**LAKE BERRYESSA** . . . While this is looked upon as a recreational project, actually it was developed to provide irrigation waters for thousands of fertile acres of agricultural land. The lake was formed in Berryessa Valley, behind Monticello Dam, and stores up to 1,600,000 acre feet of Putah Creek water. Facilities for recreation have been built and now the area is a vast playground for holiday and vacation visitors. The lake is about 22 miles long and has a shoreline of over 100 miles, all in Napa County.

Gentlemen:

This 1964 Annual Crop Report for the County of Napa is hereby submitted in accordance with Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code.

The report shows the bearing acreage, production and values of the commercial crops and products produced in the county. The value figures presented in this report represent the gross farm income of agricultural production, and do not reflect net income to the producer.

The total fruit and nut crop values indicate a \$540,000 decrease from the previous year. Repeated late frosts seriously damaged our two leading fruit crops, grapes and prunes. Grape production was 12,000 tons less than 1963; price per ton was substantially greater than the previous year but the gross value was \$238,000 less. Prunes indicated a sharp drop both on production and value for the year; a 700 ton decrease in production and a \$300,000 drop in gross income.

Field and truck crops showed a \$200,000 increase. This was due principally to the increase in production of barley and wholesale nursery stock, a rapidly growing industry in the county.

Range beef decreased \$500,000 in value due to a decrease in price while the feeder beef figure increased \$230,000 due to the increased number of head handled in the feed lots. Eggs, another important source of farm income in Napa County, increased \$340,000 in value in 1964 because of the increase in production. Caponettes, a \$96,000 farm income item in 1963, are no longer being grown in Napa County.

A comparison chart of the principal acreage, tonnage and crop value from 1922, when the first crop report was made in Napa County, to the present date is also included in the crop report.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all individuals and organizations who so willingly cooperated with me and my staff in contributing the information necessary to make this report possible.



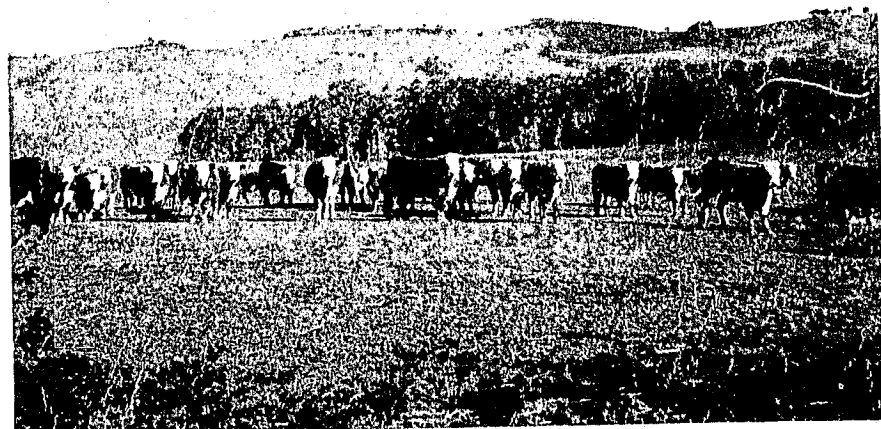

Gentlemen:

I hereby submit the Annual Crop Report of the County of Napa for the year 1965 in accordance with Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code.

The report shows the bearing acreage, production and values of the agriculture crops and products produced in Napa County. The value figures presented in this report represent the gross value of agricultural production, whether sold or used on the farm where produced, and do not reflect net income to the producer which, in many cases, may be less than previous years due to the rising cost of producing these farm commodities.

1965 produced a record gross agricultural value for Napa County, \$22,349,975. The year 1962, with a gross agricultural value of \$21,567,032 was the next highest recorded year in Napa County history.


Beef continues to be our leading agricultural product in value; \$5,785,603 for 1965 compared to \$5,263,200 for 1964. Wine grapes, our second leading agricultural commodity, continues to gain in prominence in Napa County Agriculture, both in acreage and production; 10,561 bearing acres with a production of 40,063 tons and a gross value of \$4,807,560 in 1965 compared to 10,286 bearing acres with a production of 19,760 tons and a gross value of \$2,904,720 for 1964.

Even though prune acreage has remained relatively the same in recent years, our 1965 crop report indicates a near-normal crop; 6,718 tons for 1965 compared to 3,800 tons for 1964. Late frosts in 1964 seriously affected the prune tonnage for that year. Pears, on the other hand, indicated a sharp drop in production for 1965; 912 tons in 1965 compared to 1,885 tons for 1964. This drop in production was attributed principally to weather conditions interfering with the proper pollinization of pear blossoms.

Milk production remained relatively stable both in production and value. Eggs, another important segment of Napa County Agriculture, indicated a substantial increase in production; 4,221,836 dozen for 1964 compared to 4,648,311 dozen for 1965.

I again wish to take the opportunity to thank all individuals and organizations who so willingly cooperated with me and my staff in contributing the necessary information to make this report possible.

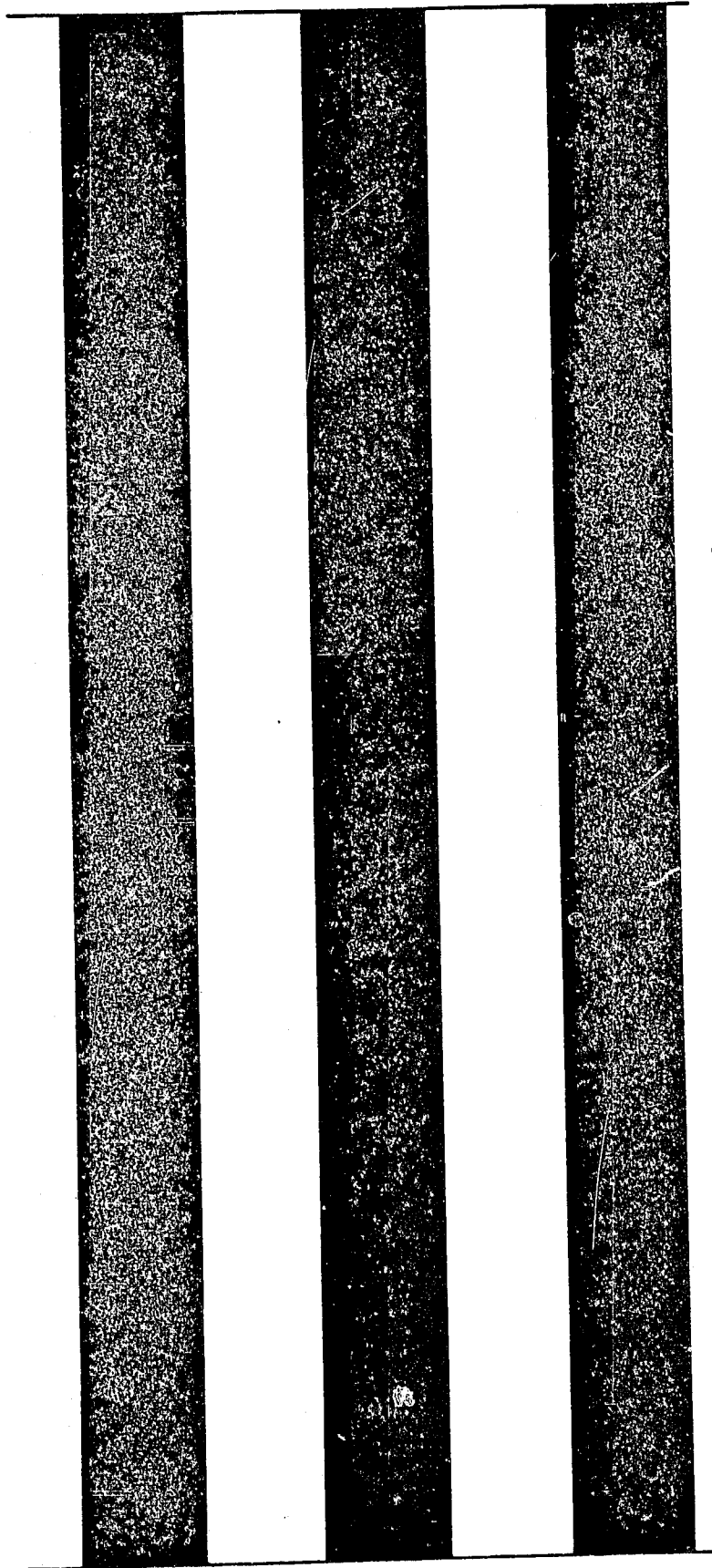

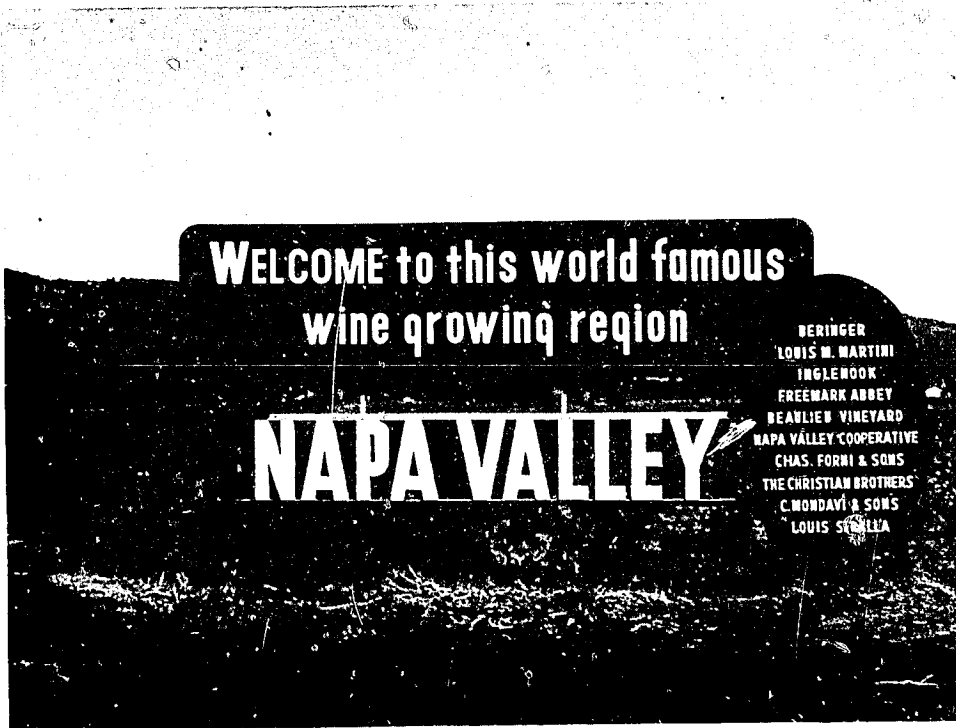
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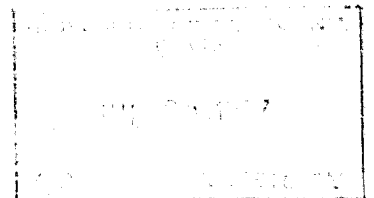

Gentlemen:

I am pleased to present the 1966 Napa County Agricultural Crop Report in accordance with Section 65.5 of the California Agricultural Code.

The report shows the bearing acreage, production and value of the agricultural crops and products produced in Napa County. The value figures presented in this report represent the gross value of agricultural production, whether sold or used on the farm where produced and do not reflect net income to the producer which, in many cases, may be less than previous years due to the rising cost of producing these farm commodities.


The gross value of all agricultural commodities was \$22,834,400, which is the largest in the agricultural history of Napa County, up \$461,000 from 1965 our next highest year of gross agricultural income. The largest agricultural category that contributed to this record year was Field and Truck Crops.

Beef production continues to be our leading agricultural product in value. Fruit and nut crop production indicated very little change from 1965. Grape production was down from 1965, and so were grape prices, grape acreage, however, continues to show a steady climb, prune acreage continues on a downward trend, 5,308 acres in 1966 compared to 6,319 acres in 1965. Price of dried prunes was higher in 1966; this was principally due to the light prune crop in our interior valleys. Walnuts also indicated a higher gross value than in 1965. Income from nursery stock continues to show a steady increase in production and value.

This year, for the first time, because of the many inquiries on the subject, the Napa County Crop Report shows an acreage breakdown by varieties of our wine grapes.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to all individuals and organizations who so willingly cooperated with my staff and myself in supplying the necessary data and gave so generously of their time and efforts towards making this report possible.

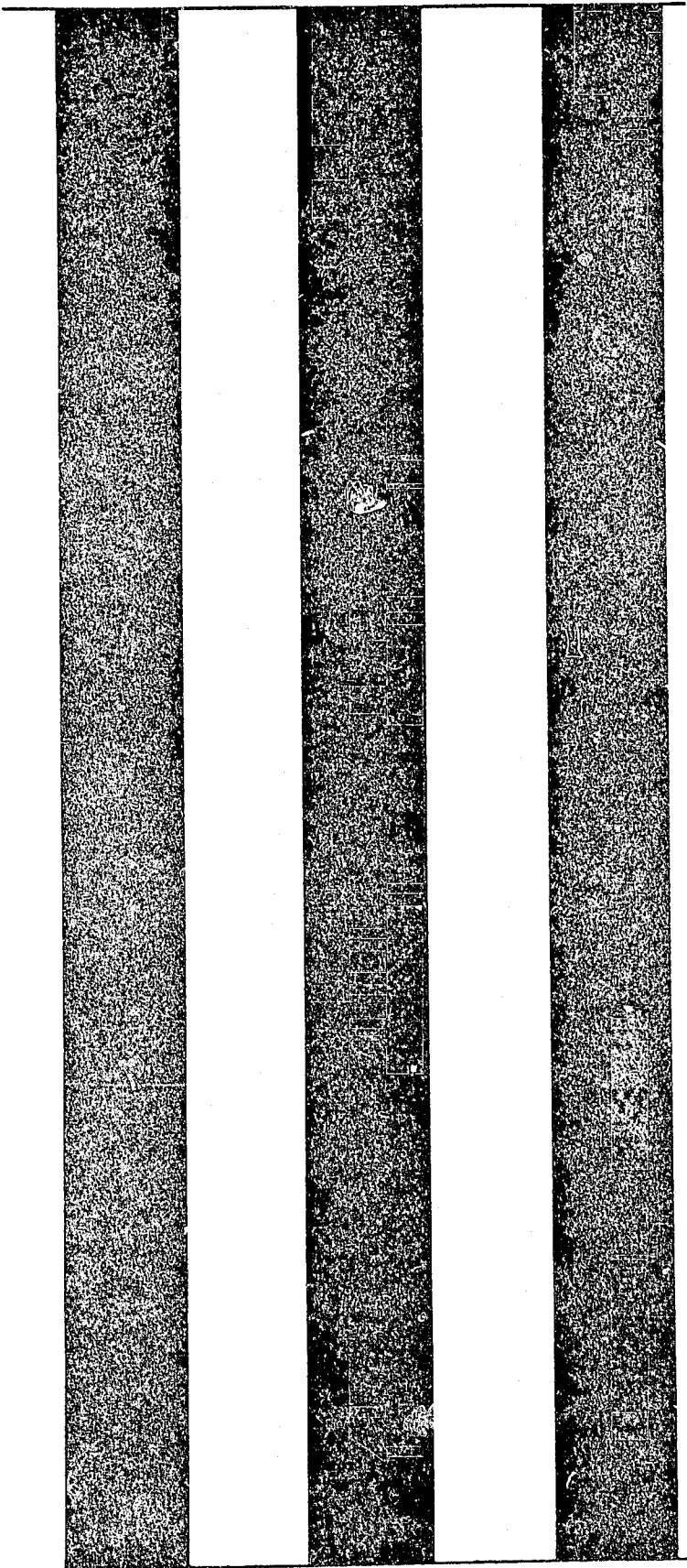

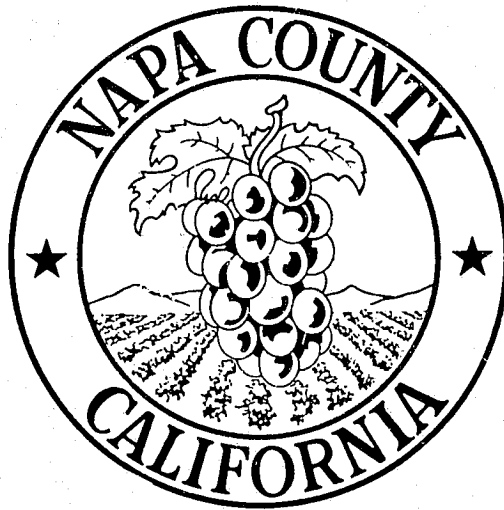

Gentlemen:

I am pleased to submit the forty-ninth Annual Report of Agricultural Production in Napa County as required by Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

The acreage statistics presented in this report exclude non-bearing acres. The value of products is the gross value, whether these products were sold or used on the farm where produced. These figures do not represent net income or a measure of profit to the producer which, in many cases, may be less than previous years due to the rising cost of producing these Agricultural Commodities.

The total gross value of production was \$21,272,580, down approximately one and one half million dollars from our record year of 1966. The value of Animal Production decreased significantly, which in large part contributed to this reduction. In addition, several fruit and nut crops showed appreciable declines. We can account in part for lower quantity of some fruit and nut crops to inclement spring weather in 1967.

Production and total value of wine grapes increased substantially in 1967. Our records show that most current grape acreage entering into production is devoted to varieties priced at premium values. This contributed to the record total value of production for this commodity.

To all of those who contributed towards making this report possible, I wish to express my sincere appreciation.

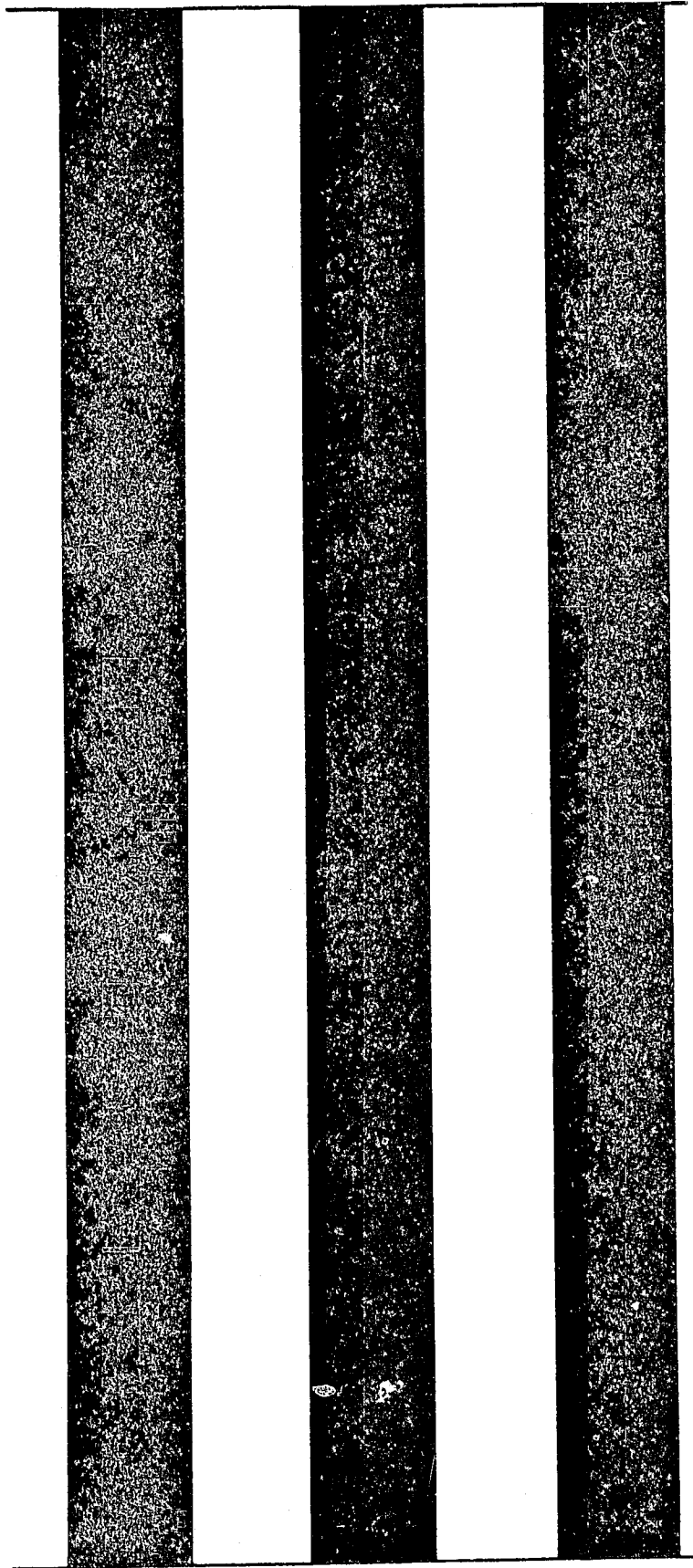

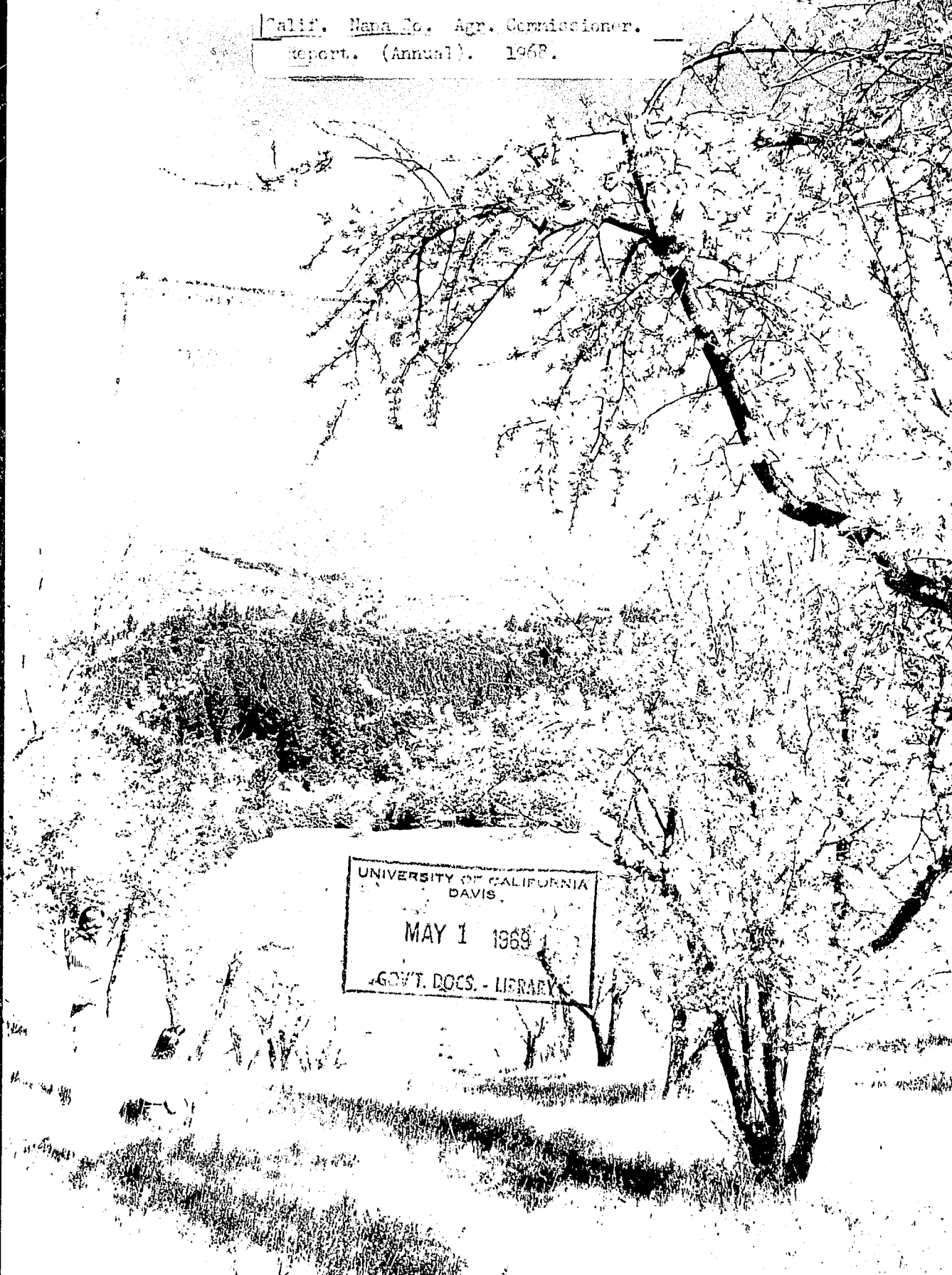

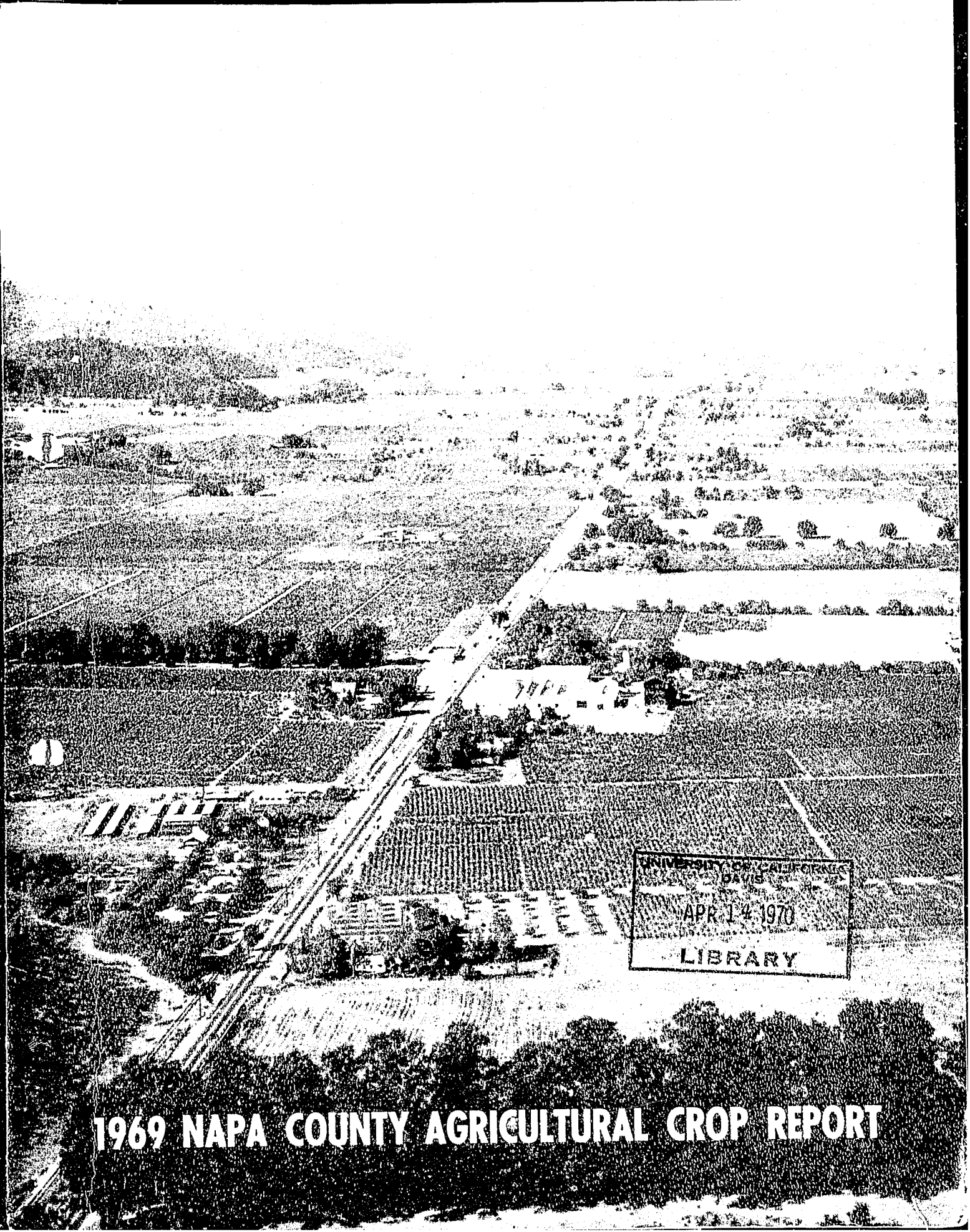

Gentlemen:

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1969 Annual Crop Report of the acreage, production and gross values of the agricultural crops and products of the County of Napa. Included in this report is a narrative section showing the functions and responsibilities of our department.

Napa County has reached another all time record in gross agricultural value of \$26,007,730 an increase of \$2,712,170 over the next highest recorded which was reached in 1968 with a total value of \$23,295,560. The largest single agricultural commodity that contributed to this record was wine grape production with a value of \$8,055,000, making it the leading agricultural commodity in Napa County. This figure indicates an increase of \$1,977,000 over 1968. Increases in price per ton and new acreages coming into production were the main reason for this record figure.


Pears, prunes and walnuts showed a decrease in production values.

Field and truck crops indicated an increase of \$89,500 in gross agricultural value due to increased tonnage in hay and corn silage.

Animal production indicated an increase of \$1,213,160 principally due to increased egg production and price per dozen. Beef prices also showed an increase.

My sincerest appreciation is extended to all individuals, firms and agencies who cooperated with my staff in gathering the information contained in this report.

## Functions and Activities

### Napa County Department of Agriculture

The County Agricultural Commissioner, under state statutes, shall have the responsibility of enforcing certain provisions of the Agricultural, Administrative, other State Government Codes, and certain Federal Regulations for the benefit and protection of both the producer and consumer of agricultural commodities, under the general supervision of the Director of Agriculture.

The Board of Supervisors, to whom the Agricultural Commissioner is directly responsible, may assign other duties in addition to those specified in the above mentioned statutes.

#### Apiary

Beekeepers are required to register each year with their County Agricultural Commissioner as to the location and number of apiaries. Inspections are made of all apiaries and bee colonies for detection of American Foul Brood and other serious and highly contagious diseases of honey bees. Apiaries or colonies found infected with American Foul Brood are required to be destroyed.

#### Certifications

In compliance with regulations covering movements of plants and plant materials to foreign countries, other states and counties, certificates are issued stating as to the requirements of these regulations.

#### Civilian Defense

As representatives of the California Disaster Office, we maintain an inventory of the available food stocks in the county for use in the event of a serious emergency.

#### Laboratory

Upon request, the Agricultural Commissioner's Office will sample soil and plant parts for nematode determinations preparatory to plantings of deciduous crops, principally vineyards. These samples are processed in our lab and sent to Sacramento for determination. Agricultural products are checked for maturity in our lab.

#### Nursery Inspections

State regulations require that all nurseries maintain set standards of pest cleanliness and quality grading. It is the responsibility of this department to inspect and enforce these regulations.

#### Pest Control Enforcement

Agricultural Pest Control Operators are required by State regulations to obtain a State License and register annually with the Agricultural Commissioner in whose county they may have operations, and submit daily reports on each job.

Anyone buying or applying injurious and/or restricted chemicals must secure a permit from their County Agricultural Commissioner. Indiscriminate use of these chemicals could prove dangerous to humans, animals and/or plant life.



#### Pest Control Information

Growers, nurserymen, park departments, schools, pest control operators and homeowners may receive assistance and advice on horticultural and pest problems from our office. Identification of insects, plants, diseases and weeds, as well as information on the care of agricultural and ornamental plants, is offered. Talks are also given when requested by garden groups.

#### Plant Quarantine

Incoming plants and plant products are held for quarantine inspection at all post offices, express agencies and other points of entry within the county as required by State and Federal Quarantines. Agricultural inspection serves to prevent the introduction and spread of pests and diseases within the county and state.

#### Vertebrate Pest Control

Poison baits for the control of squirrels, rats and mice are prepared and sold at cost to the public. A bird control program is conducted county-wide against the nesting European Starling. Other bird species, when doing agricultural damage, are controlled by the Agricultural Commissioner's Office, wherever practical.

#### Seed Inspection

Agricultural and vegetable seed is inspected to insure compliance with labeling and germination standards as required by the California Seed Law.

#### Standardization

For the protection of producers and consumers, inspections of fresh fruits, vegetables, eggs, honey, nuts and poultry meats are made both at wholesale and retail markets, packing houses and in the field. Substandard products are rejected and removed from sale.

#### Statistics

The California Agricultural Code requires that an annual report be prepared showing acreage, production and value of crops grown in Napa County. This publication is available to agricultural, educational and governmental agencies, allied industries and interested parties.

#### Survey and Pest Detection

Insect trapping programs and surveys are conducted throughout the county. These are undertaken to detect and prevent establishment of serious agricultural pests such as Japanese Beetle, Gypsy and Brown Tail Moths, Citrus Whiteflies, Khapra Beetle and various fruit flies. The State is estimating this county will need one additional man year on pest surveys due to the increased traffic through our border stations.

#### Weed Control

Puncture vine is controlled by the Agricultural Commissioner's Office wherever found. All county roadsides are sprayed by this office for weed control. Year-round surveillance of agricultural and suburban areas for the detection and eradication of primary and secondary noxious weeds is performed by this department.
