

I am pleased to submit this 1982 Agricultural Crop Report which has been compiled in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food & Agricultural Code.

Total crop value declined 6 million dollars from the 1981 value. If there was a bright spot in the report, it would be in the Fruit & Nut Crop division which showed a 55 million dollar increase. 24½ million of this was attributed to Pistachios which had a considerable increase in production per acre over 1981. Both production and price were up for almonds, and resulted in better than a 14 million dollar increase. Plums showed both production and unit value increases resulting in almost a 7 million dollar increase. Although prices were generally down for grapes, the 1982 production was very good and resulted in almost a 6 million dollar increase in value of the total crop.

Big losers in 1982 were cotton (39½ million) potatoes (13 million) Fresh Market Tomatoes (10 million). The price of cotton was up almost 4¢ a 1b. and the production was only down 30 lbs. per acre, but the total acreage was down 63,000 acres; so this accounted for the large drop in total value.

The values represented in this report are gross receipts of the producers, and do not take into account the various costs of production, marketing or transportation. No attempt is made to reflect net income of the producer.

My sincere thanks to the individuals and firms whose cooperation made this report possible; and to Deputy Commissioner, Charles Bennett, who compiled the report.

I am pleased to submit this 1983 Agricultural Crop Report which has been compiled in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food & Agriculture Code.

For the third year in a row, total crop production value has declined. Comparison with 1982 figures show a 10 1/3% drop in total value. Because of the PIK (Payment in Kind) Program, there was a reduction of 135,400 acres of participating crops. The value of income derived through this program is not included in this report.

Cotton remained the top producer, even though acreage was reduced by 97,000 acres; production per acre was reduced by $83\ lbs.$, but price increased by $10\ 1/2$ cents per pound.

Almonds moved from 5th in value to the 3rd spot, while grapes remained the 2nd most valuable crop.

Nectarines and tomatoes dropped out of the top twenty valued crops, and were replaced by apples and peaches.

Cattle and calves dropped from the 6th spot to 11th.

Crops recording significant gains in value were apples, cantaloupes, kiwi, other melons, and sorghum grain; with increases ranging from 73% to 301%.

The values represented in this report are <u>gross receipts</u> of the producers, and do not take into account the various costs of production, marketing or transportation. No attempt is made to reflect net income of the producer.

My sincere thanks to the individuals and firms whose cooperation made this report possible; and to Deputy Commissioner, Charles Bennett, who compiled the report.

I am pleased to submit this 1984 Agricultural Crop Report, which was compiled in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code.

Although this is an increase over 1983 figures, it should be pointed out that 1983 was the year of the PIK program; when over 100,000 acres were left out of production. 1984 reflects less than a one half percent increase over 1982, and with increased production costs over a two year period, one can easily see that it was not a banner year for agriculture.

Cotton remained the number one producer, (\$231,181,000) but yields were down by 24 pounds per acre and the price was down $10\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per pound.

Potatoes almost doubled in total value with increased acreage, production per acre and value per unit. Total value was \$131,274,800 which moved potatoes up from number 5 to number 3 in crops of most value.

Almonds dropped from the rank of 3 to number 4, but showed a more than 2 million dollar increased value.

Pistachios moved from 10th rank to number 8. Although the value per ton was down \$1190, the production was more than doubled; and accounted for 60% of the state's pistachio production.

Lettuce production and unit value were both down and resulted in an \$11,000,000 drop in value of production.

Citrus value decreased almost \$14,000,000 because of production decreases.

Apples decreased almost \$6,000,000 because of a killing spring frost; while avocados decreased in value because of low harvested production due to unprofitable market conditions.

The values represented in this report are \underline{gross} receipts of the producers, and \underline{do} \underline{not} take into account the various costs of production, marketing or transportation. No attempt is made to reflect net income of the producer.

My sincere thanks to the individuals and firms whose cooperation made this report possible; and to Deputy Commissioner, Charles Bennett, who compiled the report.

Garlic is one of the oldest of the cultivated plants, and a member of the lily family.

Its English name is derived from the Anglo-Saxon "garleac"--"gar" meaning spear, and "leac" meaning leek--words which describe its appearance.

Mentioned over 5,000 years ago in the first written language, Sanskrit, garlic was a staple in the ancient Sumerian diet.

Perhaps because of its potent scent and flavor, in ancient times, garlic was thought to have mystical properties and was used as a defense against both known and unknown ills. Even today, there are those who hang cloves of garlic about their necks to guard against various superstitions.

Medicinal claims are varied, and have been made for garlic since ancient days. It is still believed by many to have curative powers and is the ingredient in a large variety of recipes.
