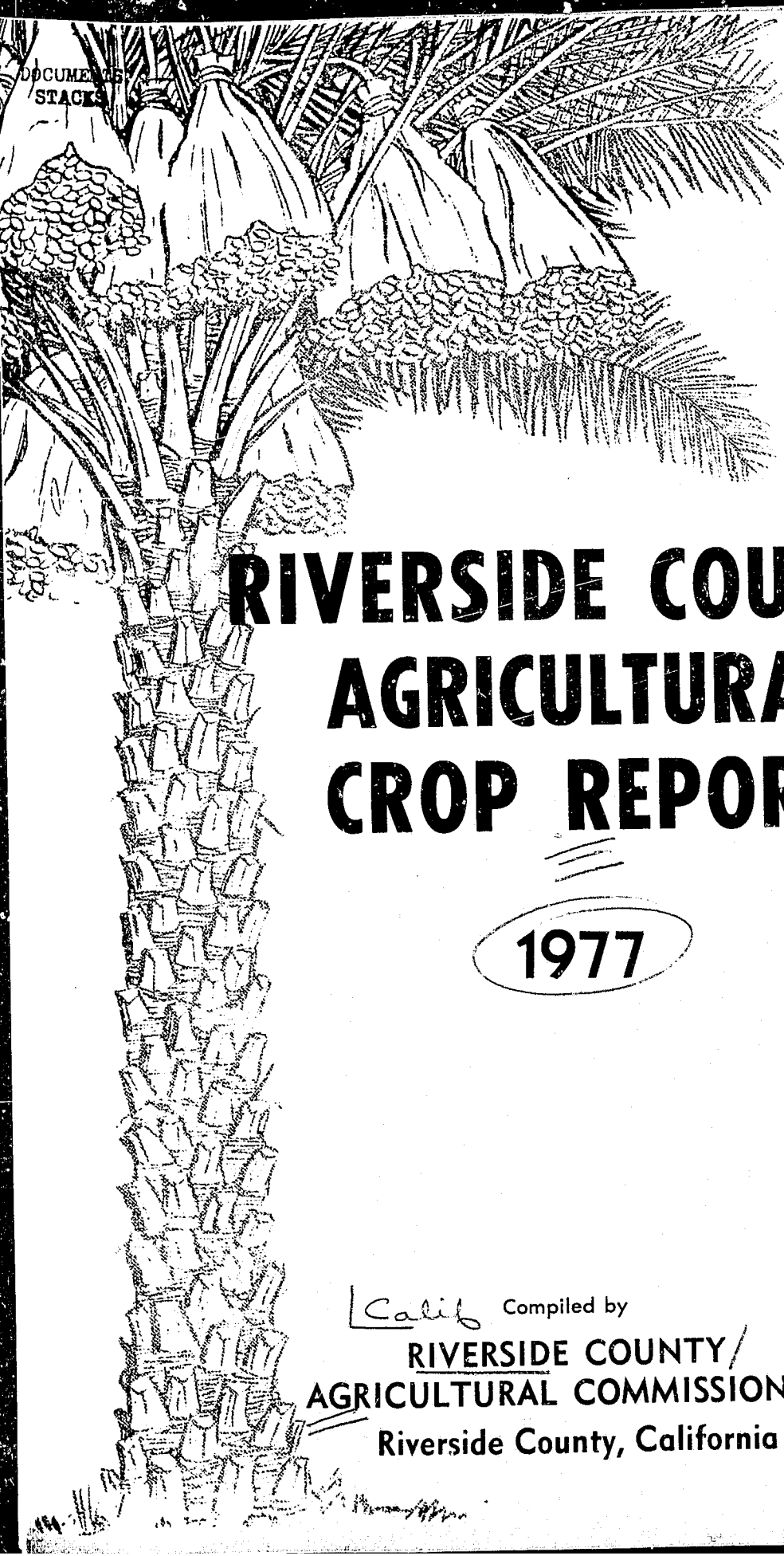

Gentlemen:

In compliance with the requirements of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the annual report of the acreage, production and valuation of the agricultural products of Riverside County for the year 1977.

The gross value of agricultural crops was \$268,345,800, a decrease of \$8,584,400 from the previous year 1976. The value of livestock production was \$226,575,900 an increase of \$10,605,900 from 1976. The total value of farm products grown in Riverside County in 1977 amounted to \$494,921,700. This is a \$2,021,500 increase from the previous total of \$492,900,200 in 1976. The list of crops exceeding one million dollars in value totaled 31, one less than was recorded in 1976. Sugar beets, corn ensilage, and sudan were dropped while romaine and wine grapes were added.

The reports for dates represents the 1976 production which was marketed in 1977. It must be emphasized that this report reflects a gross return and in no way represents a measure of profit to the producer. Every dollar received by farmers in Riverside County in 1977 can be multiplied by three. This figure leading agricultural economists agree is the average for most agricultural products. Therefore, \$494,921,700 becomes \$1,484,765,100, revenue generated to the total economy, again confirming agriculture as the leading industry in the county.

The valuable assistance of all those who have provided the information and records necessary for the compilation of this report is acknowledged and appreciated.

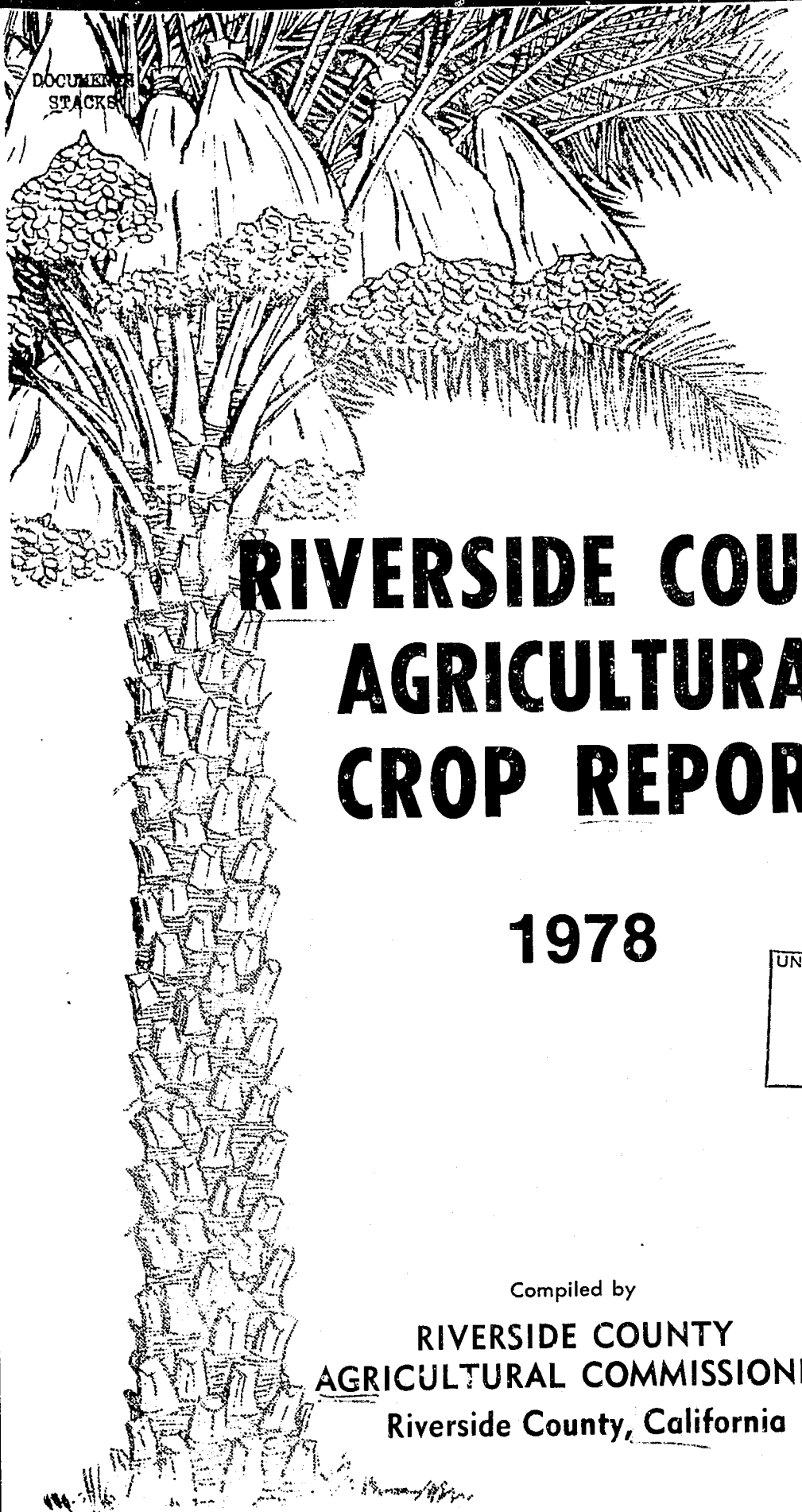

Gentlemen:

In compliance with the requirements of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the annual report of the acreage, production and valuation of the agricultural products of Riverside County for the year 1978.

The gross value of agricultural crops was \$306,801,400, an increase of \$38,455,600 from the previous year, 1977. The value of livestock production was \$235,705,100, an increase of \$9,129,200 from 1977. The total value of farm products grown in Riverside County in 1978 amounted to \$541,506,500. This is a \$47,584,800 increase from the previous total of \$494,921,700 in 1977. The list of crops exceeding one million dollars in value totaled 33, two more than was recorded in 1977. Eggplant and oat hay were dropped while asparagus, bell peppers, okra, and radishes were added.

The reports for dates represents the 1977 production which was marketed in 1978. It must be emphasized that this report reflects a gross return and in no way represents a measure of profit to the producer. Every dollar received by farmers in Riverside County in 1978 can be multiplied by three. This figure, leading agricultural economists agree, is the average for most agricultural products. Therefore, \$542,506,500 becomes \$1,627,519,500 revenue generated to the total economy, again confirming agriculture as the leading industry in the county.

The valuable assistance of all those who have provided the information and records necessary for the compilation of this report is acknowledged and appreciated.

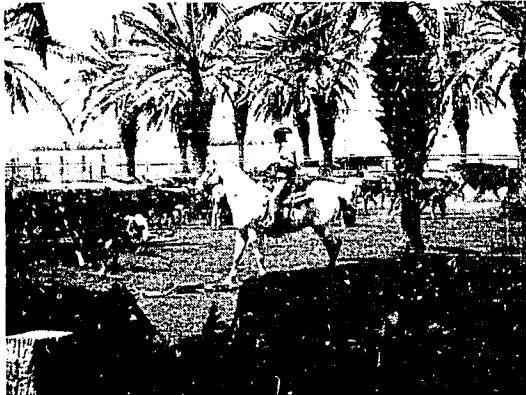

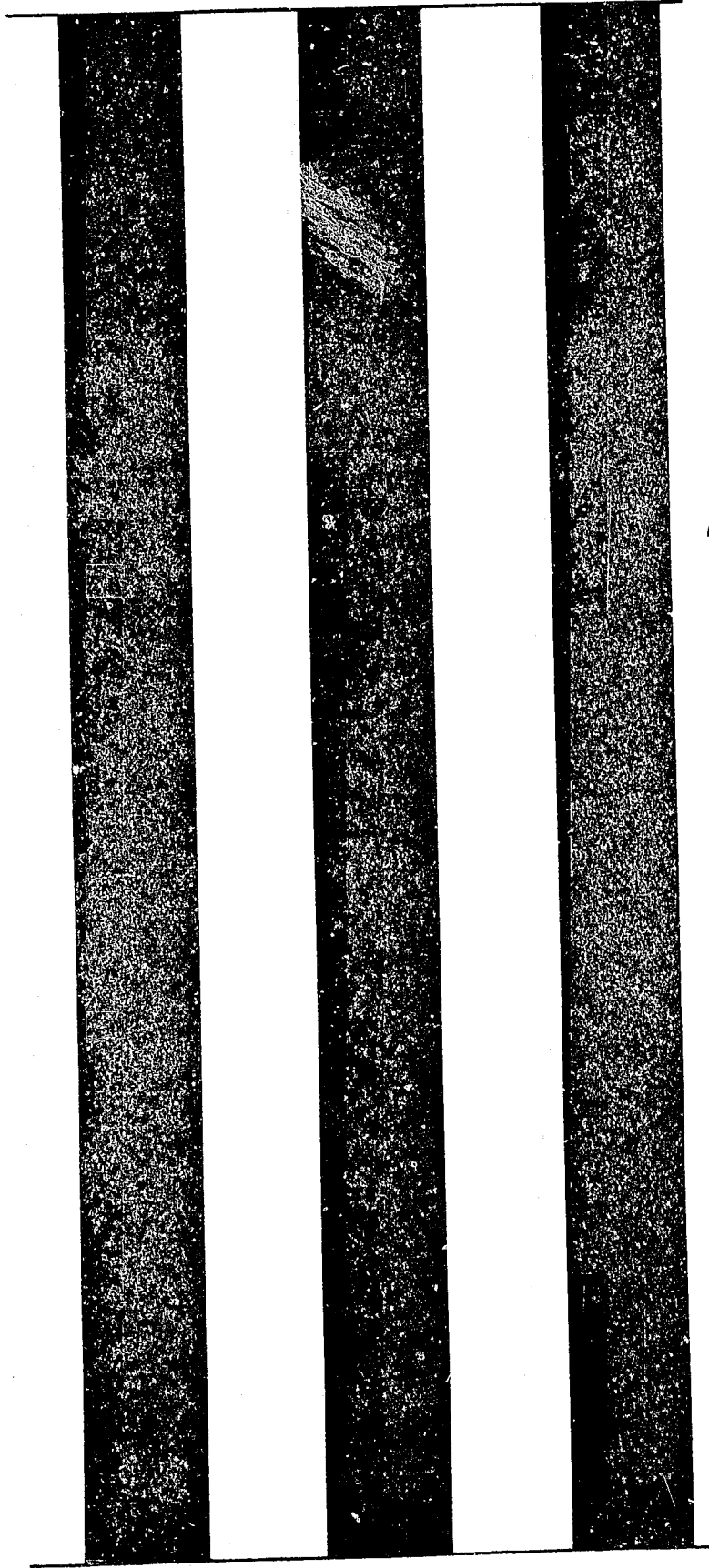

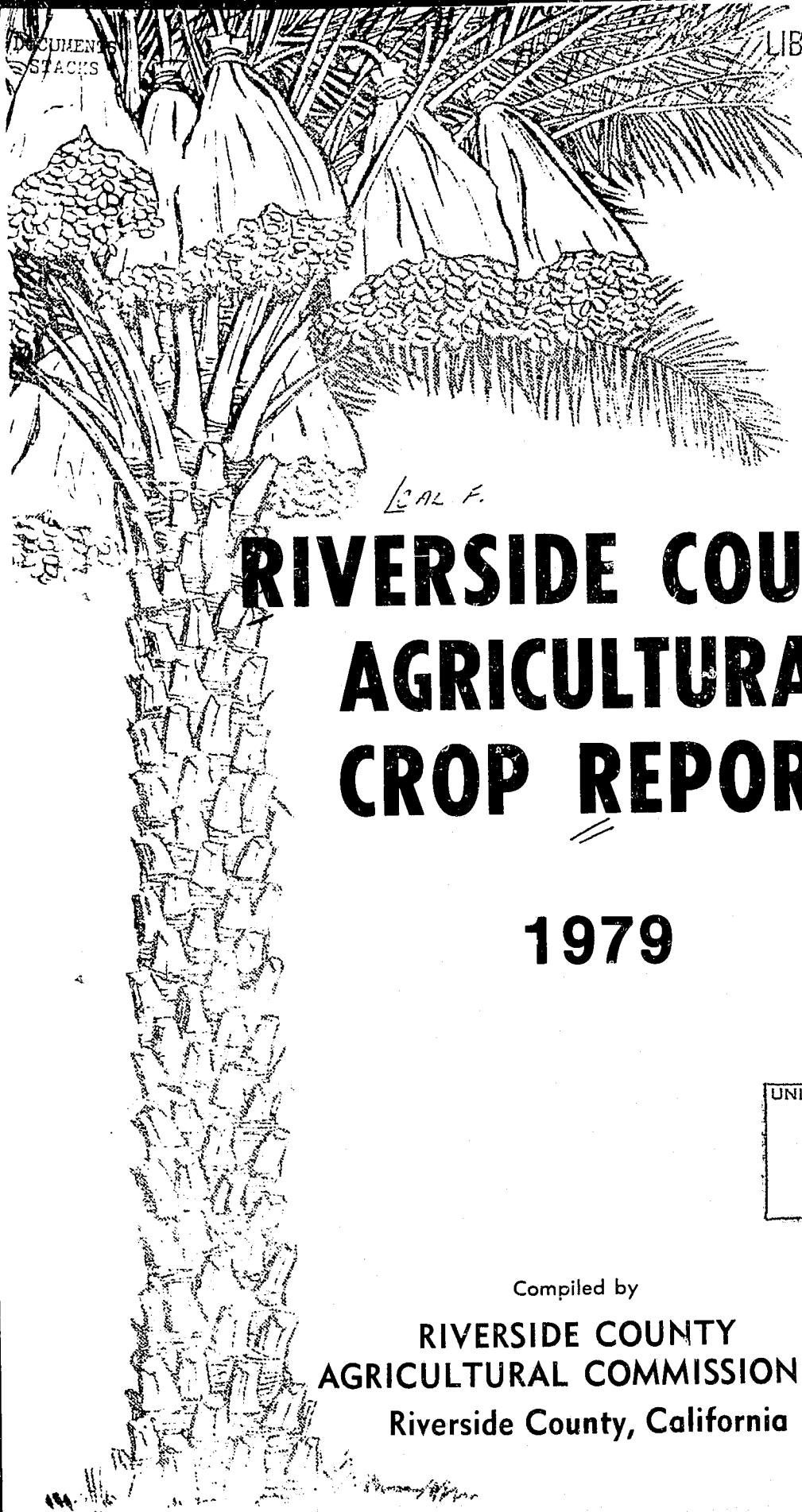

Radishes and summer squash were dropped while broccoli, green beans, barley hay, eggplant, loose leaf lettuce, oat hay, sugar beets and tangelos were added.

It must be emphasized that this report reflects a gross return and in no way represents a measure of profit to the producer. Every dollar received by farmers in Riverside County in 1979 can be multiplied by three. This figure, leading agricultural economists agree, is the average for most agricultural products. Therefore, \$631,723,000 becomes \$1,895,169,000 revenue generated to the total economy, again confirming agriculture as the leading industry in the county.

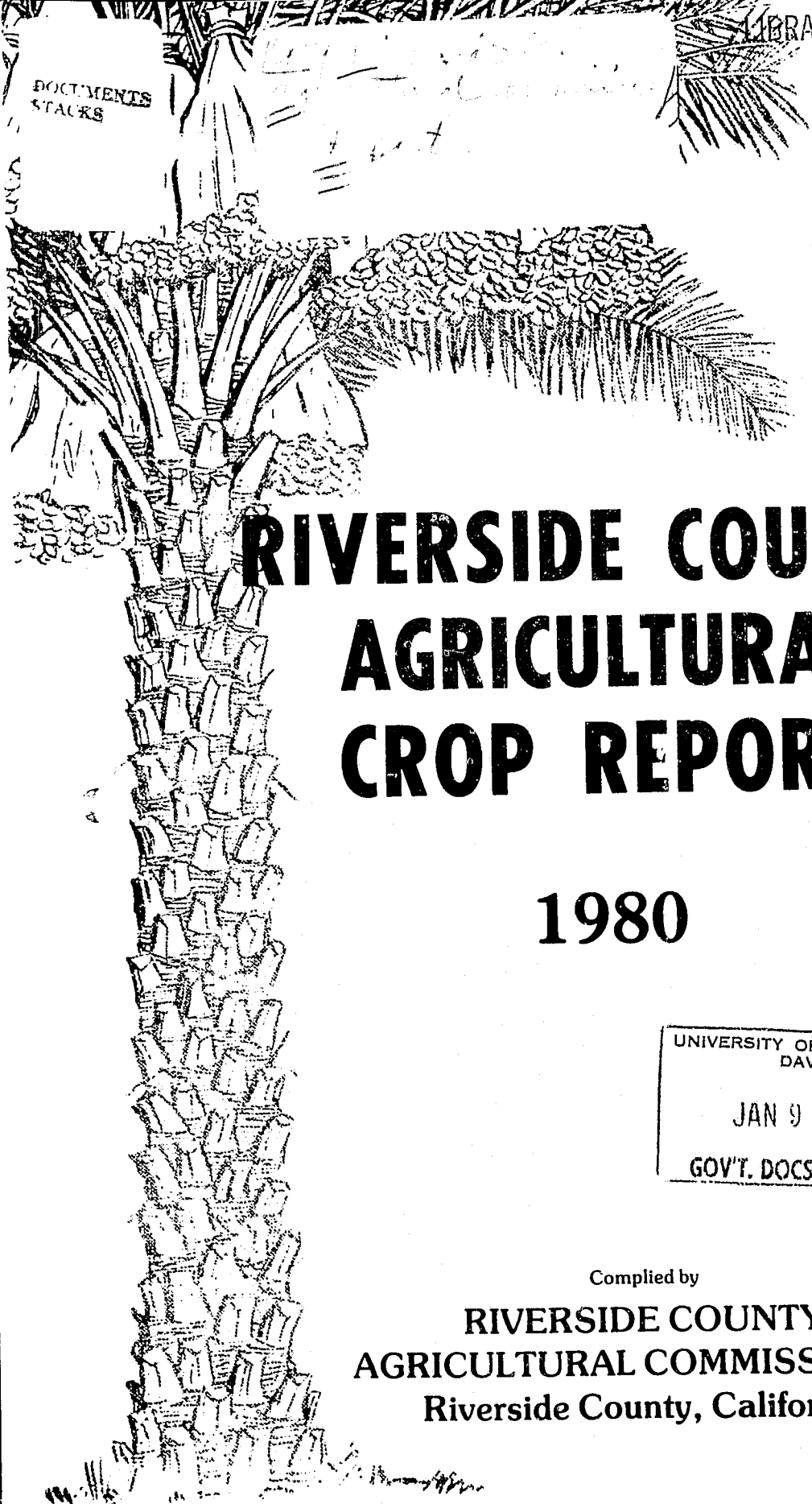

In compliance with the requirements of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the annual report of the acreage, production and valuation of the agricultural products of Riverside County for the year 1980.

The gross value of agricultural crops was \$368,983,100, an increase of \$26,430,900 from the previous year, 1979. The value of livestock production was \$324,543,400, an increase of \$35,372,600 from 1979. The total value of farm products grown in Riverside County in 1980 amounted to \$693,526,500. This is a \$61,803,500 increase from the previous total of \$631,723,000 in 1979. The list of crops exceeding one million dollars in value totaled 35, four less than was recorded in 1979. Barley hay, green beans, loose leaf lettuce, oat hay, romaine lettuce, pasture other and sugar beets were dropped, while cannery tomatoes, radishes and summer squash were added.

The reports for dates represents the 1979 production which was marketed in 1980. It must be emphasized that this report reflects a gross return and in no way represents a measure of profit to the producer. Every dollar received by farmers in Riverside County in 1979 can be multiplied by three. This figure, leading agricultural economists agree, is the average for most agricultural products. Therefore, \$693,526,500 becomes \$2,080,579,500 revenue generated to the total economy, again confirming agriculture as the leading industry in the county.

The valuable assistance of all those who have provided the information and records necessary for the compilation of this report is acknowledged and appreciated.

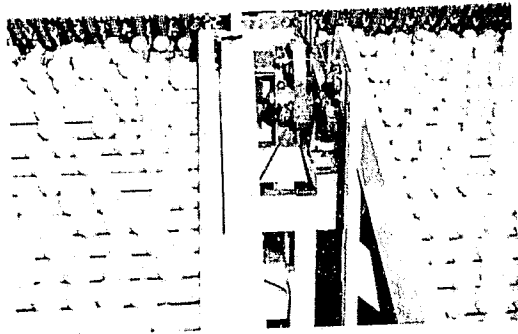

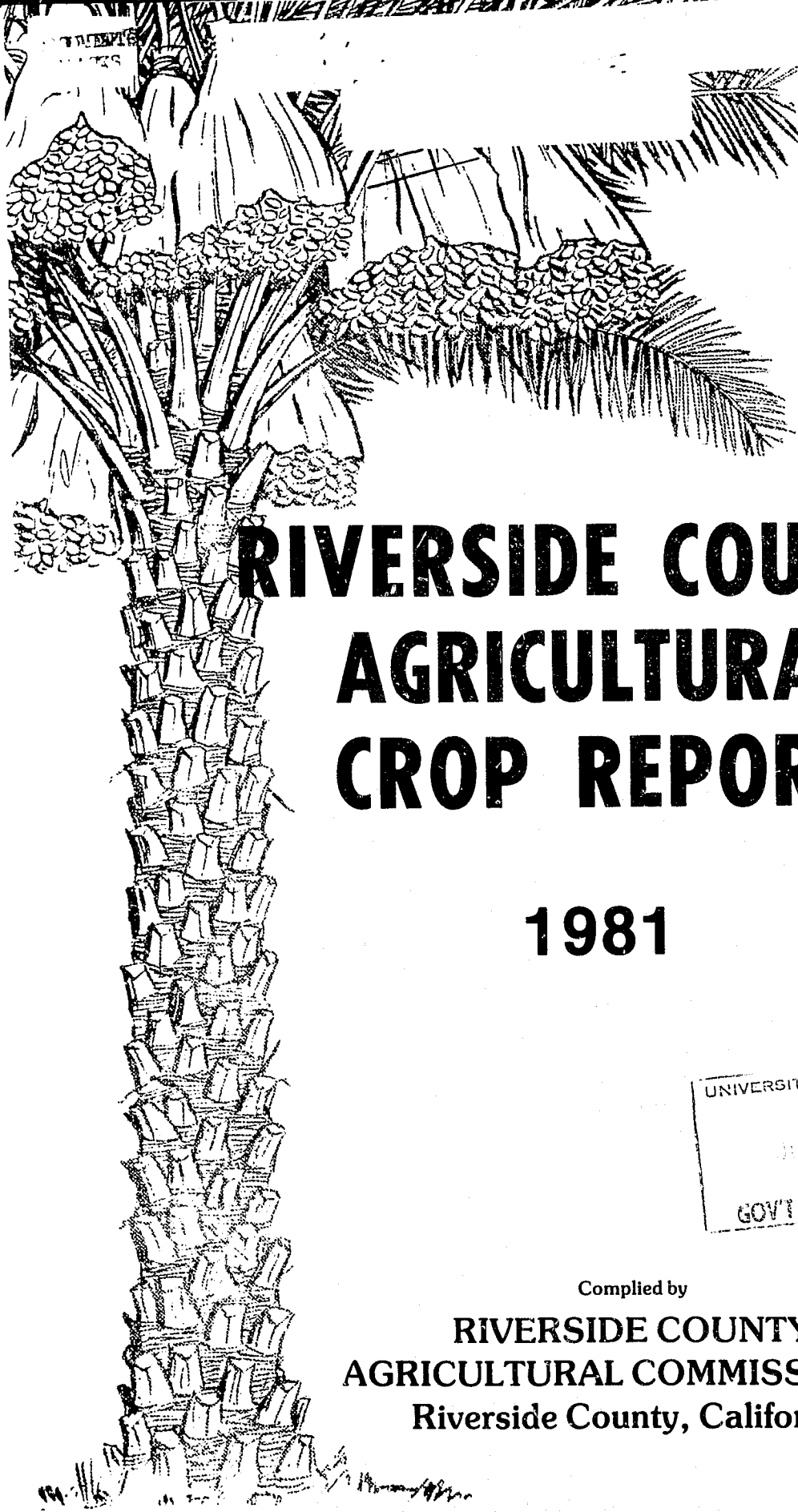

In compliance with the requirements of Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, I hereby submit the annual report of the acreage, production and valuation of the agricultural products of Riverside County for the year 1981.

The gross value of agricultural crops was \$434,604,200, an increase of \$65,621,100 from the previous year, 1980. The value of livestock production was \$349,634,400, an increase of \$25,091,000 from 1980. The total value of farm products grown in Riverside County in 1981 amounted to \$784,238,600. This is a \$90,712,100 increase from the previous total of \$693,526,500 in 1980. The list of crops exceeding one million dollars in value totaled 38, three more than was recorded in 1980. Dehydrator onions and tangelos were dropped, while green beans, honeydew melons, loose leaf lettuce, pasture - other and romaine lettuce were added.

The reports for dates represents the 1980 production which was marketed in 1981. It must be emphasized that this report reflects a gross return and in no way represents a measure of profit to the producer. Every dollar received by farmers in Riverside County in 1981 can be multiplied by three. This figure, leading agricultural economists agree, is the average for most agricultural products. Therefore, \$784,238,600 becomes \$2,352,715,800 revenue generated to the total economy, again confirming agriculture as the leading industry in the county.

The valuable assistance of all those who have provided the information and records necessary for the compilation of this report is acknowledged and appreciated. I would also like to express my appreciation to the members of my staff for their effort in the preparation of this report.

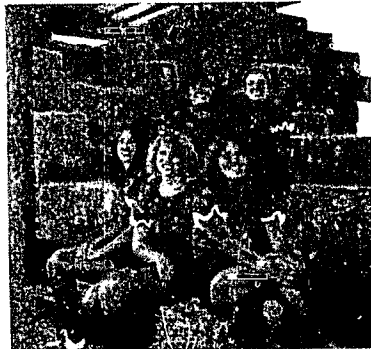
