INTRODUCTORY NOTE

The following list of publications represents the research activities of the Agricultural economics group in the California Agricultural Experiment Station and the California Cooperative Extension Service. The California Agricultural Experiment Station includes the members of the Giannini Foundation of Agricultural Economics in the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics, University of California, Berkeley; in the Department of Agricultural Economics, University of California, Davis; and in the Department of Resource Economics, University of California, Riverside. The California Cooperative Extension Service includes the Extension Specialists who are members of the Giannini Foundation and who are located on the campuses of Berkeley, Davis, and Riverside. Although not every publication has been included, it is sufficiently comprehensive to present the research work accomplished during the period covered. All titles included in this issue have been received by the Giannini Foundation Library and housed there. A few titles received after the publication of the 1988-90 list have been included here. The list serves not only as a record of published and unpublished materials but also as a reference guide to source materials in the area of agricultural and resource economics research.
