PREFACE

This statistical supplement was prepared to aid public and private groups and individuals interested in stimulating economic growth in the Lake States--Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin. Its main purpose is to bring together a broad array of social and economic data from many sources to provide a basic handbook of county, substate, and State data. Those interested in a summary and analysis of the Region are referred to An Economic Survey of the Northern Lake States Region, by R. Loomis and M. Wirth (Agr. Econ. Rpt. 108, U.S. Dept. Agr., Feb. 1967). Since the publication of the summary volume (Agr. Econ. Rpt. 108), requests from public and private development and planning organizations for the basic data have been numerous. Many people who were interested in the economic and social development of their local areas did not have ready access to essential source materials that would enable them to compare the condition of their county with adjoining counties, with their part of the State, or with their State as a whole. Since the creation of the Upper Great Lakes Economic Development Region in April 1967, the needs of local areas for additional data have become more apparent.

Definitions of some items changed during the period covered in this supplement. To describe all of these changes here, and the possible influence of these changes, could represent a volume in itself. Generally, the effects of definitional changes were relatively minor in influencing the differences in these areas. The changes in definition have been noted where it was felt that they could cause misinterpretation. Generally, however, anyone interested in the definitional changes should refer to the sources cited for each table. The definitions used in the footnotes were for the most recent period covered.

The data are aggregated into Northern and Southern Regions for Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin--a total of six parts. The substate and State averages were computed by allowing each observation to have equal weight wherever possible. In some cases, however, the source information was presented only in the form of medians. Whenever this occurred, the aggregate is the "average" median.

Bibliographical information is presented at the end of this supplement.

The author of this supplement wishes to acknowledge the contribution of Ralph Loomis, Economic Development Division, Economic Research Service, formerly located at Michigan State University and currently stationed at Washington State University, and Mike Wirth, currently with Washington State University, formerly with the Farm Production Economics Division, Economic Research Service at Michigan State University, who were responsible for the creation of the basic data bank used in preparing this supplement. Extreme gratitude is given to Mrs. Arlene King, Department of Agricultural Economics, Michigan State University, since without her expertise on computers, this supplement might not have been possible.

The computation of the ratios used in this supplement revealed some key-punching errors that were impossible to spot before. For this reason, a few of the area totals may not be in agreement with the totals given in the summary volume. Any errors still remaining are the responsibility of the author. As it is assumed that these data will be used in additional statistical analysis, it would be appreciated if errors were brought to the attention of the author.

SUMMARY

Characteristics of the Northern Regions of the three States were generally different from those of the Southern Regions. All regions except Northern Wisconsin had an absolute increase in population between 1950 and 1960, but the percentage increases in the Southern Regions were considerably larger, ranging from two to four times as large as the Northern Region. The net migration of the population, the difference between the actual population and that which would have been expected from natural increase, tells a different story. Southern Michigan and Southern Wisconsin were the only regions which had an inmigration. And only in Michigan was the net increase large enough to offset the outmigration from the Northern Region.

The housing conditions in the northern part of each State were worse than those in the southern parts. Although the percentage of housing considered dilapidated decreased between 1950 and 1960 (perhaps due to a change in classification), the differences between the northern and southern parts remained approximately equal.

The Northern Regions generally had a larger percentage of the population over 24 years old with only an elementary education, and the Southern Regions had a larger percentage which had completed high school or more. Per capita educational expenditures were higher in the Northern Regions of Minnesota and Wisconsin, indicating a possible push to improve the educational opportunities. However, per capita property taxes levied in the Northern Regions were lower than in the Southern Regions.

Comparison of the income distribution between the Northern and Southern Regions indicated that the Northern Region of each State had a higher proportion of families in each income class up to \$6,000 with only two exceptions. These exceptions were for the less than \$1,000 class in Minnesota and the \$5,000 to \$5,999 class in Wisconsin. In addition, the Northern Regions had, in per capita terms, the lowest effective buying income, bank deposits, retail sales, wholesale sales, and value added by manufacturing.

Northern Michigan and Northern Wisconsin had average total acres per farm that were larger than the Southern part of each State. On the basis of crop-land acres per farm, however, the southern part of all three States had larger

amounts. The value of farm products sold per farm was considerably larger in the southern part of each State. This was also illustrated in the distribution of farms by economic class. The Northern Region had a smaller percentage of farms in each economic class of \$5,000 or more for both 1959 and 1964. But the percentage of farms included in the \$5,000 or more classifications increased for both regions between 1959 and 1964. And yet at the same time, both regions also had a larger percentage of farms in the \$50 to \$2,499 class in 1964 than they had in 1959. This may, in part, be a reflection of a slight definitional change in 1964.

The Northern Regions of Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin have generally experienced heavy outmigration, relatively low incomes, a predominance of the less educated, a higher percentage of dilapidated housing, relatively high unemployment figures, low per capita effective buying income, bank deposits, retail sales, wholesale sales, and value added by manufacturing, relatively large farms but smaller cropland per farm, lower value of farm products sold per farm, etc., than their southern counterparts. This, and more, has been discussed at length in the original report. With the detailed county information presented here, it will be possible to compare an area's "life statistics" with its neighbors and region so that an understanding of the situation can possibly be more complete.

1/ "Dilapidated housing does not provide safe and adequate shelter, and in its present condition endangers the health, safety, or well being of the occupants. Such housing has one or more critical defects; or has a combination of intermediate defects in sufficient number or extent to require considerable repair or rebuilding; or is of inadequate original construction. The defects are either so critical or so widespread that the structure should be extensively repaired, rebuilt, or torn down" (14, p. XXII). The criteria for determining dilapidated housing did not change between the 1950 and the 1960 censuses. But the 1960 census had three categories of housing (sound, deteriorating, and dilapidated) while the 1950 census had only two categories (dilapidated and not dilapidated). Although the data for dilapidated housing are considered by the Bureau of the Census to be comparable between 1950 and 1960, comparisons of the differences in percentage of housing considered dilapidated between the two periods should be interpreted with caution since the addition of the deteriorating category in 1960 could have introduced an element of difference the 1950 and 1960 statistics.
