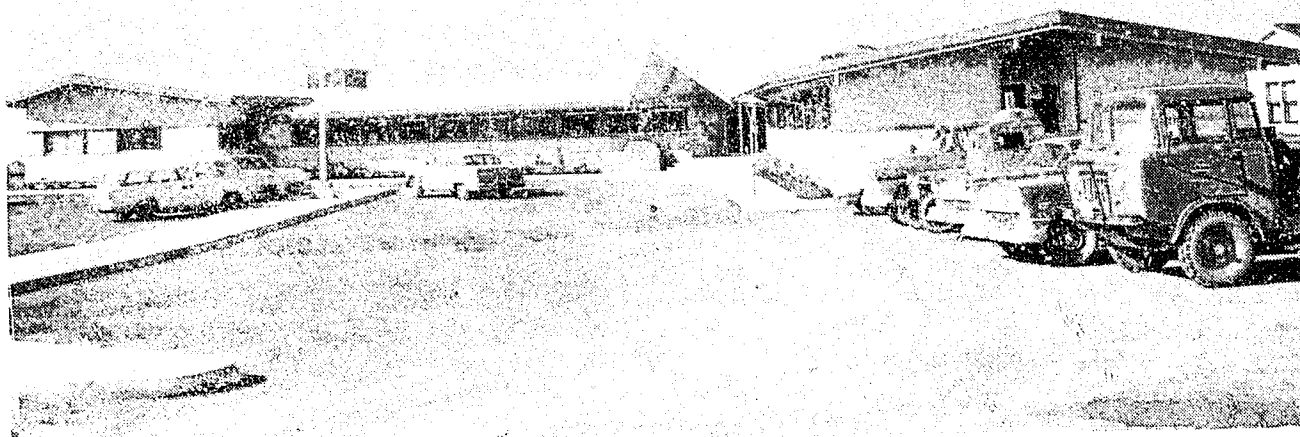

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the state of California, I herewith submit the 1960 Agricultural Crop Report of Humboldt County.

This report covers the acreage, production and value of all crops, livestock and dairy products produced in Humboldt County. It does not necessarily reflect gross income to the farmer, as a portion of the production was utilized on the producing farm. Reporting the value rather than gross return is a departure from previous reports. We feel that the statistics setting forth the agricultural crops and their value will be of greater importance to those who use these reports. This change in reporting coincides with similar changes in reports issued by Agricultural Commissioners throughout California. The range and pasture value has never been included before.

The office of the Agricultural Commissioner and Sealer of Weights and Measures, together with the Extension Service, the Agricultural Stabilization Committee, the California Bureau of Livestock Disease, the Bureau of Dairy Service, the County Veterinarian, and the County Forester is now located in the Agricultural Center Building. The building, all done in native woods, has already become a showplace of the County.


Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I herewith submit the 1961 Agricultural Crop Report of Humboldt County.

This report covers the yield, value, and acreage of all agricultural commodities produced in Humboldt County, and does not necessarily reflect the gross income of the farmer as a portion of the yield was utilized on the producing farms.

There is a continuous shift from sheep to cattle. As the demand for market milk increases there is a shift from grade B milk production. Low margins of profit in poultry and a trend towards mass production of eggs continues to make this endeavor less profitable. Daffodil and lily production maintains a general decline.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I am pleased to present a report of estimated production and value of the County of Humboldt for 1962.

In this area weather has quite an effect on various commodities. In 1961 early warm weather adversely affected the daffodil market by bringing too many areas into production at the same time, thus glutting the market; later rains caused severe damage to peaches. In 1962 these crops fared much better, but the tomato crop suffered about 50% loss from the weather.

Hay production, especially of the native grasses, always fluctuates widely; this year was no exception as only about half the 1961 acreage was in production.

The shift from sheep to cattle seems to be proceeding as usual. Also as the poultry industry becomes more specialized there is a loss of unit value as the chickens sold are predominately culls from the laying flock.

Over the past several years there has been a trend to switch from manufacturing milk to market milk. An interesting development this year is a reversal of this trend, possibly due to a change in handling by the creameries.

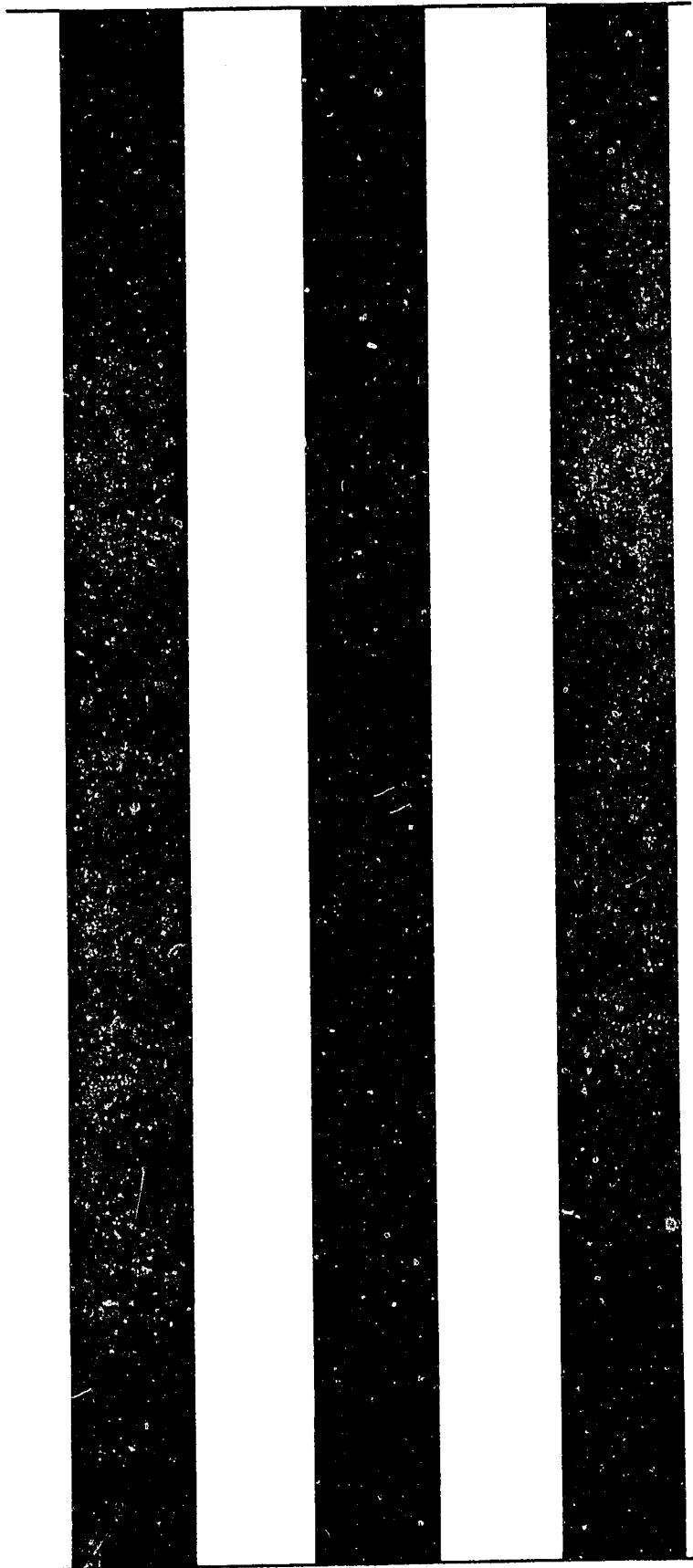

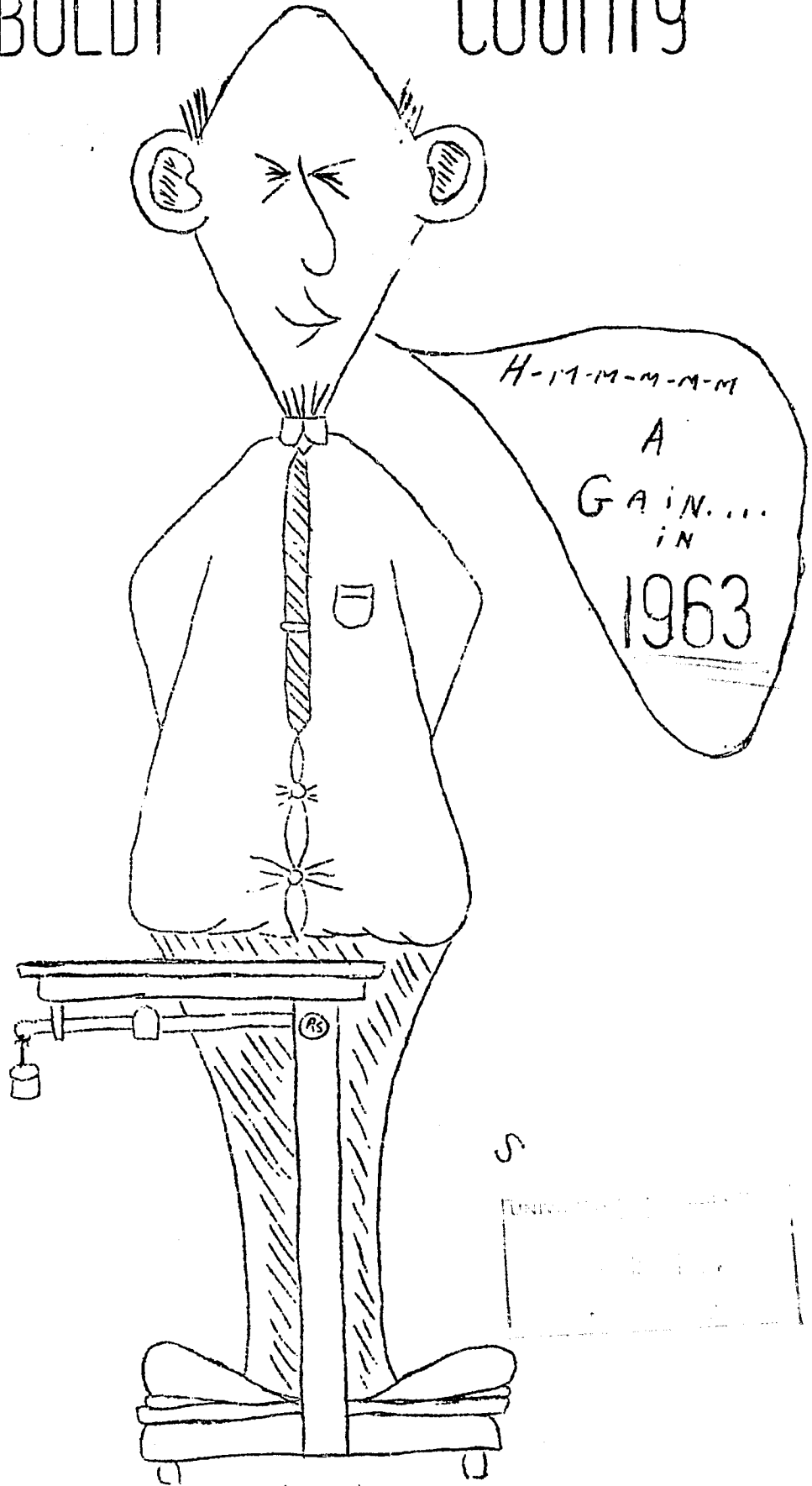

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I am pleased to present a report of estimated production and value of the County of Humboldt for 1963.

With the heavy demand for alfalfa pellets and wafers a higher price for alfalfa has been created, this has resulted in a greater demand for local hay and silage. These higher prices and a better growing year has increased field crop values.

There seems to be a lessening of truck farmers as the older farmers retire and the younger generation moves into towns. The only compensating factor is a strengthened market for potatoes. The same trend of general production decline is evidencing itself in fruit production. Peaches and cherries suffered adversely from the weather.

There is a tendency towards more local egg production in spite of higher feed costs.

The cut flower market gained some advantage through better weather conditions. Alteration in consumer demands has created a market for fewer but larger size plants. These large plants bring a higher price.

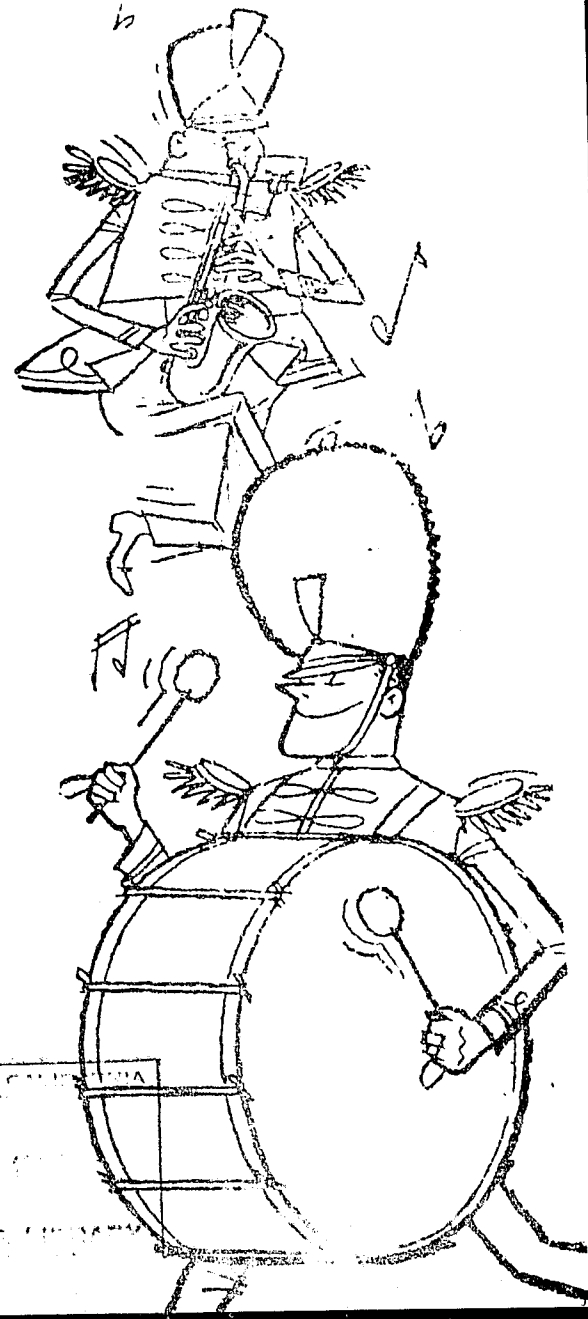

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I am pleased to present a report of estimated production and gross value of the County of Humboldt for 1964.

The cattle market slacked off but the sheep market strengthened somewhat. The switch to Grade A milk production is continuing. There is an increased tendency to go out of hay production and use more purchased feeds. Generally the yield was up on fruits and vegetables and the vegetable prices held up better than last year.

Due to the major disaster incurred by farmlands in this area during the December flood there will probably be a wide range of effects in the 1965 season. The corn, tomato and potato areas were severely hit, which will undoubtedly result in a decline in yield and an increase in production costs for these crops. The most significant damage was done in the dairyland. The dairymen have not been making a substantial profit for some years, and the coupling of the loss of their land and stock has brought about an added interest in diversification of crops. Production from row crops probably will be low for those farmers going into such a venture for the first year. Some of the fruit areas have also sustained severe damage.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I am pleased to present a report of estimated production and gross value of the County of Humboldt for 1965. These figures represent values of production regardless of utilization.

The effects anticipated from the 1964 flood are widely expressed. This together with an ever increasing cost of harvest has failed to offset some increase in commodity prices and the general overall result has been a severe decrease in value. The resultant cutworm damage caused an additional loss.

Perhaps the hardest hit were the dairy industry and the attendant bottomland farming. Production was normally down as an aftereffect of the 1964 flood, with the best production coming from those crops normally requiring an auxiliary growing practice.

Fruit production suffered from a loss of acreage and intensive cropping failed to offset it. Livestock value increase was more than offset by lack of production.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 65.5 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I am pleased to present a report of estimated agricultural production and gross value of the County of Humboldt for 1966. These figures represent values of production, regardless of utilization.

The gross value was \$13,399,419, which represents a \$1,747,000 gain from the previous year. The disastrous effects of the 1964 - 1965 flood are being healed throughout much of the prime bottom land, as indicated by this data.

The overall hay production showed a significant increase. Vegetable crops also made marked increases, especially over prior years. Nursery stock showed a sizeable increase in forest tree nursery acreage and value. In livestock, the trend away from dairy-ing and sheep is continuing to exercise more affect than the shift to beef is capable of offsetting. Poultry farming is still yielding to intensive operations in other areas.



In accordance with Section 2279 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I am pleased to present a report of estimated agricultural production and gross value of the County of Humboldt for 1967. These figures represent values of production, regardless of utilization.

The significant reduction of sheep in the county continued this year. Beef prices were up slightly. Pork took a drop this year.

There is a continued decline in bulb production. Of significance will be the discontinuance of some nursery stock next year by a major producer.

There is a sizeable increase in potato acreage. This should remain more stable in the future. Fruit and nut production continues to decline, except for strawberries.

A continued increase in field crops has resulted because of the high cost of imported hay. A major range area has been sold for other uses. Milk production increased.

Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 2279 of the Agricultural Code of the State of California, I am pleased to present a report of the County of Humboldt for 1968. These figures represent values of production, regardless of utilization.

Dairying increased in value as those remaining in the business continued to recover from the disastrous 1964 flood. The number of sheep has been drastically reduced, with only a few ranchers shifting to beef production.

Potato acreage increased and there was also an increase in production per acre. Production of cucurbits such as melons, cucumbers, summer and winter squash, and pumpkins nearly equalled all other miscellaneous vegetables. Strawberry production declined sharply.

Basic production of nursery stock continued to drop off and was offset only by production of forest seedlings for replanting.

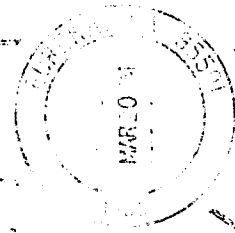
