


#### We Share--and We Learn

- Share FNS's domestic food assistance models/system, practices and lessons learned










### Food Aid

- Expanding approaches






# McGovern- Dole International Food for Education

Provides donations of US agricultural products, financial and TA to support school feeding





food economies












### Quality Benchmarks for School Feeding







