

Gentlemen:

In compliance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I respectfully submit the 1985 Lassen County Crop Report.

The gross dollar value for all agricultural crops, including timber, was \$54,642,000 for 1985, up over 3 million dollars from 1984

Field crops were up almost 3 million dollars over 1984 with the dollar value for alfalfa nearly reaching the 11 million dollar mark with 30,000 harvested acres.

Strawberry acreage was up slightly over 1984 with 650 acres and a dollar value of over 10 million dollars.

Cattle and calves and timber production remained comparable to 1984 with slightly weaker prices for most livestock.

This report indicates gross dollar value only and does not represent net income to growers.

I wish to thank all of the individuals who cooperated to make this report possible with a special thanks to the members of this office who diligently compiled, documented and typed this 1985 Crop Report.

RANCHING FOR WILDLIFE

Ranchers and farmers face challenges each day that affect their profits. Many are searching for alternatives to increase land profits as well as productivity. Recent legislation has provided just such an alternative. Known as the "Ranch for Wildlife" program, this new law offers economic incentives and returns to private landholders who improve habitat for wildlife on their land.

After submitting the required fee and a management plan for improving habitat for wildlife, a rancher or farmer may obtain approval and be licensed, by the California Fish and Game Commission, to create a licensed wildlife management area. Whether he grows cattle, sheep, timber, corn or other crops, the rancher or farmer can now consider "growing good habitat" and "ranching for wildlife".

Some of the benefits of the Ranch for Wildlife program include: offering of hunting and fishing opportunities that may start before, or extend beyond traditional seasons; changing the regulated bag limit rules; and many allowable tax deductions.

Economic returns from a licensed wildlife management area can be obtained from access fees for hiking, camping, fishing, hunting or other recreational activities. Additional returns are realized from the selling of hunting tags or permits which are issued for use during regular or special hunts, established by the carrying capacity of the individual wildlife management area.

Lassen County ranchers and farmers have licensed 10 wildlife management areas with the California Fish and Game Commission. Some 120,000 acres are currently being managed for deer and antelope habitat. Profits to landholders amounted to nearly \$80,000 during 1986, and have provided ranchers and farmers in Lassen County with an alternative for increasing land profits and productivity.

Honorable Director and Board Members:

Pursuant to Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, the 1986 Crop Report for Lassen County is respectfully submitted.

The values represented in this report are gross receipts of producers, and do not reflect costs of production, marketing or transportation. No attempt is made to reflect net income of producers.

The gross dollar value of all agricultural commodities was \$62,402,500 for 1986. It should be noted that gross value of agricultural products does not indicate total value to the economy. There is a 2.62 mulltiplying factor of dollars entering the economy, making Lassen County's total \$168,488,000.

Cogeneration of electricity from forest products, wildlife harvested from land managed for wildlife habitat and wild rice production are all included in the crop report for the first time. These commodities account for the 10% increase in crop values in Lassen County for 1986.

Field crop values were down 9% in 1986. Lower alfalfa hay prices and heavy spring rains, which caused a decrease in planting acreage of wheat and barley, account for this reduction in the value of field crops for 1986.

Strawberry acreage for 1986 was down slightly from 1985. Prices remained steady. The overall value of strawberry plants was down about 6% in 1986, due to a decrease in harvested acreage.

The federal Dairy Herd Buy-Out program caused lower prices for cattle and calves early in the year. Average yearly prices were comparable to those in 1985, however.

I wish to acknowledge all individuals who cooperated in the printing of this 1986 Crop Report. Special thanks are extended to the members of my staff, Bob Somerville, Don Haws and Susan Jones, who diligently compiled, documented and produced this report.

Honorable Director and Board Members:

Pursuant to Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, the 1987 Crop Report for Lassen County is respectfully submitted.

The values represented in this report are gross receipts of producers, and do not reflect costs of production, marketing or transportation. No attempt is made to reflect income of producers.

The gross dollar value of all agricultural commodities was \$65,737,000 for 1987. It should be noted that gross value of agricultural products does not indicate total value to the economy. There is a 2.62 multiplying factor of dollars entering the economy, making Lassen Countys' total \$172,230,940.

The value of field crops for 1987 was down 5% from 1986. A revised and more accurate method of reporting pasture values was used this year and accounts for the decline in 1987.

Livestock values were up \$1.9 million (22%) in 1987. Prices for livestock were higher, contributing to increased number being sold in 1987.

The value of strawberry planting stock was up \$2.9 million in 1987, which accounts for the 17% increase in overall value of seed, fruit, vegetable and nursery crops. The harvested acreage of strawberries increased significantly; and the yield per acre was up slightly over 1986. Domestic and foreign export of strawberry planting stock has begun to develop. Shipments have been sent to Florida, Hawaii, Europe and Africa.

Timber production was up \$2.9 million in 1987. Timber yield was up 5% and the price per board foot was up 20%, over the revised figures for 1986.

Severe and unseasonable weather conditions were a common occurance during 1987. Hail storms in early spring and snow on July 17th plagued farmers and ranchers. The 40,000 acre Milford Fire in early September caused over \$100,000 damage to farm equipment, crops, fences and rangeland.

Pursuant to Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, the 1988 Crop Report for Lassen County is respectfully submitted.

The values represented in this report are gross receipts of producers, and do not reflect costs of production, marketing or transportation. No attempt is made to reflect income of producers.

The gross dollar value of all agricultural commodities was \$77,927,500. for 1988. It should be noted that gross value of agricultural products does not indicate total value to the economy. There is a 2.62 multiplying factor of dollars entering the economy, making Lassen County's total \$204,170,000.

The value of field crops was up 15.5% from 1987. Increased prices for alfalfa hay, due to higher demand, accounted for this increase.

Livestock values were down 8% from 1987. Prices increased over 1987, but fewer head were sold, accounting for the overall decrease in total value.

Strawberry nursery stock saw a near 15% decrease in value in 1988. This was the result of lower yield per acre, brought on by adverse growing season conditions, including extreme temperature flucuations and severe winds.

Timber production was up by 20 million board feet in 1988. This, plus a higher price per board foot accounted for the near \$5 million increase in timber production for 1988.

Cogeneration of electricity saw a 13% increase in total tons of wood waste being burned and a slight increase in unit value. These factors accounted for an increase of \$1.6 million in cogeneration production.

I'd like to acknowledge the cooperation and hard work of my staff and other agencies in the compilation and production of this annual report.



Pursuant to Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, the 1989 Crop Report for Lassen County is respectfully submitted.

The values represented in this report are gross receipts of producers, and do not reflect costs of production, marketing, or transportation. No attempt is made to reflect income of producers.

The gross dollar value of all agricultural commodities was \$76,580,300 for 1989. It should be noted that gross value of agricultural products does not indicate total value to the economy. There is a 3x multiplying factor of dollars entering the economy, making Lassen County's total \$229,740,900.

The value of field crops was nearly the same as 1988, down only 1%. Increased yield for alfalfa hay and a slight increase in grazing values for pastures offset decreases in most other field crop values.

Livestock values were nearly the same as for 1988. Price increases offset a reduction in numbers of head sold.

Strawberry nursery stock saw a 10% increase in value in 1989. This was the result of higher yield per acre.

Timber production value was down by 27 1/2% in 1989. The number of Board Feet harvested decreased dramatically from 124 million to 80 million. The price per unit was up significantly, however, which offset a portion of the reduction in harvest.

Cogeneration of electricity saw a 33% increase in total tons of wood waste being burned and a slight increase in unit value. These factors accounted for an increase of 3.9 million in cogeneration production. A new wood fired plant that came on line in 1989 accounted for this increase in cogeneration value.

I'd like to acknowledge the cooperation of Lassen County farmers and ranchers and the other agencies that provided information for this report. Special recognition should also be given to members of my staff, Doug Sheehy and Susan Jones, who compiled and published this report.
