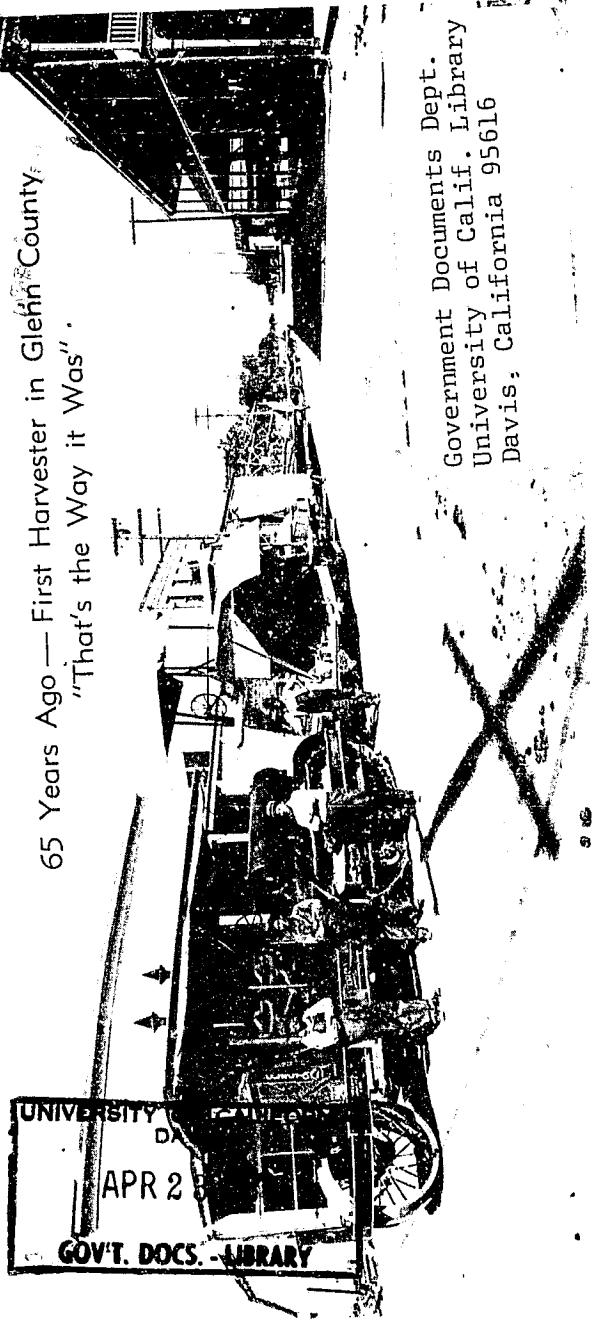

Gentlemen:

I am pleased to submit the 1975 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Glenn County as required by Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

Agriculture receipts for 1975 were \$94,472,000, down approximately \$9,000,000 from the 1974 record high. Rice and cattle showed a marked decrease in price, while fruit and nut crops suffered a decline in both yield and price. These crops accounted for the major portion of the reduction in gross farm receipts for 1975. However, sugar beets and vegetable crops were up with vegetable crops showing signs of becoming an important new crop to the county.

I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation and assistance of all individuals who contributed to this report, and especially members of my staff who compiled the reports.

The continued drought resulted in lower production for livestock and field crops; however, there was a \$3,500,000, increase in gross farm receipts. This increase was brought about by the increase price and production for fruit, nut, and market milk.

Some areas of agriculture suffered severe losses in production, and all areas saw increased cost due to the drought. Therefore, the gross farm receipts should not be equated with net farm income.

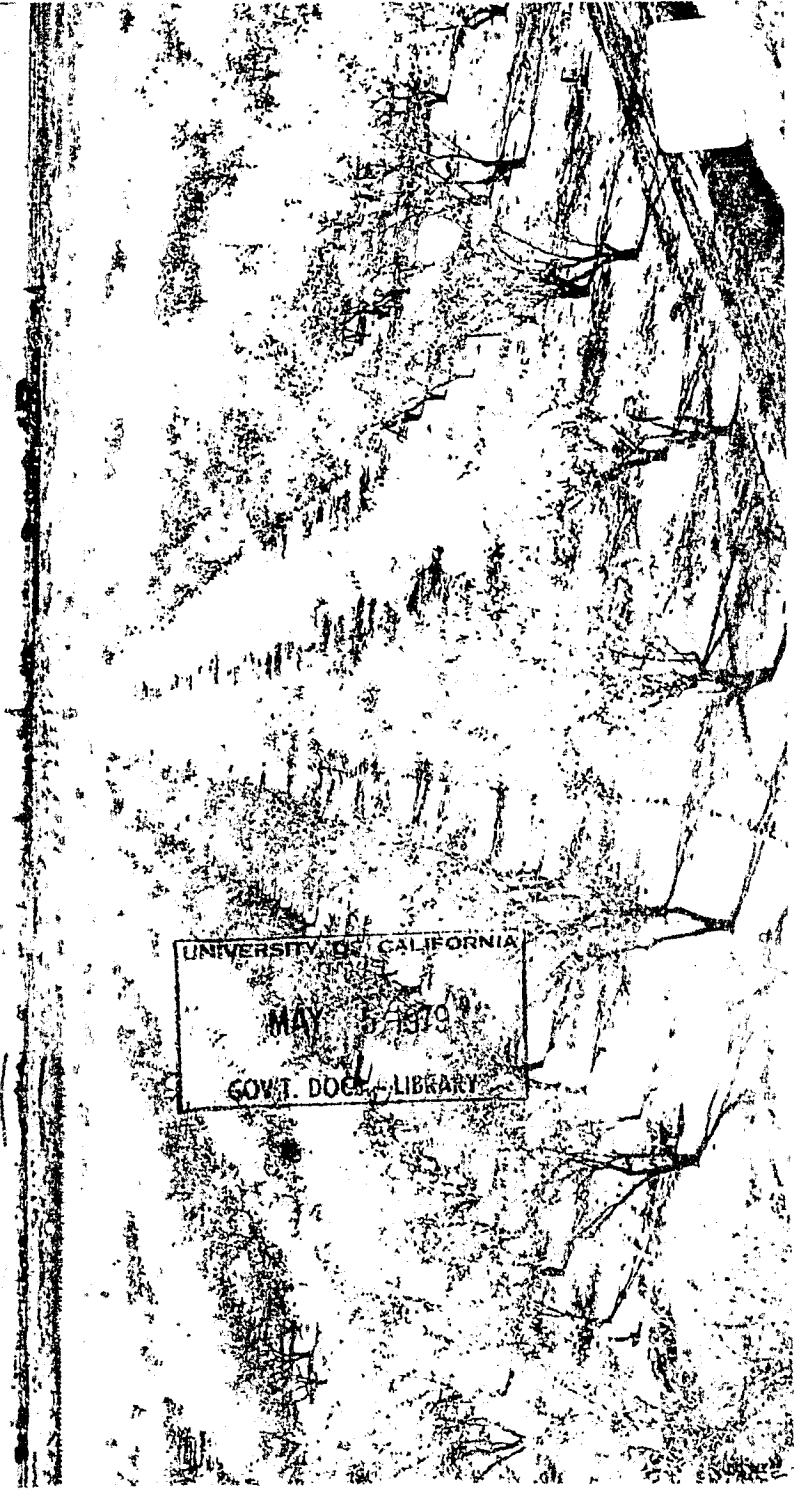

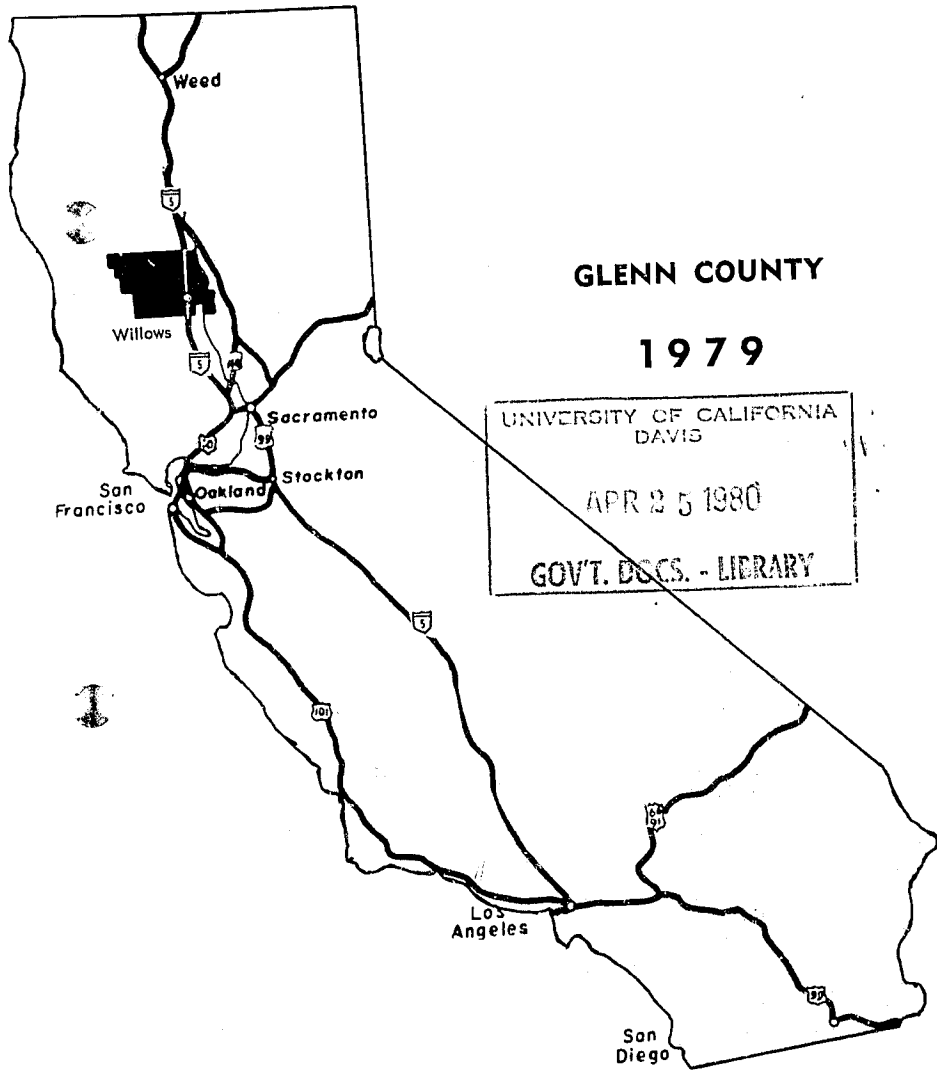


I am pleased to submit the 1979 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Glenn County as required by Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

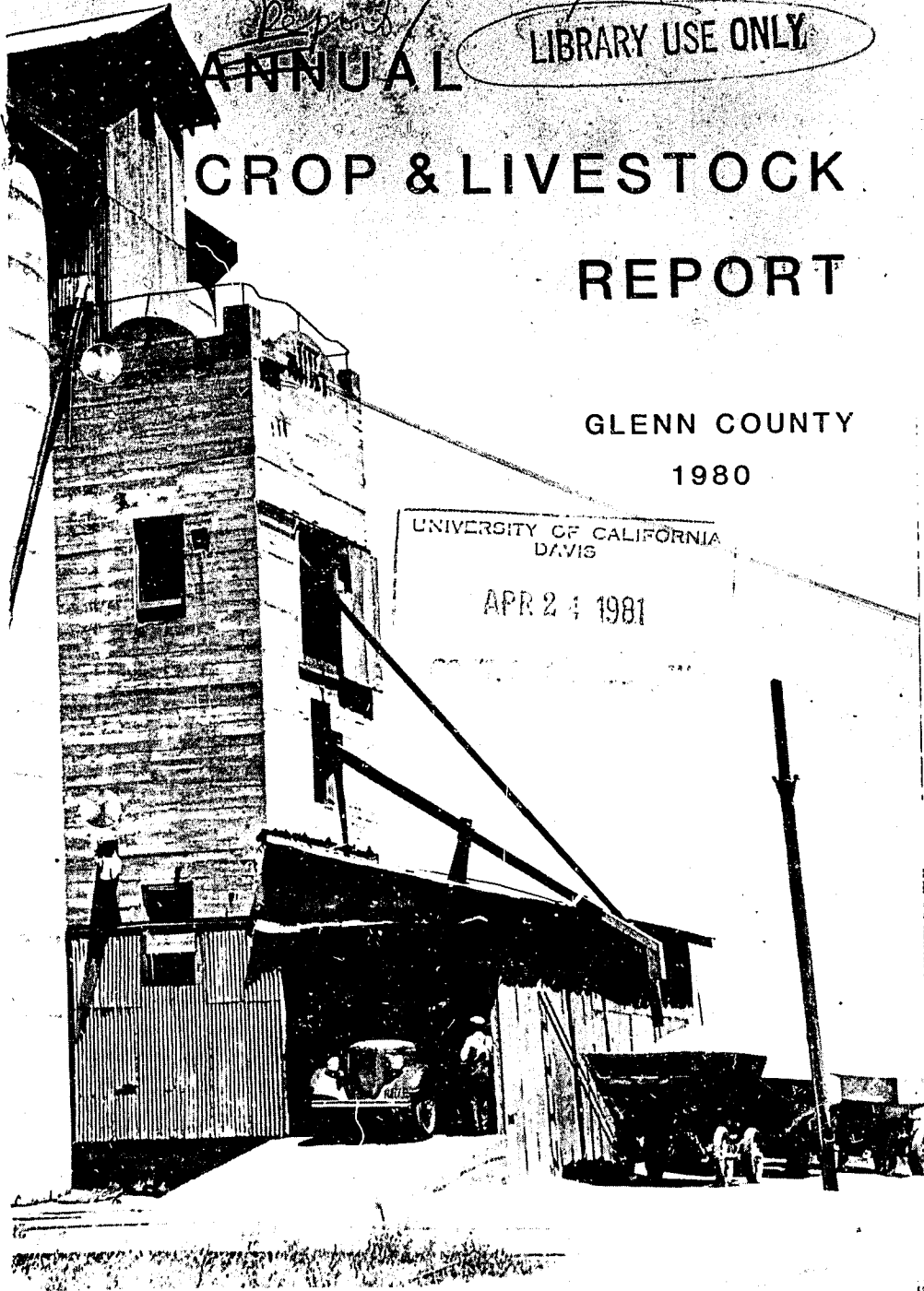

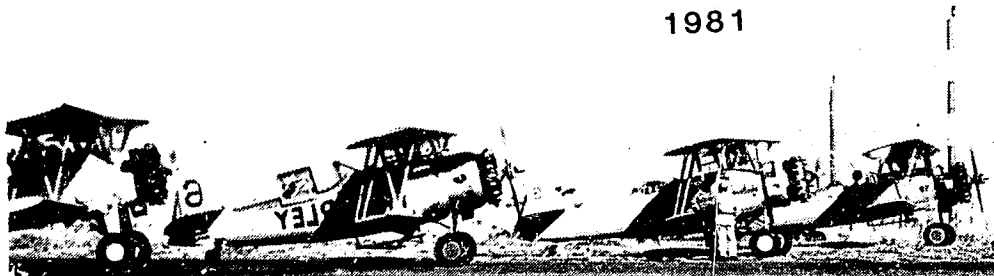


I am pleased to submit the 1981 Annual Crop and Livestock Report for Glenn County as required by Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.
