Gentlemen:

It is with great pleasure that I submit the 1974 Lassen County Crop Report as prescribed by the California Agricultural Code.

The gross value for all agricultural crops was \$17,272,455, down \$518,000 from the previous year.

Livestock and poultry production alone was down 4 million dollars from 1973, due to lower unit values and fewer animals produced. However, this amount was almost offset by record production values in field crops, seed, and nursery crops, with alfalfa value alone increasing by over 1.2 million dollars.

As in past years, this report represents gross dollar value only and in no way represents net income to the grower.

I wish to thank the many individuals who made this report possible.



Gentlemen:

It is with great pleasure that I submit the 1975 Lassen County Crop Report as prescribed by the California Agricultural Code.

The gross value for all agricultural crops was \$17,248,330, up \$148,000 from the previous year.

Livestock and poultry production was down almost 1 million dollars from last year and approximately 5 million dollars from 1973. This continued downward trend is attributed to low unit values and fewer animals produced in Lassen County.

However, increased acreage, record production and values in field crops, mainly hay, continues to offset the decline in livestock production.

As in past years, this report indicates gross dollar value only and in no way represents net income to the grower.



Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code I respectfully submit the 1976 Lassen County Crop Report.

The gross value for all agricultural crops was \$18,115,600, up approximately 1 million dollars over 1975. However, upon closer examination, this figure is misleading and is attributed directly to the drought.

Reduced yeilds for alfalfa hay and other field crops was evident throughout the County, but increased dollar values more than offset reduced tonnage. Many of the native meadows, normally cut for hay, were utilized for pasture only.

Cattle and calves showed an increase of over 1 million dollars while our inventories dropped 6000 head. This clearly shows that many herds are being liquidated due to drought conditions. As this trend gains momentum, dollar values to growers will decrease as the market becomes saturated with surplus animals.

With the drought continuing, 1977 will undoubtedly be a record low for agricultural production in Lassen County.

As in the past, this report indicated gross dollar value only and in no way represents net income to the grower.



In accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I respectfully submit the 1977 Lassen County Crop Report.

The gross value for all agricultural crops was \$15,121,100, down 3 million dollars.

Reduced alfalfa hay production was the greatest contributor to this lower figure, down 2 million dollars from 1976, and this loss in revenue is attributed directly to the drought. Field crops in general were down almost 5 million dollars.

Sales of cattle and calves were up 1.5 million dollars and helped to offset the total of this report, but this sales figure is misleading as many ranchers were forced to sell production animals that normally would have been retained. Consequently, our cattle inventory is down 2500 animals from 1976.

I wish to thank all of the individuals who cooperated to make this report possible and, as in the past, this crop report indicates gross dollar value only and does not represent net income to the grower.



The gross value for all agricultural crops was \$28,624,000, up 6 million dollars over the previous year.

Although production was down in many areas, high unit values attributed directly to the increased dollar value. Field crop values were up 2 million dollars while livestock production values increased over 3 million dollars. Nursery products increased by 1 million dollars, and is attributed to expanded acreage for the production of strawberry plants.



In accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I respectfully submit the 1980 Lassen County Crop Report.

The gross value for all agricultural crops was \$33,382,100, up almost 5 million dollars over the previous year.

Field crops values were up 5 million dollars due to expanded alfalfa acreage and higher unit values for most commodities. Seed and nursery products increased 1 million dollars with essentially all of the value attributed to the production of strawberry plants.

Although our livestock inventory is up 8000 head over 1979, total sales were down over 1 million dollars with comparable unit values for the 2 years. This indicates that more animals were retained in Lassen County for future livestock and contact. for future livestock production.

I wish to thank all of the individuals who cooperated to make this report possible and, as in the past, this crop report indicates gross dollar value only and does not represent net income to the grower.



Gentlemen:

In accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I respectfully submit the 1981 Lassen County Crop Report.

The gross value of all agricultural crops was \$33,776,600. This total is up slightly over 1980.

However, for the first time this report includes timber and timber products with a gross value of over 4.5 million dollars. The adjusted gross, excluding timber, would be approximately 28.5 million dollars, down 5 million dollars from 1980.

Field crops were down almost 4 million dollars. Alfalfa hay alone was down over 2.5 million dollars in gross sales due to depressed hay prices. Livestock and poultry values were down over 2 million dollars, even though 700 more head of livestock was sold. This lower value is directly attributed to depressed cattle prices.

Nursery and seed crops were up 2 million dollars over 1980, and essentially all of the increase is attributed to increased strawberry acreage.

I wish to thank all of the individuals who cooperated to make this report possible and, as in the past, this crop report indicates gross dollar value only and does not represent net income to the grower.
