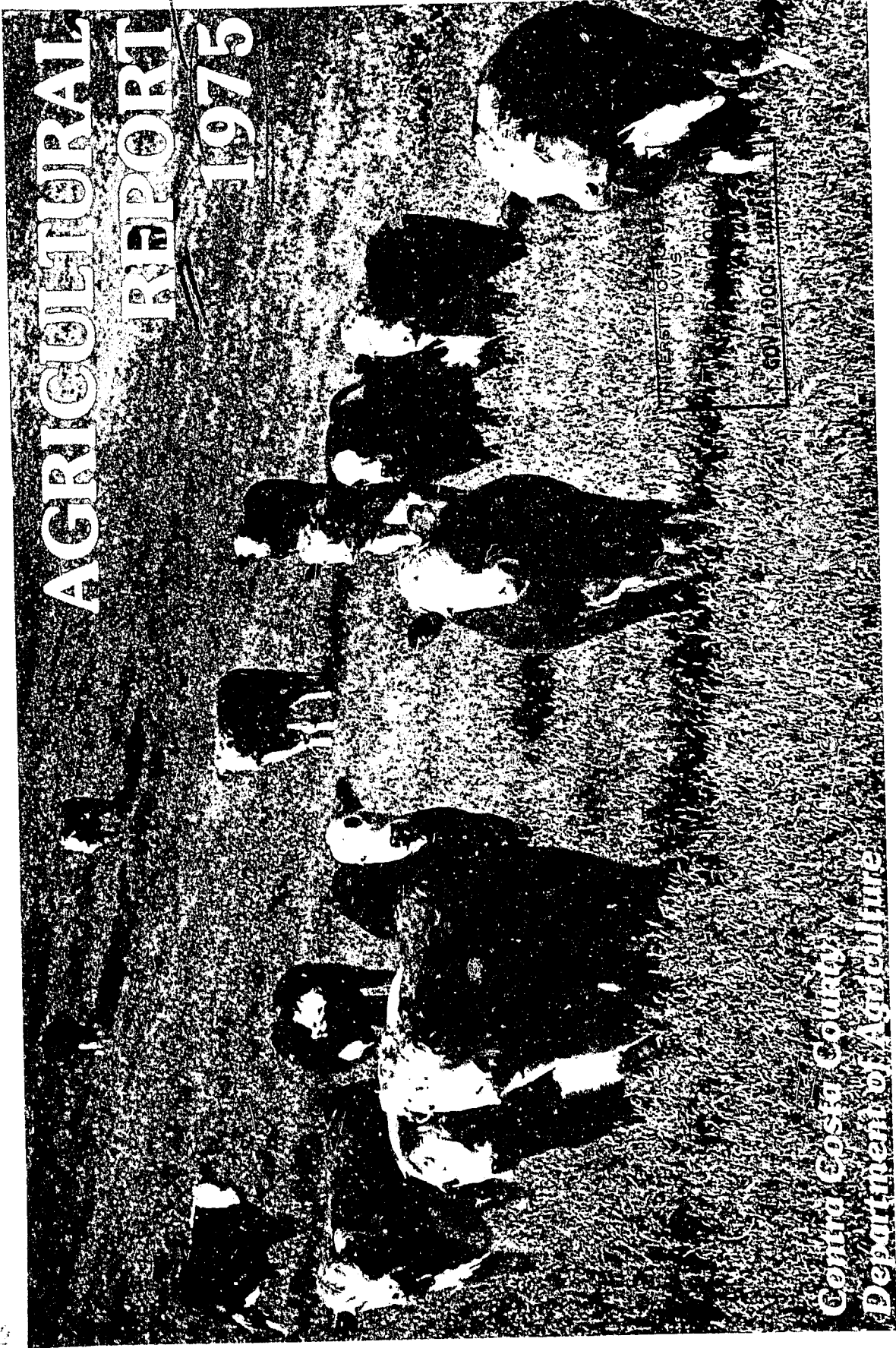

I am pleased to submit the 1975 Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County in accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The total gross value of agricultural crops and products was \$49,805,050, a decline of \$4,590,864 from the 1974 record. Primary reasons for this decrease were a reduction in the number of cattle feedlots in the county, coupled with 20% lower beef prices and a substantial drop in the prices for head lettuce and sugar beets. Nursery Products was the only major category showing significant gain in gross value.

The reported figures represent gross values and do not reflect costs of production.

As I am retiring from county service this year, I wish to thank the many individuals and organizations who have for the past 23 years contributed information for our Annual Crop and Livestock Reports. I would also like to express my appreciation to members of the staff who have so ably assisted in obtaining and compiling the data.

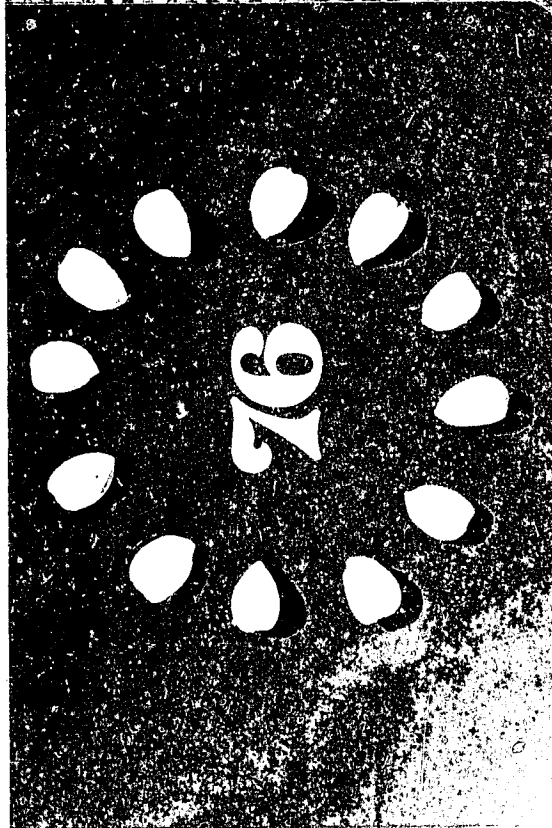

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1976 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County.

It should be emphasized that the values represented in this report are gross receipts and do not consider the cost of production, transportation and marketing.

The 1976 gross value of agricultural crops and products was \$48,446,420, a reduction of \$4,928,230 from the 1975 value.

Two major categories, Field Crops and Vegetable Crops, registered a combined drop in value of \$6,905,100 caused primarily by the 1975-76 drought, early fall rains, plus a 33% reduction in sugar prices. Nursery Products was the only major category that showed a notable increase in value -- \$1,453,400.

I would like to express my appreciation to all individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report, and to the members of my staff who assisted in obtaining and compiling the data.

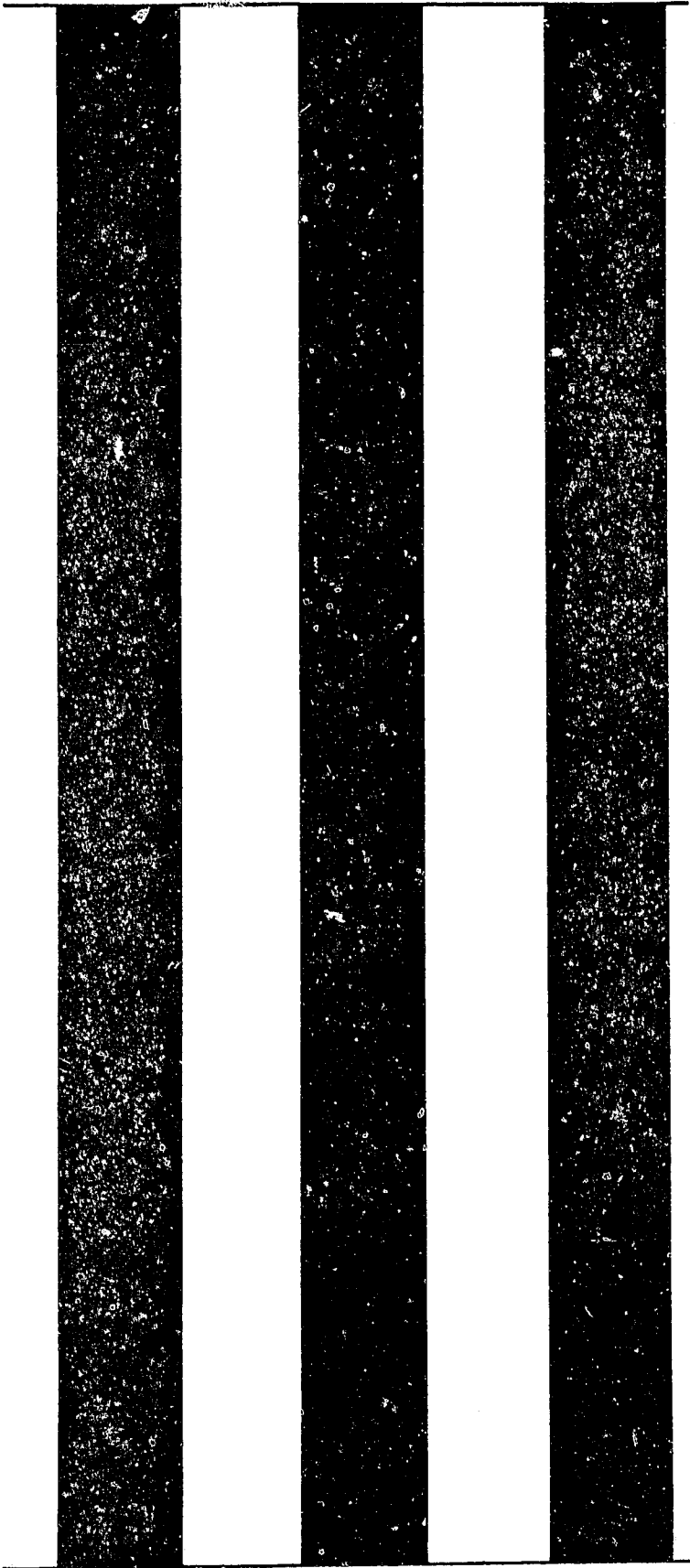

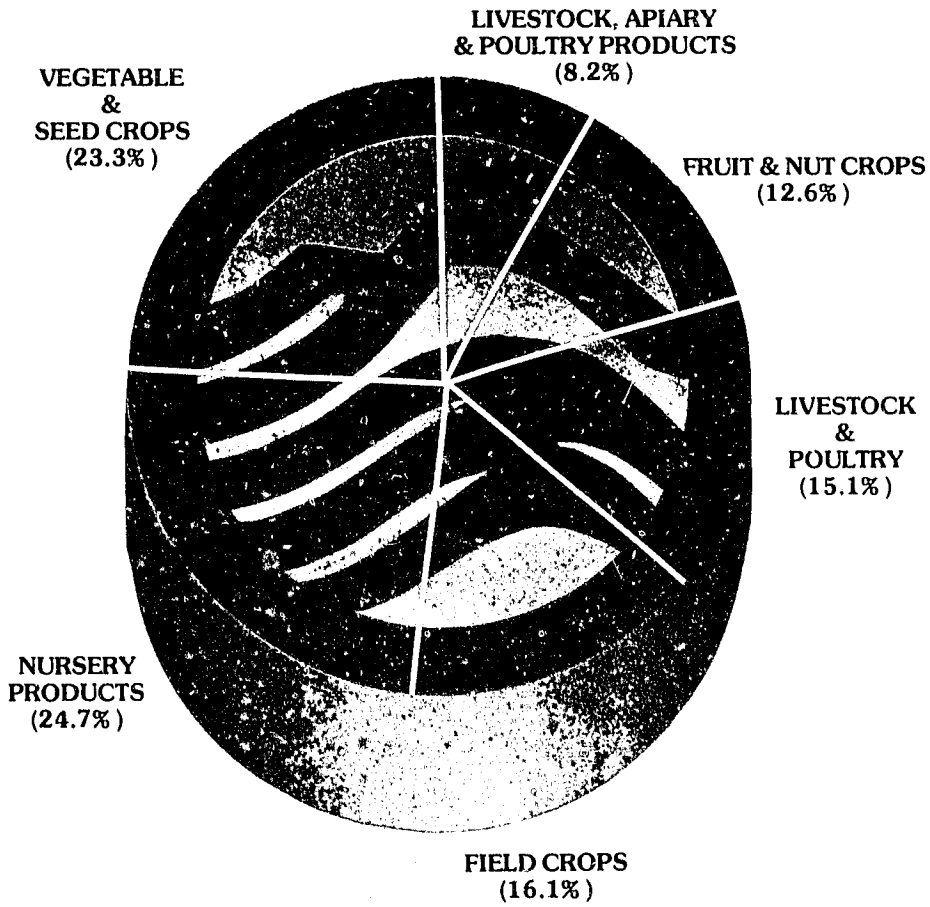

I am pleased to submit the 1977 Annual Crop and Livestock Report from Contra Costa County in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

Despite adverse effects resulting from three years of drought, the total gross value of agricultural crops and products was \$49,224,890 in 1977, an increase of \$546,870 over 1976.

Although the gross agricultural value in 1977 was close to the 1976 gross value, some changes did occur in several commodities. The Vegetable/Seed Crops and Nursery Crops categories increased \$2.5 million and \$1.3 million respectively, while the Livestock and Poultry category showed a decline of \$3.9 million. A sell off of cattle during the two previous years caused by California's severe drought was reflected in the drop in the Livestock and Poultry values. Increases in processing tomato prices and acreage were the major factors for increased value in the Vegetable/Seed category.

It must be emphasized that the values in this report reflect on the gross receipts and do not indicate net profits to the producer.

I wish to thank all the individuals who contributed information for this report and especially to the members of my staff who assisted in obtaining and compiling the data.

This 1978 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County is submitted in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

I am pleased to report the highest gross value of agricultural crops and products in the history of Contra Costa County which totaled \$56,010,960 for 1978.

Adequate rainfall resulting in higher crop yields and the increased prices received for a number of commodities account for the nearly \$7.5 million increase in value over the 1977 report.

The major categories with significant increases were Field Crops, Fruit and Nut Crops and Livestock and Poultry. Nursery Products showed a lesser increase of \$440,200 with a total value of \$12,612,900.

The Vegetable and Seed Crop category value declined sharply due to a greatly reduced acreage planted to tomatoes.

I would emphasize again that the values in this report reflect the gross receipts to the producer and do not indicate the net profits.

This is my final report as Agricultural Commissioner and I want to express my thanks to all the individuals who contributed information for this report and especially to the members of my staff who performed the task of gathering and compiling the data for this report.

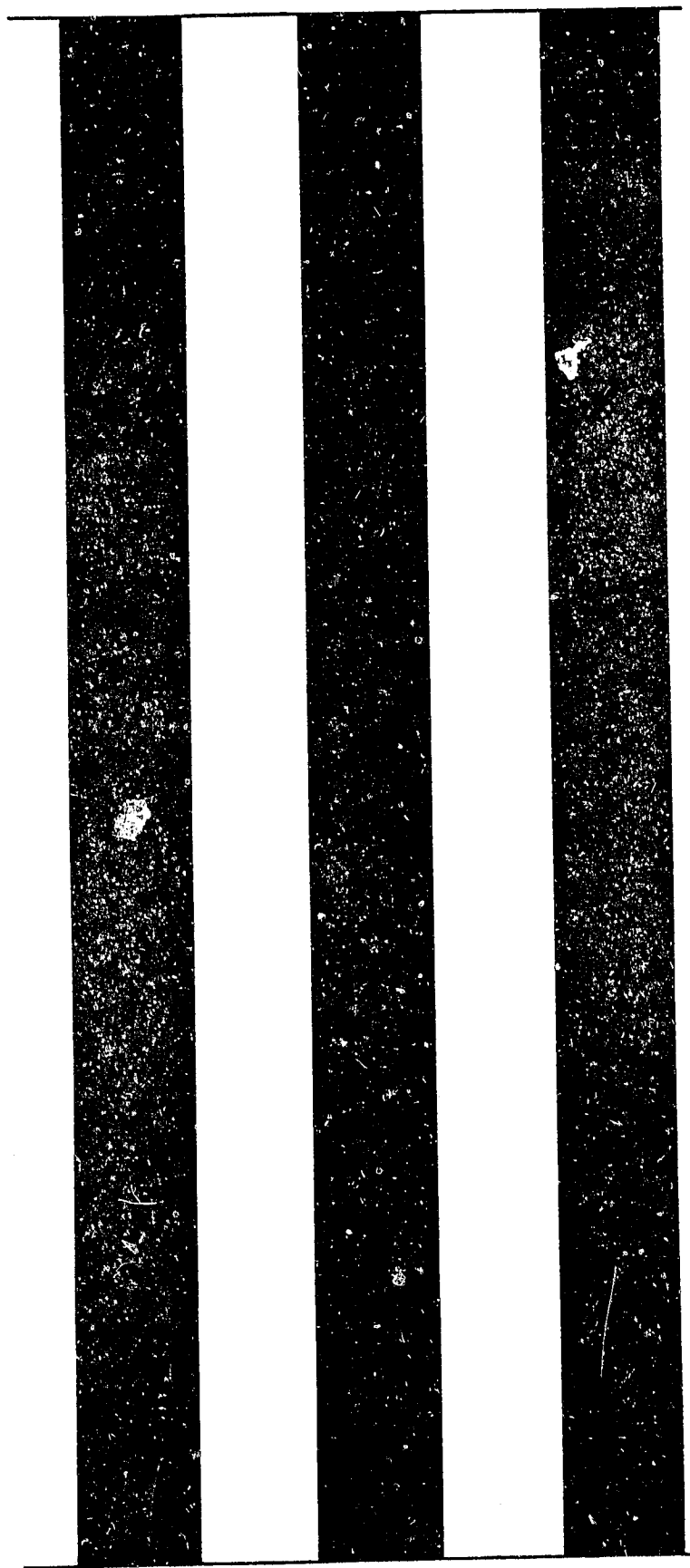

I am pleased to submit the 1979 Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County in accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The total gross value of agricultural products in 1979 was a record \$64,433,320, a jump of \$8,471,360 over the 1978 record. Generally higher prices received for farm products was the principal reason for the 15% increase in gross value. Other contributing factors were increased yields for some field and vegetable crops and increased production of nursery crops.

It must be emphasized that the values shown in this report are gross receipts and do not indicate net profits received by producers.

As this is the first annual Crop and Livestock Report since my appointment as Agricultural Commissioner, I wish to thank the many individuals and organizations who contributed information. I am also grateful to staff members who have so diligently worked in obtaining and compiling the data.

This 1980 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County is submitted in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The 1980 total gross value of agricultural crops and products was \$61,643,870 - down \$3,516,450 from the previous year. This decrease in gross receipts primarily reflects a \$5.4 million drop in livestock, field and vegetable crop categories. Approximately 10,000 acres of valuable Delta land was inundated by flooding of Webb and Holland Tracts in 1980. Although Holland Tract has been reclaimed, only late planted crops were harvested during this year.

Two categories registered gains in gross value in 1980 -- Nursery Crops up \$1.3 million and Livestock Products with a \$1.0 million increase. Rising prices for nursery products and milk were the major contributors to the upward movement in value.

It must be emphasized that the values shown in this report are gross receipts and do not indicate net profits received by producers.

We are grateful to all individuals and organizations who contributed information for this report, and to the staff members for compiling the data.

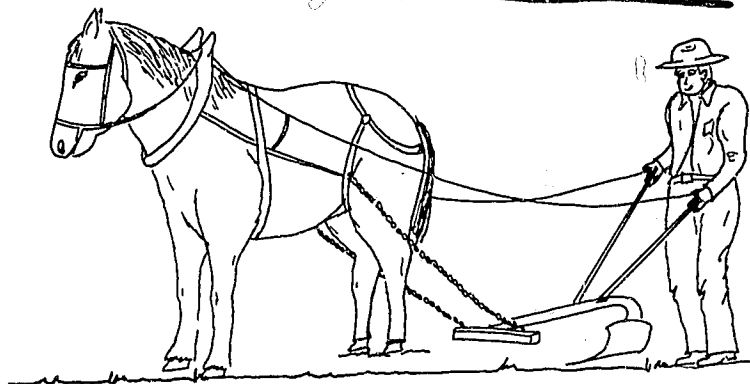

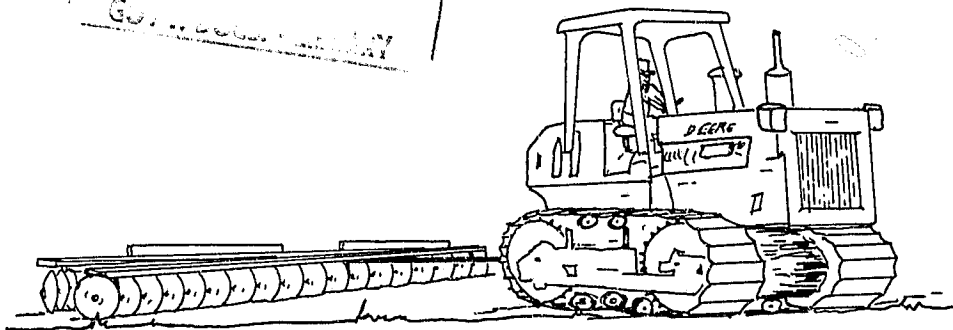
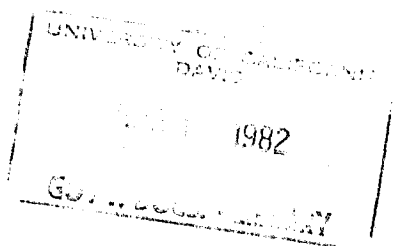

In accordance with provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1981 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Contra Costa County.

It must be emphasized that the values represented in this report are gross receipts received by the producer. They do not take into account the costs of production, transportation, or marketing.

The total gross value of agricultural crops and products in 1981 was \$60,758,090 -- down \$848,760 from the preceding year. Significant decreases were apparent in the Vegetable and Seed category (-\$1,140,800), Nursery Crops (-\$1,261,300) and Livestock and Poultry (-\$1,377,300). However, helping to offset these decreases were the substantial gains in Field Crops (\$758,500), Fruit and Nut Crops (\$1,358,200) and Livestock, Apiary, and Poultry Products (\$813,920).

I want to thank the many individuals and organizations who provided information for this report, and the staff members who compiled the data. Special thanks goes to Bob Cruickshank, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, who once again did an outstanding job in supervising the compilation of this document.
