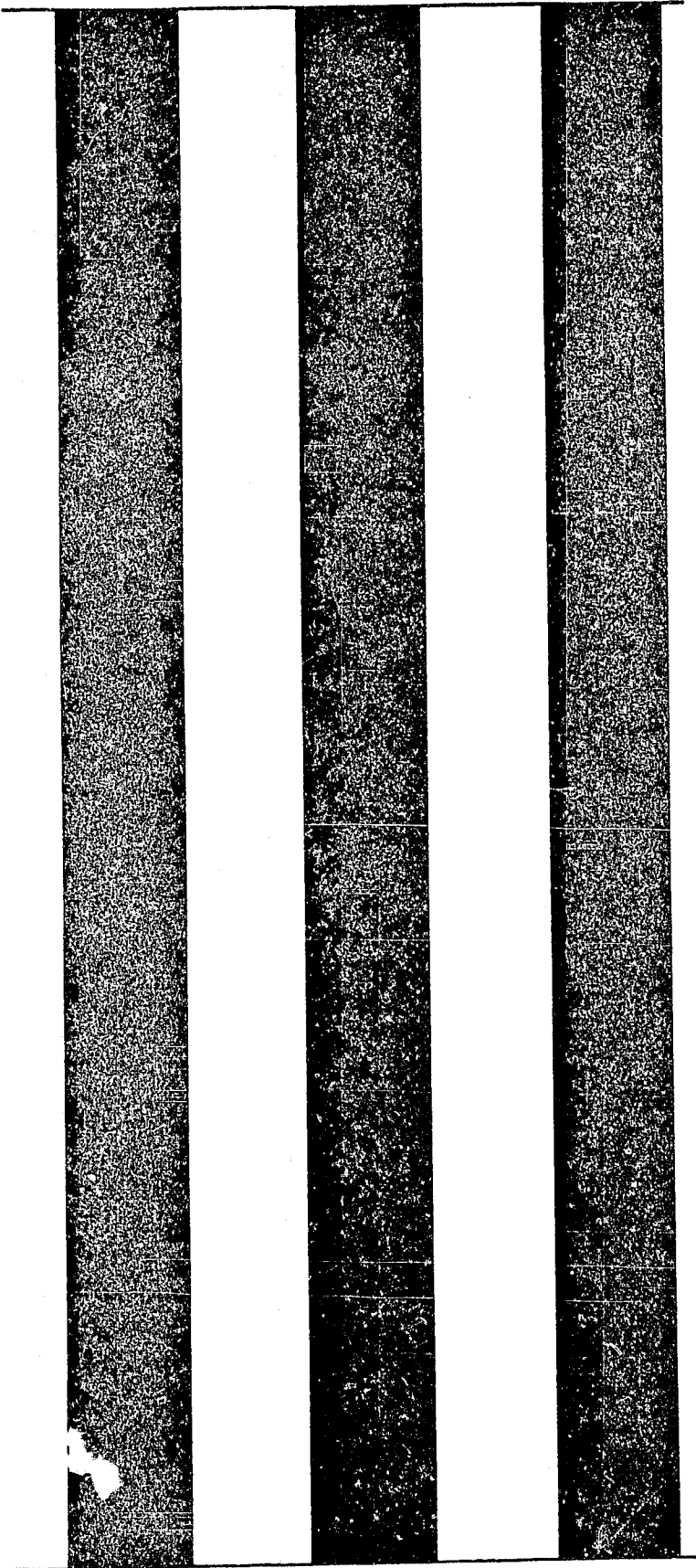

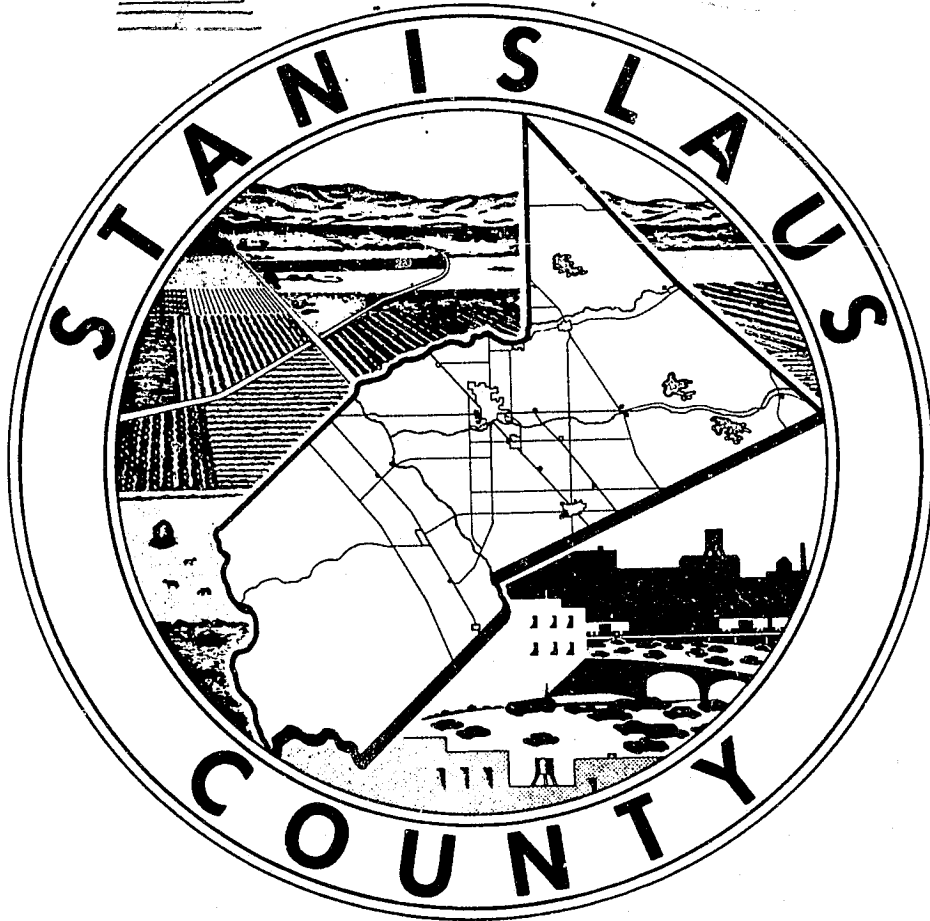


In accordance with Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, we are pleased to submit the 1969 Annual Crop Report.


The values in this report represent the gross value of all agricultural production in Stanislaus County and once again exceeds all previous highs for gross income.

limit net profits.


Many growers suffered severe financial loss due to

damaged crops, particularly wine grapes and almonds.



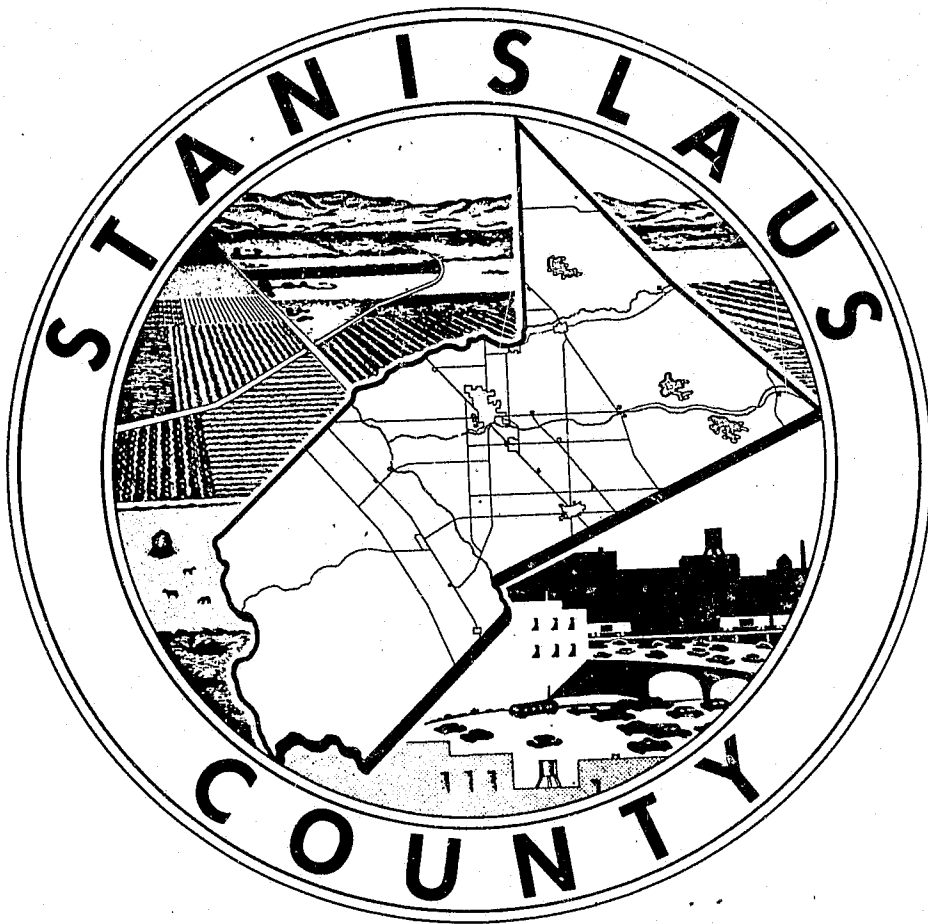

Gentlemen:

In accordance with section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code, we hereby submit the 1973 Crop Report for Stanislaus County.

Although the total gross income figure of \$381,694,100 is an increase of 42% over that of 1972, much of the gain was absorbed by rising interest rates, taxes, farm wage rates, and prices for farm supplies and services. These increasing production and handling costs have continued to limit net profits.


This limitation is particularly true of livestock and poultry and related products. The combined gross income from these commodities amounted to \$194,187,000, an increase of 38% over 1972. At the same time, however, average feedstuff costs rose approximately 55% and other farm expenses are estimated to have increased by 15%.
