TO THE STATE DIRECTOR OF AGRICULTURE THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

Gentlemen:

We are very pleased to present the 1964 record high Agricultural Crop Report for Stanislaus County. It will be noted the county once more is showing a larger total value in production than in any previous year. A record breaking high of \$167,747,680 is a gain of \$9,196,571 over the previous high shown in the 1963 report.

This report covers the acreage production and value of all crops produced and the value of all livestock and poultry products sold during the year. Also shown in this report are the acreages of bearing and non-bearing permanent crops. The figures include a tabulation of all new plantings and pull-outs to January 1, 1965.

The figures shown are gross income and do not represent net income to the farmers.

We wish to thank all of the irrigation districts, business firms, and individuals who cooperated with us by furnishing information which made the compilation of this report possible. Also, the members of the Agricultural Extension Staff and the Agricultural Commissioner's Staff.

FIELD CROPS

Alfalfa - - Total acreage declined. Yields were much the same but prices were lower, bringing a net decrease for this crop.

Dry Beans - - Total acreage declined again this year. Prices were down for all varieties except large limas. Acreages declined for all varieties except blackeyes. Yields of all varieties except blackeyes were down slightly. Gross tonnage was down as well as gross returns for all beans as a class.

Grain -- Barley, corm, and oats declined in acreage. Wheat and rice acreage remains the same. Milo acreage gained slightly. Yields were more or less stable. Prices fluctuated somewhat, but gross prices were average.

Field Corn - - Acreage was down. Yields and prices up. Gross revenues down slightly for 1964 crop. Silage corn shows a slight increase in acreage and price resulting in a larger gross income.

Cotton - - Acreage up again about 50 per cent. Yields were better and prices up a cent over 1963. Gross income up nearly 50 per cent.

Irrigated pasture - - Acreage and rents more or less stable. Income stable.

Sugar Beets - - Acreage shows nearly a 25 per cent increase. Yields down slightly, prices stable resulting in a sizeable increase in gross returns.

Field crops as a class showed an over-all drop in total acreage. This was due primarily to a shift to vegetable and fruit and nut crop acreage. Acreage was down below the 1963 level, but income was not down as low as 1962 considering the decrease in acreage, gross income was favorable.

SEED PRODUCTION

Alfalfa - - Certified production increased slightly. Yields were better, but prices slightly lower. Common alfalfa acreage was much the same as the previous year, yields better. Over-all, alfalfa seed production income was up.

Peas - - Pea acreage was up approximately 20 per cent. Yields were down slightly. Gross income up a small amount.

Red Clover - - Acreage up, yields and prices down. Slight increase in gross income.

Miscellaneous - - Acreage up slightly. Income down. Gross revenue down slightly.

VEGETABLE CROPS

Vegetable crops were up in acreage a small amount, but gross revenue was down.

Tomatoes - - Tomato acreage down. Fresh tomatoes did not fare too well. Late planted acreages were damaged by early frost and rain. Canning acreages were plagued with harvesting difficulties. Prices were much the same, yields were slightly better, but gross income was off some. A drastic reduction in acreage may take place in 1965.

Watermelons - - Acreage declined slightly. Tonnage and prices were up. Gross income up.

Cantaloupes - - Acreage up slightly, yields and prices down slightly. Gross income down slightly.

Honeydews - - Acreage up slightly, yields and prices down. Gross income down.

Other melons - - Acreages decreased. Persian yield somewhat better, other yields down. Prices slightly lower resulting in lower over-all gross income.

Peas - - Acreage yield and prices all increased slightly. Gross income up.

Spinach - - Acreage yield and prices up. Gross income up about 40 per cent.

Green Lima Beans - - Acreage considerably increased. Yields and prices slightly lower. Gross income up 20 per cent.

Onions - - Acreage up, yields slightly down. Prices more favorable. Gross income up over 100 per cent.

Lettuce - - Head lettuce acreage decreased. Yields stable, prices somewhat lower. Gross income down slightly.

Peppers - - Acreage down slightly, yields down some. Prices much more favorable resulting in a small increase in gross returns.

Cole Crops - - Acreage decreased for 1964. Yields much the same, prices stable. Gross income down.

Snap Beans - - A new item. Formerly included in Miscellaneous Vegetables. An important addition to the vegetable picture.

FRUIT AND NUT CROPS

Fruit and nut tree acreages continue to grow. Most of the acreage increase is due to continued heavy planting of almonds, walnuts and apricots on the west side. In the near future our new plantings of pears will become a factor in the gross receipts from fruit and nut crops. Bushberries may increase in the near future. Olives continue a slow decline in acreage. All the other major fruit and nut crops are stable or show a slight increase.

Almonds - - Bearing acres, yields and prices all up. Gross income up a sizeable amount.

Apricots - - Apricots account for a sizeable increase in the fruit and nut gross income increase. Acreages, yields and prices all up. Gross returns up considerably.

Bushberries - - Acreage and yields declined slightly, but were off-set by an increase in price. Gross income up slightly.

Grapes - - Total revenue up slightly. Wine grapes accounted for the bulk of the gross returns. Raisin and table varieties more or less stable.

Clingstone Peaches - - Cling peaches were a good crop again in 1964. Yields and prices slightly better. Gross income up.

Freestone Peaches - - Yields and prices again were favorable. Gross income up.

Nectarines - - Acreage up slightly, yields much the same. Prices were a little better, gross sales up slightly.

Strawberries - - Acreage fairly constant, yields and prices better, gross income up.

Walnuts - - Acreage and prices up, yields stable. Gross returns up substantially. A good year for walnuts.

Pears - - An estimated production of 713 tons brought in a small return to growers in 1964. Only about 20 per cent of our acreage is considered of bearing age. Income included under Miscellaneous for 1964.

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY

Beef Cattle - - Numbers of cattle and calves on feed continue to increase but prices continue downward. A slight over-all decrease in gross revenue results.

Swine - - Pig numbers show a slight increase. Prices stable resulting in an over-all increase in gross returns.

Sheep - - Increase in numbers and prices resulted in an over-all increase in gross income. Wool returns were down due to decrease in amount and lower price.

Horses and Mules - - Total number of horses in the county continues to grow. Prices are on the increase. Gross income continues to increase.

Dairying - - Milk cow inventory continues to decline. Market milk increased again in volume and price. Manufacturing milk decreased in volume and increased in price. Gross returns for market milk up substantially. Manufacturing milk income declined.

Poultry and Poultry Products - - Poultry income still on the increase in spite of lower prices for other chickens, fryers, and chicks, and heavy turkeys. Prices for eggs, both hatching and market, a little better. Production on all, but chicks and hatching eggs, increased. Gross income up a substantial amount.

TO THE STATE DIRECTOR OF AGRICULTURE THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS THE CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

Gentlemen:

We herein present Stanislaus County's Agricultural Crop Report for 1965. This is the first time for several years that the income for farm crops has shown a decline. This was approximately a two million dollar decline from the previous 1964 income.

It will be noted in reading this report that there was a large drop in the peach and grape incomes. Livestock, dairying and poultry increased and this offset some of the losses. A serious loss to this group of farmers was an approximate twenty percent in the peach income due to bad weather conditions during harvest.

Again we want to remind you that these are gross figures and do not represent the net income to the farmers.

We wish to thank all of the irrigation districts, business firms and individuals who cooperated with us by furnishing information which made the compilation of this report possible. We also thank the members of the Agricultural Extension Staff and the Agricultural Commissioner's Staff.

FIELD CROPS

Alfalfa - - Total acreage declined another 3000 acres. Yields were down a small amount, but prices were slightly better. Total value was down approximately \$500,000 from 1964.

Dry Beans - - Total acreage was down approximately 4000 acres. Prices on all varieties were somewhat better. Yields on all varieties were up with the exception of Blackeyes. Gross production was down, however, due to increased prices the value of production was up almost \$700,000.

Grain - - Barley and oats were down in acreage. Corn was up slightly. Wheat and rice acreages were stable. Sorghum grain acreages were an approximately 20 per-cent. Yields were fairly stable, with the exception of barley and wheat. Prices remained fairly stable. Gross income was approximately the same as 1964.

Field Corn - Gross income was up slightly. Silage corn continues to increase in acreage, yield and price. It had a significantly larger gross income for 1965.

Cotton - - Acreage was up 16 from 1964. Yields were up slightly. Prices were a little lower, however, gress income was up \$5,000 on lint and \$1,000 on seed. This is a very small portion of the total for field crops.

Irrigated Pasture - - A slight increase in acreage coupled with a small increase in rents resulted in an increase in the gross return of approximately \$300,000.

Sugar Beets - - A 20 percent decrease in acreage, a small decrease in yield, and the price remaining stable resulted in a decline in total revenue of approximately \$300,000.

Field crops, as a class, showed a decrease in gross income of approximately \$400,000. This was due to a decrease in acreage of about 7000 acres, plus some decreases in production and value. The decrease in gross production amounted to less than 2 percent. Income was favorable, considering all factors.

SEED PRODUCTION

Alfalfa - - Certified acreage was down slightly. Production was down again. Prices were stable. Gross income was down considerably. Common alfalfa acreage was down slightly. Yields were down considerably. Prices were down one cent. Gross income was down over 50 per-cent.

Peas - - Pea acreage was almost double that of 1964. Yields were slightly better, prices stable. There was sizeable increase in gross income.

Red Clover - - Acreage and yields were better. Prices were one half cent lower. Gross income was up slightly.

<u>Miscellaneous</u> - - Acreage and value were up slightly. Gross income was up slightly.

VEGETABLE CROPS

Vegetable acreage was up in 1965. Gross income was up almost \$3,000,000. It was, on the overall, a good year.

Tomatoes - - Total acreage was down only slightly, yields were down slightly also. Prices were much better resulting in an increase in gross income of almost \$2,500,000. The absence of braceros was felt in acreage reductions, however, machine picked fields had a better than anticipated yield. The cost of picking was probably up from 1964, but this is not shown as these are gross and not net values.

<u>Watermelons</u> - - Acreage decreased slightly, however, yields were much better. On the average, prices were less but gross income was better than 1964.

Cantaloupes - - Acreage declined again this year. Yields were down slightly. Prices were slightly better. Gross income was off slightly.

Honeydews - - Acreage was down some. Prices and yields were better. Gross income was down slightly.

Other Melons - - Acreage was down, yields were down. Although prices were up, overall gross income was down.

<u>Peas</u> - - Acreage increased one third. Yields and prices were down slightly resulting in a small decrease in gross income.

Spinach - - Acreage was down. Yields were up. Prices were stable. Gross income was slightly down.

Green Lima Beans - - Acreage was up one third. Yields were down slightly, but prices were a little better. Gross income was up significantly.

Onions - - Acreage and yields were up. Prices were down slightly. Gross income was up over 2 per-cent.

<u>Lettuce</u> - - Acreage was down over 50 per-cent. Yields, prices, and gross income were up.

Peppers - - Acreage was up slightly. Yield and prices were down. Gross income was down over 10 per-cent.

Cole Crops - - Acreage was up almost 100 per-cent on cauliflower. Broccoli was stable. Yields on cauliflower were better, broccoli was stable. Both prices were up. Broccoli gross income was up slightly, cauliflower was up over 100 per-cent.

Snap Beans - - These figures are included in miscellaneous in 1965. Acreage was up 25 per-cent. Yields were down slightly. Prices were a little better. Gross income was up approximately \$50,000.

FRUIT AND NUT CROPS

Acreages devoted to fruit and nut crops continue to gain. There is an indication that the walnut and almond acreages are beginning to level off. Apricot planting will continue. We did not have a pear crop this year due to insect losses and poor pollination. Peach income was down drastically due to early fall rains and subsequent development of brown rot. Grape income was also down. Other fruits were fairly stable.

Almonds - - Bearing acreage continues to rise. Yields and prices were down. Gross income was down.

Apricots - - Bearing acreage increased. Yields and prices were down. Gross income was down considerably.

Bushberries - - Acreage, prices and yields were up slightly. Gross income was very favorable.

Grapes - This was a bad year for grapes. Acreage increased, however, very slightly. Yields were up considerably, prices down considerably. Gross income was down approximately \$1,000,000.

Clingstone Peaches - - Bearing acreage was down slightly. Yields were very low due to brown rot damage. Prices were better, however, there was a major decrease in gross income.

Freestone Peaches - - Bearing acreage was fairly stable. Yields and prices were down, gross income was down considerably.

Nectarines - - Bearing acreage was stable. Yields, prices and gross income were down slightly.

Strawberries -- Bearing acreage was up, yields were stable. Prices were considerably better with gross income up substantially.

Walnuts - - Bearing acreage continues to increase. Yields were down slightly. Prices were down some also. Gross income was down approximately \$500,000.

Pears - - There was no 1965 crop. There should be a good income next year.

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY

Beef Cattle - - Cattle and calves on feed increased slightly. Prices were better resulting in a considerable increase in gross income.

<u>Swine</u> - - Pig numbers decreased. Prîces were better and gross income was up.

Sheep - - Small increases in numbers and prices resulted in a small increase in gross income.

Horses and Mules - - A small increase in numbers resulted in a small increase in gross income. Prices remained the same.

Dairying - - A reversal of the trend was evident to a small degree. Grade A milk production was down slightly. Prices were better and gross income was up. Manufacturing milk production was up. Prices were better. Gross income was up.

Poultry and Poultry Products - - Poultry income generally was up with the exception of heavy turkeys and market eggs. Heavy turkey production was down almost 50 per-cent. All other production was up. The overall gross income for poultry and poultry products was very favorable. However, prices on market eggs were down slightly with prices for all other poultry products stable or better.

Herewith we present the 1966 record high Agricultural Crop Report for Stanislaus County. You will note again there is an increase in income over the previous year. This record breaking high of \$193,089,360 is $25\frac{1}{2}$ million dollars higher than the previous record which occurred in 1964.
