Gentlemen:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I submit, herewith, the 1951 Annual Crop Report for El Dorado County.

The income given is based on the price received by the farmers delivered to the packing house and do not include the costs of packing or shipping. However, they do not represent the net return of the grower, as all operating costs must be deducted in order to secure the grower's net.

While the 1951 pear crop was the largest ever harvested in El Dorado County, the quality was so lowered by hail damage^{7/11}, the gross return to the growers was lower than 1950. Higher production costs further reduced the net to the grower.

Forestry production returns figured on a stumpage basis, from a preliminary estimate of the year's cut, have been added to this report for the first time this year because of the many requests for this information.

I wish to publicly thank the Packing House Managers, the Forest Service, Industry Representatives, the Agricultural Extension Service and many farmers whose helpful cooperation made this report more accurate and complete.

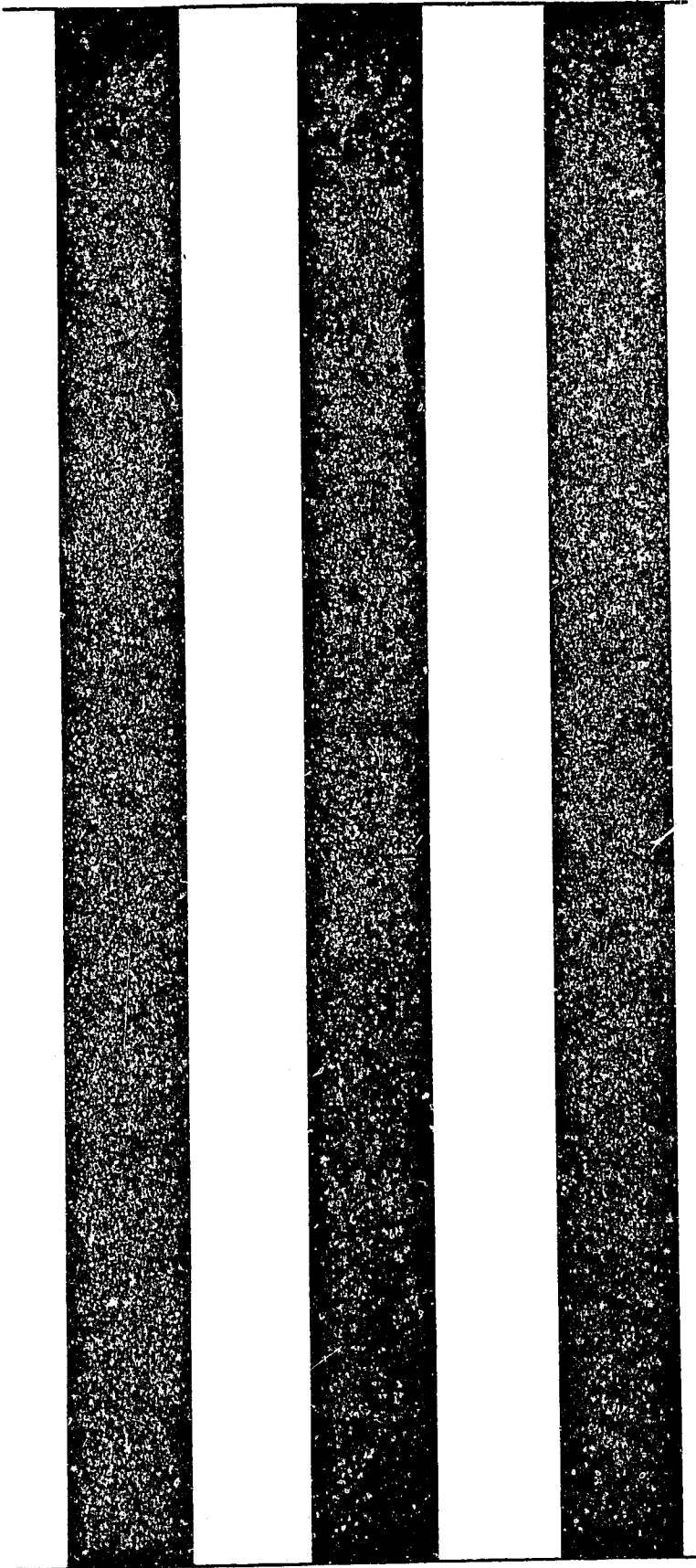

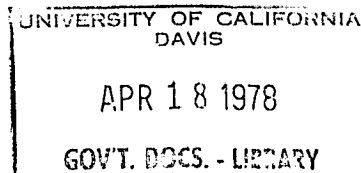
While the 1952 pear crop was the largest and probably of the highest quality ever harvested in El Dorado County, lower prices and higher operating costs reduced the net to the grower.

This is the eighth Annual Crop Report compiled by this office. Since we are dependent upon the cooperation of growers, packers, livestock producers, and many others to reveal the correct figures for this report, individual items are held in strictest confidence.

The total farm income for 1955 as shown in this report is generally based on the average price received by the farmer. This represents gross income and should not be confused with net income. 1955 was a disastrous year for many fruit men in El Dorado County. Frosts were the heaviest in many years, resulting in the loss of about one-third of our fruit tonnage with some orchards being left with no crop. The figures compiled here do not include value for native grasses, irrigated pasture or hay produced for local consumption. Such values are, in a measure, reported in our animal production.

The effects of Pear Decline became quite evident during 1961, with a drop in production of 12,730 tons of fruit. This office, through a survey with growers, has determined that approximately 900 acres of pear trees will be abandoned and removed in 1962, and that in addition the remaining orchards have lost at least 10% of their bearing pear trees. Though severely affected by decline the pear industry remains strong and determined to overcome this malady. It is a certainty that with research and correct field application of current information the pear industry will survive and continue to prosper in El Dorado County.

Many El Dorado County pear orchards, during the summer of 1963, began to show distinct recovery from decline. This recovery, I feel, is primarily due to good grower psylla control, ideal cultural practices and the county's abandoned orchard removal program. The question still remains whether the orchards will recover completely. However, with continued emphasis on psylla control and cultural practices, the possibility of complete recovery is greater now than at any time in the past three years.

The production returns stated in this Report are F.O.B. at the plant and do not reflect the net return to the grower.

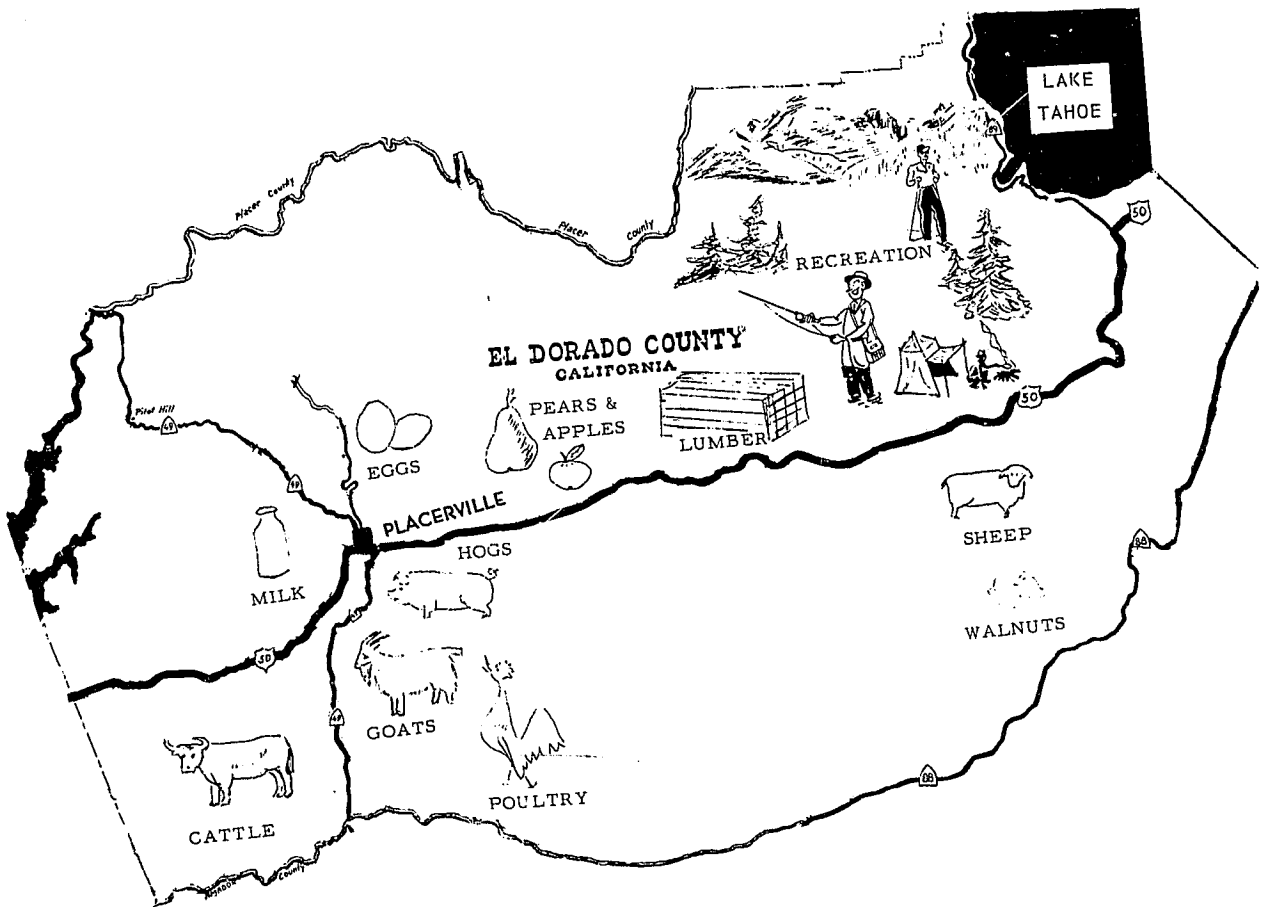

Most of the El Dorado County pear orchards continue to show recovery from Pear Decline. Total pear tonnage in 1964 was 18% higher than the 1963 crop. The most encouraging aspect of this increase in tonnage was the fact that many pear orchards were frozen in early spring and did not contribute to this larger crop. Pear tree condition, in the county, is now good enough that with a normal year the 1965 crop could be doubled that of the low 1963 production.

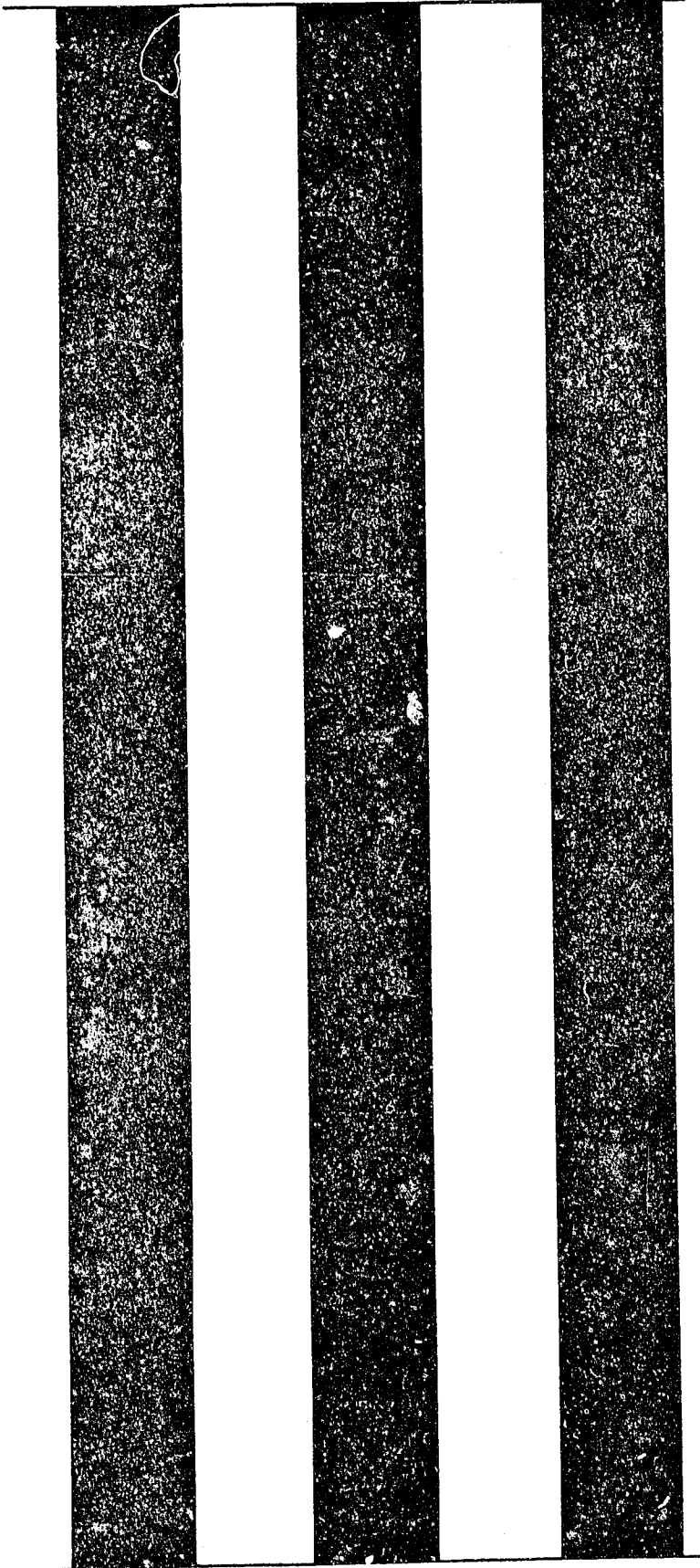

In accordance with the Provisions of Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code, I herewith submit the 1966 El Dorado County Crop Report.

The 1966 Bartlett Pear tonnage in El Dorado County is the highest since 1961. The reasons for this increase have been good blooming weather and partial recovery of the pear trees from Pear Decline. This office, in cooperation with the El Dorado County Farm Advisor's Office and the county's pear industry, has established a new pear rootstock that will provide the tree vigor needed to return this vital county industry to its original stature.

The picture, of Apple Hill, on the cover of this report was provided by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company. Apple Hill is a new concept of agricultural marketing whereby agriculture, recreation and other related industries are blended together to offer the general public a delightful day or days in the country. The potential of this marketing approach in modern urbanized America is almost limitless.

The production returns stated in this report are F.O.B. the plant and do not reflect net returns or the profit realized by the grower.
