#### Introduction

This bulletin has been produced in the hope that it may be of some relevance to the increasing number of workers involved in the regional problems of the agricultural sector. It also offers material of interest to those doing research on the more general problems of manpower on a regional basis.

The data relates exclusively to the post war period and in general an attempt has been made to convert the data from various sources onto a Ministry of Labour regional basis. It was felt on the one hand that counties form too small a unit of analysis for many purposes, and on the other hand most of the data relating to general labour market conditions is produced and classified by the Ministry of Labour.

Having converted to Ministry of Labour regions important problems still remain. The definition of Ministry of Labour regions has not been constant over the post war period. In 1959

Eastern and Southern regions were combined and in 1961 three existing regions (Midlands, North Midlands and East and West Ridings) were combined to form two new regions - new Midlands (old Midlands plus North Midlands minus Lincolnshire) and Yorkshire and Lincolnshire (old East and West Ridings plus Lincolnshire).

The major deficiency is regional data on wage earnings. Industrial wage earnings at the regional level are only available as from 1960.

The position for agriculture is even worse with data for 1961.

1963. Also, there is no available data on regional cost of living differences, an important omission in published statistics which should be corrected. Definitions and sources of data will be found in the Appendix.

## C. Further Data Notes

Tables III 4-6 involve a manufactured inconsistency.

The agricultural unemployment (or unfilled vacancies or unemployment minus unfilled vacancies) figure consists of total adult male plus female unemployment i.e. including adult part—time and casual workers. The labour force consists of total full time hired regular workers i.e. including full time workers under 21 but not casuals, plus the unemployment defined above. The reason for taking only adult unemployment (or UV or U—UV) is because it is impossible to obtain disaggregated figures of unemployment and unfilled vacancies by category full time; part time; casual.

#### 2. Tables III 5 and 6

Agricultural unfilled vacancy statistics included, during the period 1952-56, a large element of double counting owing to deferments of National Service being included. This double counting built up to a peak in 1954 and 1955 and was therefore proportionately scaled down after an examination of the statistics for the years immediately prior to 1952 and after 1956.

#### 3. IV Census

The figures unfortunately are only available for 1951 because the Industry Tables have not yet been published for the 1961 Census. The essential difference between the employment figures in III and IV is that the Census Statistics include farmers but exclude unemployed and the Ministry of Labour Statistics include unemployed but exclude farmers. The Ministry of Labour, when calculating the total working force in Great Britain (published monthly in the Ministry of Labour Gazette) uses an estimated figure for farmers which has remained unchanged since 1957.

- (ii) Obtained weights of 1-6 used in constructing the U.K. agricultural product price index. These U.K. weights, in total, sum to 1000 but the categories 1-6 deliberately excluded fruit and vegetables. Therefore the weights were reconstructed for categories 1-6 so they summed to 1000.
- (iii) The contribution of each region to the revised U.K. weights for each category was calculated. The regional weights were then reconstructed so that those for each region summed to 100.
  - (iv) A product price index for each category 1-6 over 1955-64 was calculated. e.g. pig product prices - a weighted average of pigs (bacon), pigs (other) and sow product prices.

   (iv) representing time series weights (by product) to give a regional product price index.
