## AGRICULTURE

Agriculture is the greatest single source of income in Monterey County. In 1960, the County ranked 20th in agriculture in the United States and first in the production of lettuce, artichokes, and strawberries. An estimated 60,000 carloads of vegetables are shipped annually to eastern markets.

Approximately 87% of the agricultural income originates on 144,905 acres of irrigated land, or 7% of the County. This highly productive irrigated section is separated from the rest of the State by the coast range of mountains and is generally known as the fog belt agricultural area of California. The cool humidity during the summer makes it possible to grow as many as three crops annually.

A total of 67,252 acres in Monterey County is exclusively zoned for agriculture. 25,092 acres in grazing land, and 42,160 acres of prime agricultural soils. It comprises approximately 3% of the County.

## INDUSTRY

The bulk of the products of Monterey County are manufactured for export to other areas of California and the United States. Traditionally the most important industry of the County is based on Agriculture and the major products are food and allied products, with several large packing and freezing plants processing and shipping lettuce and other vegetables, meat, fish, fruits, sugar and animal feeds. Affiliated with the food industry are the allied activities of container manufacturing, waxed paper and string, and commercial ice. A large plant for the manufacture of chocolate products was established in the Salinas area in 1960, and a plant for the preparation and packaging of jellies, jams and other food products opened in 1961. The largest beet sugar plant in the United States is also located near Salinas.

## MOUNTAINS

The Santa Lucia range is the western border of the County. The mountains rise abruptly from the Pacific Ocean with hundreds of sharp peaks, some exceeding 5,000 feet. The western slopes contain the most southernly groves of redwoods on the Pacific Coast, while foothills with chaparral and oaks form the eastern valley side.

The Gabilan and Diablo ranges are the eastern border of the County, separating the Salinas Valley from the interior valleys. They are bare, low rolling hills, green in winter and golden brown in spring, summer and fall.

## VALLEYS

The Salinas Valley is located between the Gabilan range on the east and the more moist and more rugged Santa Lucia mountain range on the west. The valley has about 640,000 acres of broad bottom land, it is ten to twenty miles wide, and approximately 130 miles long, with a fifteen mile wide plain near the mouth at Monterey Bay. The sides of the valley are cut by hundreds of rounded grass covered hills from 200 to 400 feet high which makes ideal cattle and sheep grazing areas. The valley contains some of the most highly productive agricultural land in the United States.

The Carmel Valley, which extends from Carmel Bay 13 miles inland, varies in width and constitutes 25,000 acres of residential agricultural land.

## WATER CONSERVATION

The Naclmiento Reservoir, located approximately 45 miles south of King City in San Luis Obispo County, is owned by the Monterey County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Zone #2. The primary purpose of the dam is to conserve water and prevent flood damage. The maximum pool is 3 1/4 mile wide and 16 miles long with 5,400 surface acres. Storage capacity: 350,000 acre feet. Approximately 2,000 acres surrounding the high water line was acquired for recreational purposes.
