



Gentlemen:

Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code requires that the Agricultural Commissioner compile a report covering conditions, acreage, production and value of the agricultural products of his county. I am pleased to present Napa County's forty-ninth Annual Crop Report showing a gross value of \$25,231,850 for 1970.

Beef production, with a gross value of \$7,114,000 barely edged out wine grape production, with a gross value of \$7,100,000 as the leading Napa County agricultural crop for 1970. Twenty eight consecutive days of damaging frost during a six weeks period, the longest recorded siege of frost in Napa County history, seriously affected wine grape production for 1970. Taking into account new grape acreage coming into production, fifty percent of the 1970 wine grape production in Napa County was lost due to this continued frost.

Wine grape acreage continues to increase substantially in Napa County as prune orchards are removed and replanted to grapes, and open land is claimed for the same purpose. In 1970, 1200 acres of prunes were removed and all are scheduled for wine grape plantings. One thousand and ninty acres of vineyards were planted in 1970; five hundred of these acres were new plantings. The remaining five hundred and ninty acres were replantings of old existing vineyards.

Price per ton of wine grapes was substantially higher than the previous year due to the limited supply. The future of wine grape production in Napa County will continue to look bright in the years ahead as per capita consumption of good table wines continue to increase.

My sincerest appreciation is expressed to my staff for their diligent and conscientious effort in obtaining and compiling the information for this report and also to the many individuals and organizations who so willingly cooperated with this department in contributing information necessary to make this report possible.



Gentlemen:

In compliance with the requirements of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the annual report of acreage, production and valuation of the agricultural products of Napa County for the year 1971.

Wine grapes regained the number one spot in agricultural income for Napa County with an impressive gross value of \$16,920,000; double the gross value of the 1969 crop, which until 1971 had been our biggest year in wine grape production and gross income. Income from this crop may have been larger still if it had not been for one morning of severe frost and later in the growing year a succession of extremely hot days that seriously affected vines and crop.

Our records show an increase of 3000 acres in young non-bearing vineyards, bringing our total land area committed to wine grapes of 15,339 acres. 1000 of these acres are replants, where old bearing vines were removed for various reasons and the land replanted with new stock. I estimate that an additional 2000 acres are now prepared for the planting of grapes in 1972. The future of wine grapes in Napa County, especially varietal types, appears to be very sound.

Gross income for prunes in 1971 dropped to a new low of \$189,600 compared to \$699,300 in 1970. The reason for this sharp drop was the fact that 1700 acres were pulled in 1971, practically all of which will be planted to grapes. Field and truck crops gross value dropped \$100,000 from 1970. Here again the difference was caused by field and truck crop acreage going to grape production.

Beef value is down \$350,000 from 1970. This was due to less animals being sold even though price per cwt. was up \$2.00. Egg value down \$300,000 from 1971 due to a decreased price. The over-all animal production was down \$1,100,000 from 1970 principally due to decreased production.

Even though gross value of animal production decreased substantially, wine grapes made 1971 the biggest agricultural year in Napa County history in gross agricultural value.

To all members of my staff, and the many individuals and organizations that contributed the information to make this report possible, I express my sincere thanks.





I am pleased to submit the 1972 Napa County Agricultural Crop Report as required by Section 2279 of the State of California Agricultural Code. ţ.

The gross value of all agricultural products for Napa County was \$37,689,460, an increase of \$4,000,000 from 1971 thus making 1972 our biggest year in gross agricultural income.

Wine grapes continue to be our number one indistry in Napa County with an impressive gross income of \$19,400,000, an increase of \$2,480,000 over 1971 which was the highest recorded gross income for wine grapes until now. Wine grape production was 5500 tons less than 1971 due to the frost and more significantly the extreme heat we experienced during the summer months. Our new acreages, which are increasing in production as they continue to mature, partially compensated to keep production to the level indicated. New acreages planted to grapes increased by 2000 acres in 1972 with an anticipated additional 2000 acres to be planted in 1973.

Last year prune acreage decreased by 700 acres and pear acreage decreased by 100 acres with the bulk of these acres being planted to wine grapes. Walnut acreage also decreased for the same reason.

The gross value of beef also showed a significant increase of \$1,500,000 due to increased prices. Nursery stock increased by \$250,000 in gross value due principally to the increased production of our wine grape nurseries.

The splendid cooperation of those who assisted my staff and furnished the data to make this report possible is greatly appreciated.







It is a pleasure to comply with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code and to submit the 1973 Agricultural Crop Report for the County of Napa. Agriculture proudly presented \$62,921,700 to the economy of Napa County, an increase of \$25,140,240 over 1972, making agriculture the number one industry of Napa County, and setting another record year for agriculture.

Wine grapes continue to be the leading agricultural crop with a gross value of \$33,916,000, a \$14,449,000 increase over 1972. This all time record was due to a number of factors, favorable weather, 600 additional acreages coming into production and increased price per ton.

An additional 2,400 new acreages were planted to wine grapes in 1973.

Animal production also showed a significant increase in gross value, \$25,322,500 for 1973 compared to \$15,704,360 for 1972, this was due principally to increased prices. Beef feeders indicated a reduction in production and gross value due to one of our feed lots going out of production.

Field crops gross value indicated a \$1,000,000 increase due to wine grape nursery production. Napa County now has four large grapevine nurseries in full production.

Grain crops were down in production and value due to acreages going to wine grape plantings and inclement weather.

Pear, prune and walnut acreages continue to decrease in acreage and subsequently gross value due to acreages going to wine grapes.

The cooperation and contributions received from the many growers, wineries, individuals and organizations have made this report possible, and to them I wish to extend my sincere appreciation.

Recognition goes to my Department Staff who under the direction of Chief Deputy Agricultural Commissioner Dick Lawley, gathered and compiled the statistics for this report.





In compliance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I am submitting the 1974 Napa County Agricultural Crop Report showing the condition, acreage, gross value and production of the agricultural products of this county.

The gross value of all agricultural crops for 1974 was \$45,143,800, a decrease of \$17,800,000 from 1973. Our two leading agricultural crops, wine grapes and livestock production both indicated a sharp drop in gross value which accounted for the large differential in the gross agricultural figure from 1973 to 1974. Wine grapes dropped in value by \$15,351,000 in one years time even though production was only 341 tons less than 1973. Bearing wine grape acreage increased by 1,000 acres in 1974 but late frosts in May and a few very hot days in mid summer reduced our production somewhat. New plantings of wine grapes to 23,350. Due to the sharp drop in grape prices and the escalating cost of wine grape farming I am sure new grape plantings in Napa County and the rest of the state will be sharply curtailed for some years to come.

Gross value of animal production dropped by \$3,000,000 in 1974. This was due principally to declining meat prices; the loss of production of one of our large feed lots is also reflected in this decrease.

Field crops, which include wine grape rootstock, increased by \$900,000 in 1974.

Pear, prune and walnut acreages continue their decline in acreage and gross value.

I am convinced that wine grapes and animal production will continue to be the leading agricultural commodities in Napa County's future.

The valuable assistance of all those who have provided the information and records necessary for the compilation of this report is acknowledged and appreciated.

Credit for the compilation of this report goes to all members of my staff and to my Chief Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, Dick Lawley, under whose direction this report was compiled and to Agricultural Inspector III, Ted Eaton, for his assistance in compiling the crop acreage figures reflected in this report.





Gentlemen and Madam:

In accordance with Section 2271 of the California Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1975 Agricultural and Livestock Crop Report which reflects the gross value of the agricultural products produced by the farmers in Napa County.

The report indicates an eight and one half million dollar decrease in gross value due principally to drops in production, and price per unit of our two main crops: Wine Grapes and Beef production.

Wine grape production declined by five thousand tons from 1974. This, coupled with a drop in price per ton, shows a five million dollar decline in value from 1974. Drop in production due principally to excessive heat we had during our summer months.

Even though our bearing acreage of wine grapes indicated an increase, because of new plantings coming into production, approximately 600 acres of grapes were pulled preparatory to replanting to new, higher quality varietals, which is a good indication of the confidence our wine grape growers have on the future of wine grape production in Napa County.

Both the production and price per unit of beef were down for 1975. Total value of beef production was down by one and a third million dollars from 1974. Loss of our two beef feed lots is also indicated in our drop in beef value.

I want to thank the many individuals, agencies and producers for their cooperation and information from which this report was compiled, and a special thank you to the members of my staff who so ably assisted in the compilation of this annual crop report.





I

In compliance with the requirements of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the annual report of acreage, production, and gross valuation of the agricultural products of Napa County for the year 1976.

The crop year of 1976 is the first reflection of major agricultural losses that are occurring because of the drought situation that California is now experiencing.

Wine grapes, our major agricultural crop, produced a total of 35,887 tons, a decrease of 14,332 tons from 1975. The quality of the wine grapes was excellent for 1976 which is reflected in the gross value \$13,985,500 for 1976 compared to \$13,524,600 for 1975. Wine grape acreage is 17,584 bearing and 6,350 non-bearing. Approximately 650 bearing acres were pulled because of poor production or quality. I expect all of of these acres will eventually be replanted to grapes.

Our cattle industry has felt the major impact of the drought because of extremely poor range conditions and high feed prices. Cattlemen in 1976 began to reduce their cattle inventory, a trend that has accelerated in 1977.

Cattle that would normally be imported into Napa County to be fed on range did not arrive in 1976. Prices for cattle showed a decrease because of the glut on the market caused by cattlemen reducing inventory. In 1976, 245,000 cwt of cattle were sold with a gross value of \$8,600,000, compared to 350,000 cwt of cattle sold in 1975 with a gross value of \$12,761,000.

Christmas tree growers sold 17,000 trees in 1976 with a gross value of \$137,700. In 1975, 15,770 trees were sold with a gross value of \$123,000. This increase in sales occurred even though there were 20% fewer acres in tree production in 1976.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation to all who have assisted my staff by furnishing necessary information which has made the compilation of this report possible.



Gentlemen:

It is a pleasure to submit the 1977 Agricultural Crop Report for Napa County in compliance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code.

Gross farm receipts increased to \$42,474,700 in 1977, an increase of \$10,739,450 from 1976. Wine grapes accounted for most of this gain, due principally to increased bearing acreage, producing a record grape crush for Napa County of 57,630 tons, with a gross value of \$31,259,000. However, gross wine grape value is \$2,657,000 below 1973, our largest wine grape income year to date with a gross value of \$33,916,000.

Due to the continued drought in 1977, the average grape yield per acre was 2.77 tons compared to 1973 crop of 4.24 tons per acre, our record grape crush prior to 1977. With new grape acreages coming into production in years to come, and providing we continue to have good weather, grape production should continue to increase.

The cattle industry indicates a continuing significant drop in production and value from 1976, due to the drought which caused a reduction in cattle inventory and a scarcity of usable range. Other crops varied, depending on water available to them.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation for the cooperation and assistance of all individuals who provided the needed information to make this report possible.





In compliance with the requirements of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I am happy to submit the 1976 Agricultural Crop Report for Napa County containing production and gross values of the agricultural products raised in Napa County.

Napa County had a good wine grape year, as predicted. As our leading crop, a record 72,837 tons was produced in 1978, with an estimated value of 39 million dollars, compared to 1977 production of 57,629 tons valued at 31 million dollars. The increase in value was due almost entirely to the additional 15,000 tons of production, since the average price per ton remained fairly constant. With new plantings and the maturing of young vineyards, Napa County wine grape production should continue to increase in future years.

Our cattle industry remained relatively stable, both in production and value, following the impact of two drought years. With the return of near normal rainfall, rangeland and pastures improved dramatically.

Other products reflected the changes of production emphasis or demand; such as poultry products, which had a substantial increase; and hay, which had an increase in production but little or no demand. Grapevine and nursery products continued to increase in 1978, as well as many new speciality crops.

I wish to express my sincere appreciation for the cooperation and assistance of all who provided information to make this report not only possible but meaningful.
