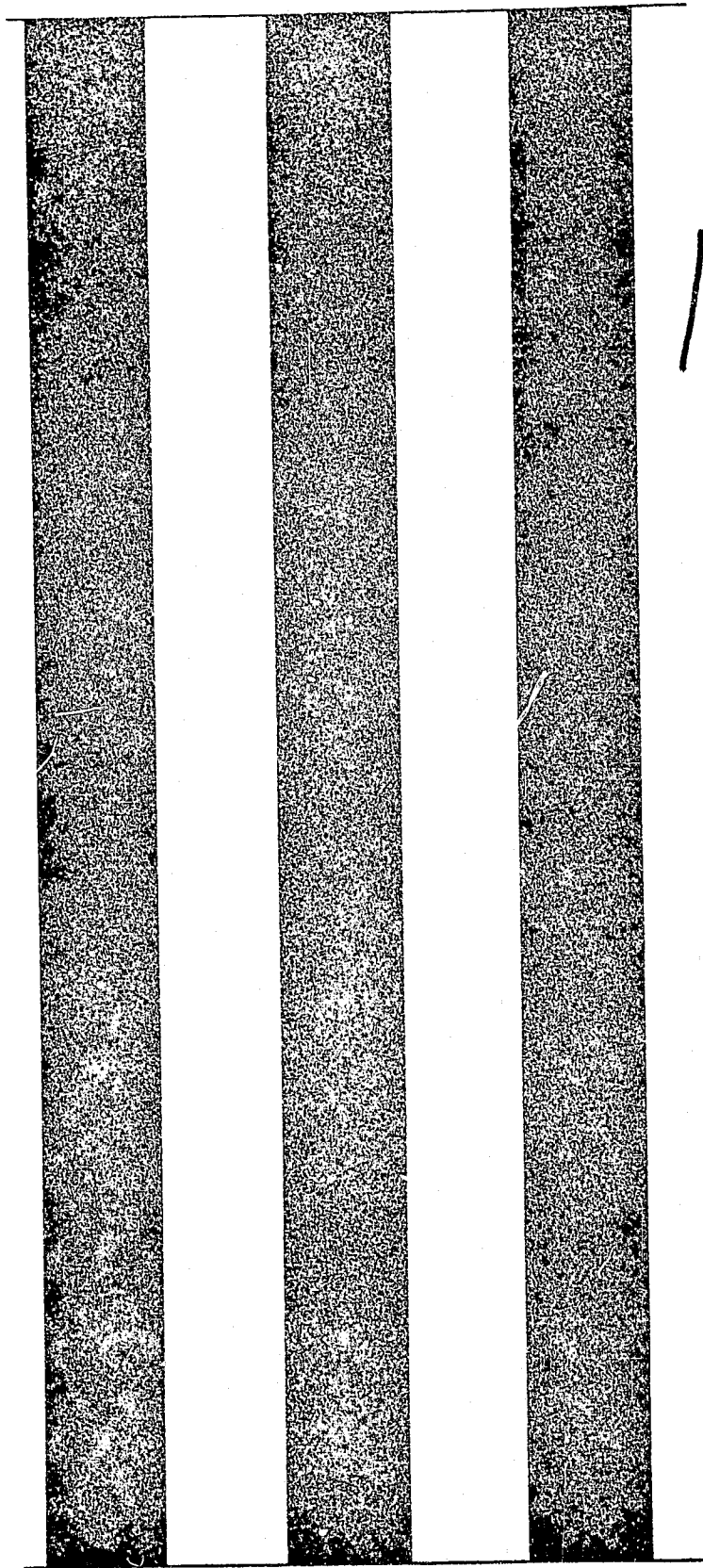

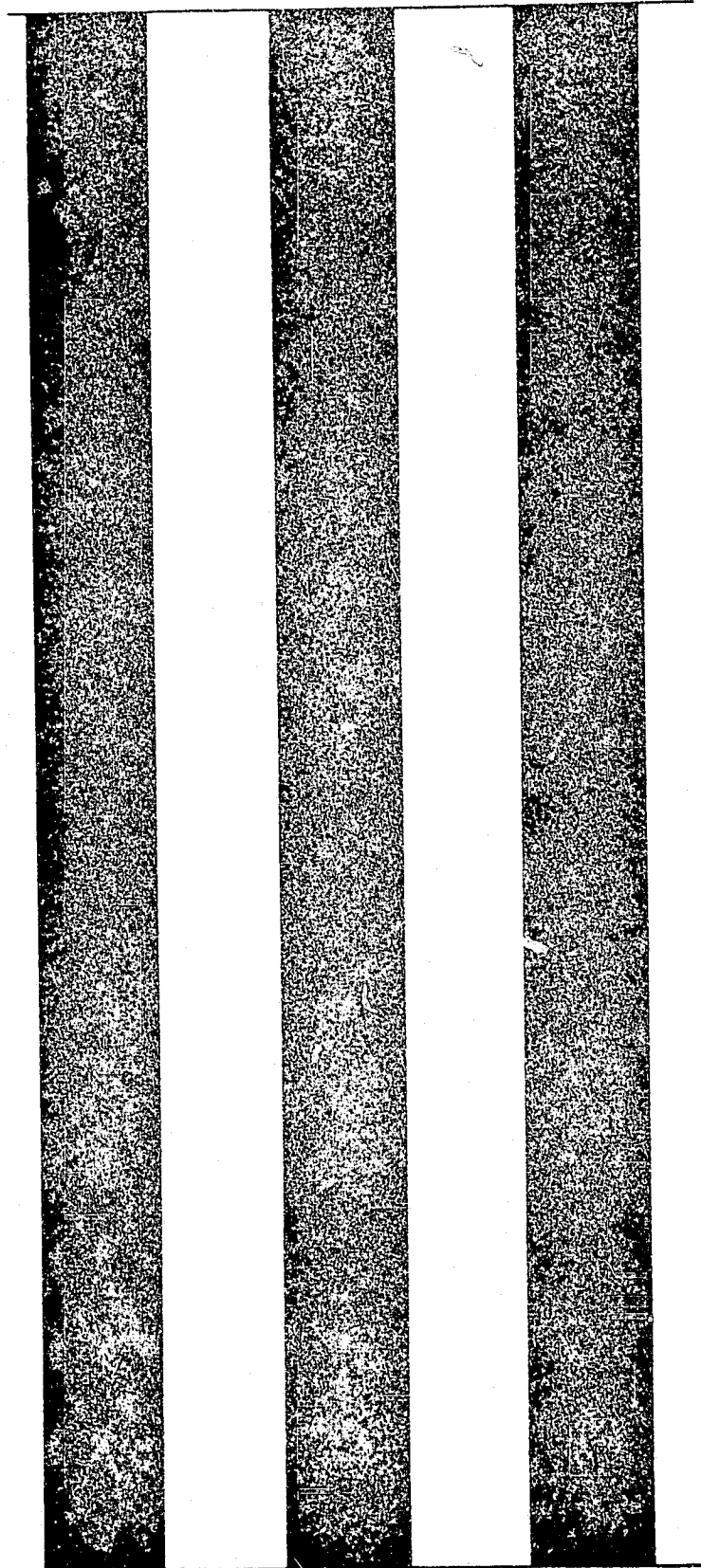

The grape crop was of good quality and would have brought into the County nearly twice the amount realized had it not been for the October rains and the transportation situation. Out-of-State shipments of grapes were 643 car loads. Of these, 567 were refrigerators, 242 box cars and 34 express cars. Local car load shipments were 221. The tonnage moved by rail was 16,000 tons. We estimate that 4,000 tons were carried out by truck, 8,000 tons crushed and 2,000 tons spoiled on the vines by rain. To have moved the crop satisfactorily would have taken three times the amount of refrigerators furnished.

The prune men salvaged nearly their entire crop and the loss occasioned to them by unfavorable weather was about 10%.

A new item appeared among our horticultural products this year - that of dried cherries. While we produced only 18 tons, even that amount is of some importance. If this market can be developed, it will open a source of disposal for all off-grade fresh cherries. The price was in the neighborhood of 18¢ per pound.

We have checked our figures back and forth between the different agencies interested and find them to be correct with the exception of grapes, which necessitates estimates.

We have considered in this report only the fruit crops of major importance. Fruit such as peaches, apricots, quinces berries, etc., are marketed from this County in such a manner that we cannot obtain the figures. Their total value will not exceed \$25,000.00

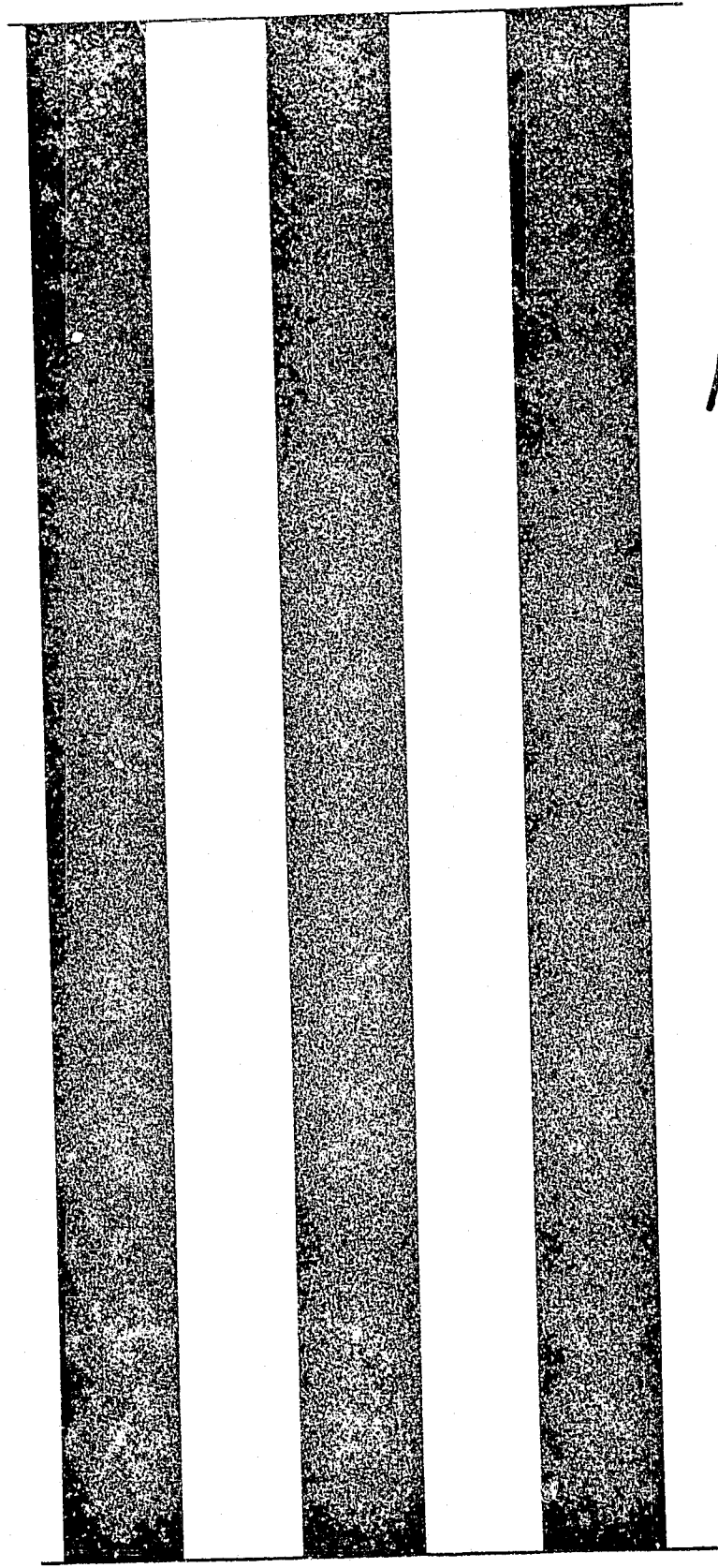
It is interesting to note that the new pear acreage is nearly equal to that of the prunes. The bulk of these pears were planted in the Berryessa Valley.

The tonnage of the various crops was practically normal, excepting prunes, which was about 50% of a normal crop. Prices for all products were considerably lower than 1922, with the exception of cherries, which were almost as good. There seemed to be no market at all for canning plums, of which varieties the Napa crop consists. Of a possible plum tonnage of 500 tons on the trees, only 50 tons were harvested, the balance being a loss.

The quality of all fruits was not up to par. The prune crops contained a large percentage of splits and scabby stock, and the pear crop contained an abnormal amount of No.2 stock.

The total value for the 1923 crop is slightly more than one million dollars less than the value of the 1922 crop.



In the above figures, the tonnages are taken from the record of shipments and do not contain estimates. The values computed are taken from the average prices secured by the various marketing agencies, and are the net returns to the grower.

In comparison with the last two years, the net values are favorable. The 1922 crop was worth \$3,308,000.00 and the 1923 crop was worth \$2,225,000.00.

Apples and cherries were the poorest crops, both in tonnage and returns, being about 40% of normal.

It is of interest to note that with a 50% grape crop, we moved as many tons and received slightly more money than ever before. This is the first season that the entire grape crop of the County has been shipped.

The Pear growers enjoyed a profitable season, although the crop was below normal. The computations above include 750 tons which were drying stock.

The 1924 season was dry, but otherwise favorable. No unusual losses were sustained by weather conditions, insect pests, or diseases.

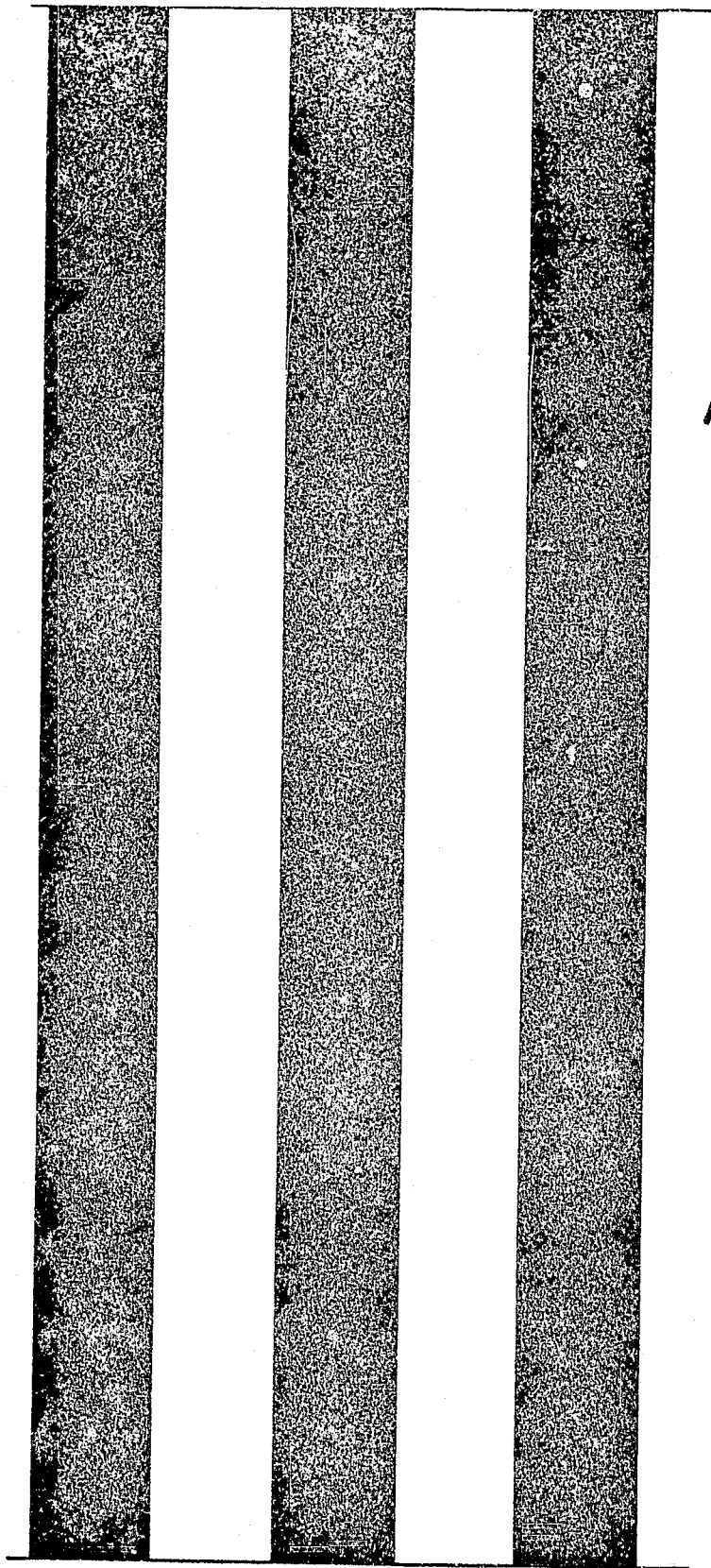

In the above figures the tonnage are taken from the record of shipments, and do not contain estimates, except where notes. The values computed are taken from the average prices secured by the various marketing agencies, and are the net returns to the grower.

In comparison with the last three years, the values are \$368,000 less, the average being \$2,758,000. Unfavorable weather conditions are responsible for the drop in tonnage. The initial setting of all fruits was subnormal, and a wet spring and cool summer made a very poor growing season. All crops matured light in weight. Considerable damage was done to the crops subject to fungus troubles, in particular, cherries and grapes.

As a result of the softening by spring rains, and the development of Brown Rot, the cherry crop was a total failure. Dry rot destroyed approximately 50% of the Zinfandel, and similar varieties of grapes.

The pear tonnage is 50% greater than in 1924, owing to an increase in the bearing acreage; the percentage of a normal set being about as the preceding year.
