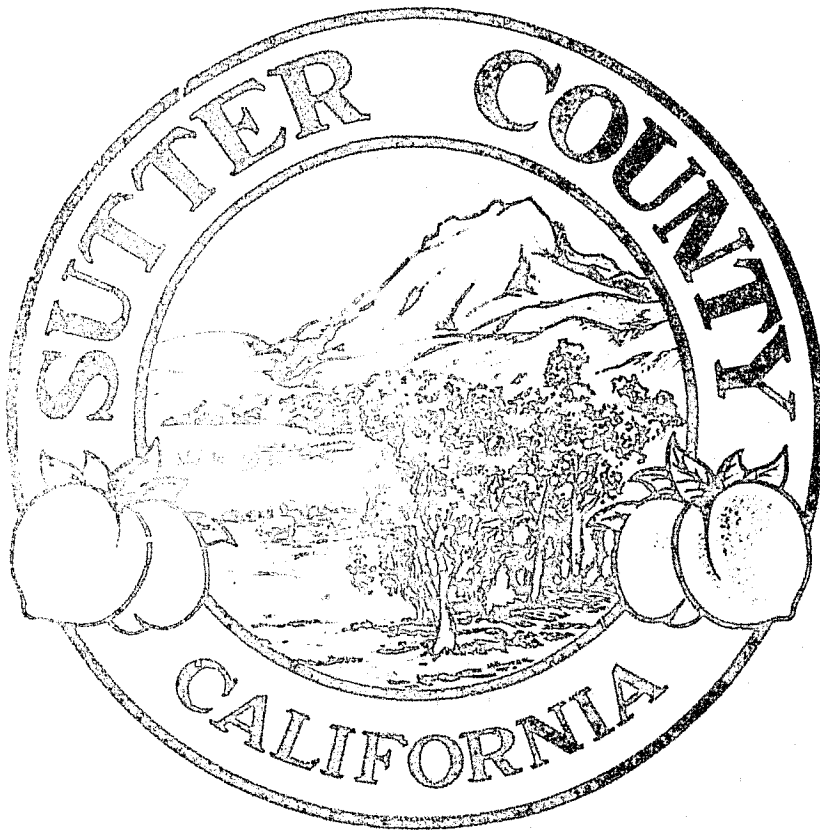


Gentlemen:


I am pleased to present to you the 1970 Agricultural Crop Report as required by Section 2279 of the Agricultural Code.

The report shows a total gross value of \$77,238,400 which is an increase of \$3,231,800 over the 1969 value of \$74,006,520. The Fruit and Nut Crops value hit an all time high in 1970 of \$30,548,800 which is \$4,056,200 above the 1969 value of \$26,492,600. English Walnuts, Prunes and Pears were the biggest gainers. Most of the gains in value it should be noted were increased production and not increased prices to the farmer. The large increase in returns from the Fruit and Nut Crops offset the slight decrease in value of the Field Crops, Vegetable Crops and Apiary. The value of Seed Crops remained about the same and the value of Nursery Products increased. The increase in Livestock and Poultry values was mostly due to the increase in prices received for these animals. Livestock and Poultry Products remained about the same.

I would like to emphasize that the statistics in this report are only gross returns and in no way do they show net profit to producers.

This report is the effort of the Sutter County Department of Agriculture, under the direction of Assistant Agricultural Commissioner, Lourie G. Gaschke. To all those persons who provided us with the information and records necessary to compile this report we extend our appreciation and thanks.

In spite of this record value, few growers received a net return for their efforts in proportion to rising costs of production.


Peach growers, with a surplus program of 35% and prune growers with a 37½% surplus program suffered the greatest.

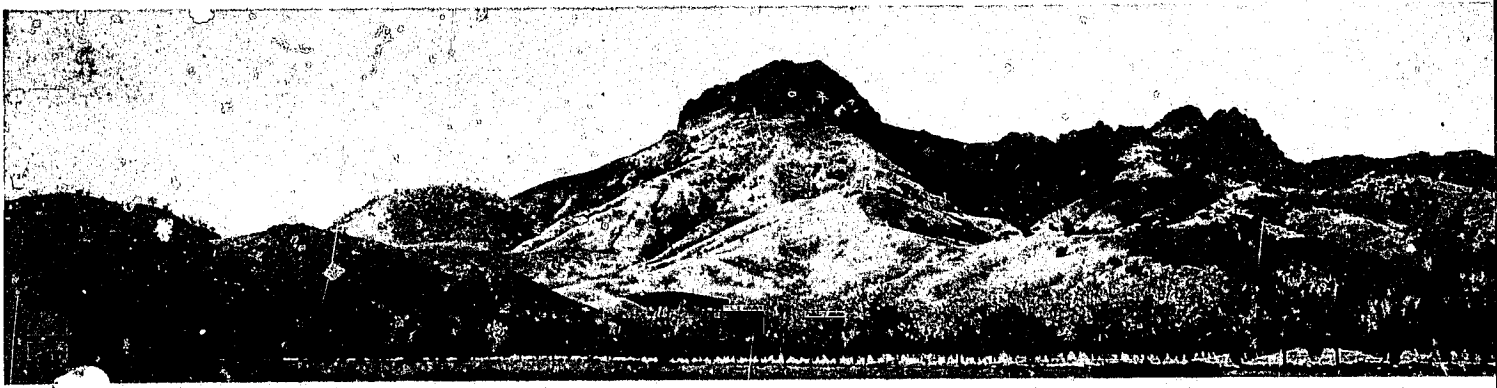

Gentlemen:

I am pleased to present to you the 1972 Agricultural Crop Report as required by Section 2279 of the California Agricultural Code.

Again Sutter County farmers produced a record in gross value of \$95,117,700.

Most of the increased production was due to better returns to rice producers and an increase in tomato acreage and production. Better walnut prices offset poor returns in clingstone peaches and the catastrophic loss which prune growers suffered.

Field crops received better prices than ever before and wheat acreage and yield increases were substantial.

Cattle and calves showed a marked increase in production but the average price was only approximately 5 cents per pound over the previous year.

The figures in this report reflect a gross value to the entire community in services, supplies and related jobs directly attributed to Sutter County growers.

This report is the effort of the Sutter County Department of Agriculture, under the direction of Assistant Agricultural Commissioner, Lourie G. Gaschke.

To all those individuals who provided us with the information and records necessary to compile this report we extend our sincere appreciation and thanks.

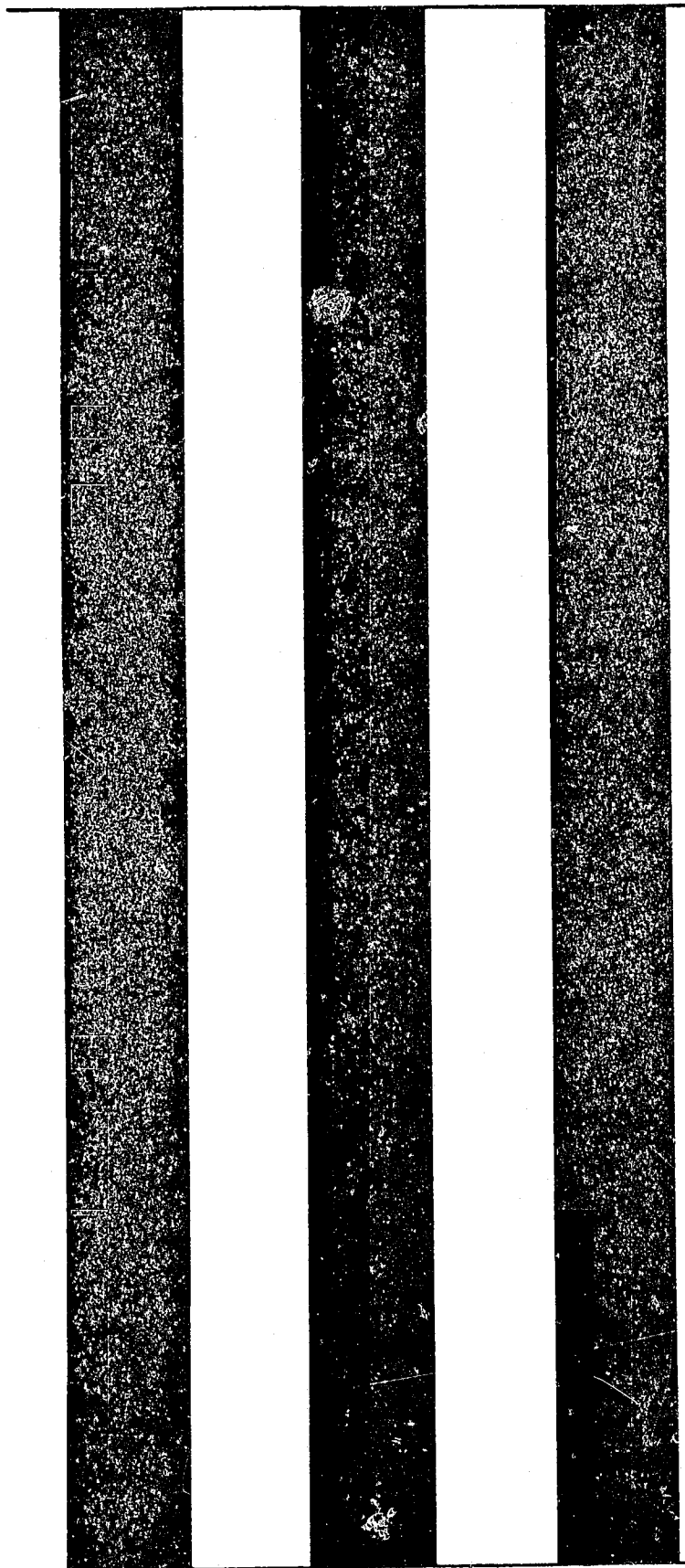

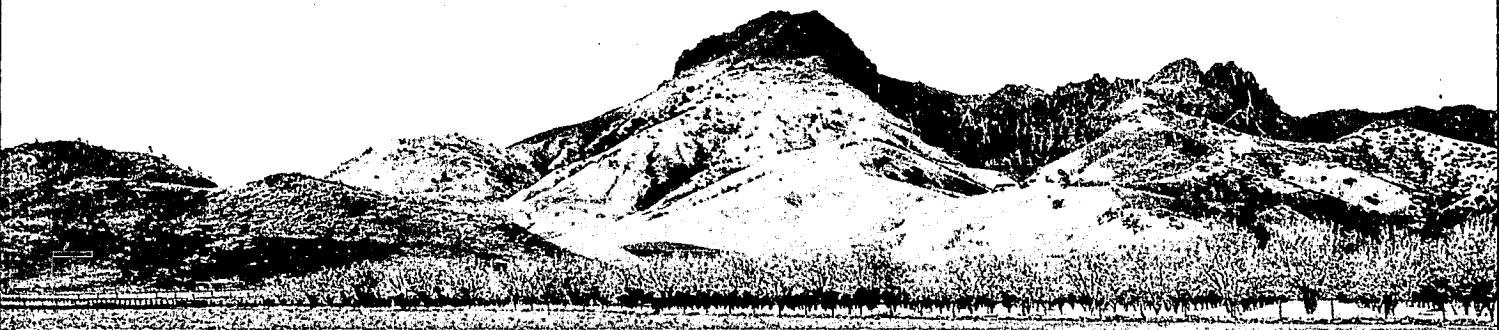

1973 was an unusually successful year for agriculture in Sutter County.


Production levels were up in prunes, rice, canning tomatoes, cattle and calves, sheep and lambs but many crops were below 1972 levels. Higher prices for most commodities caused an increase to a record high of \$159,204,000, \$63,375,600 more than the 1972 figure of \$95,828,400, an increase of 66%.

I hasten to emphasize the fact that these figures are gross values and do not reflect the increased costs of equipment, fertilizers, pesticides, fuel, labor and other supplies which are increasing at an equally high rate.

Again, the value of agriculture to Sutter County as a whole is shown in increases in sales in the area of service, supplies and related jobs which all contribute to the well-being of Sutter County.

To all those individuals who provided the information necessary to compile this report I extend my sincere appreciation.

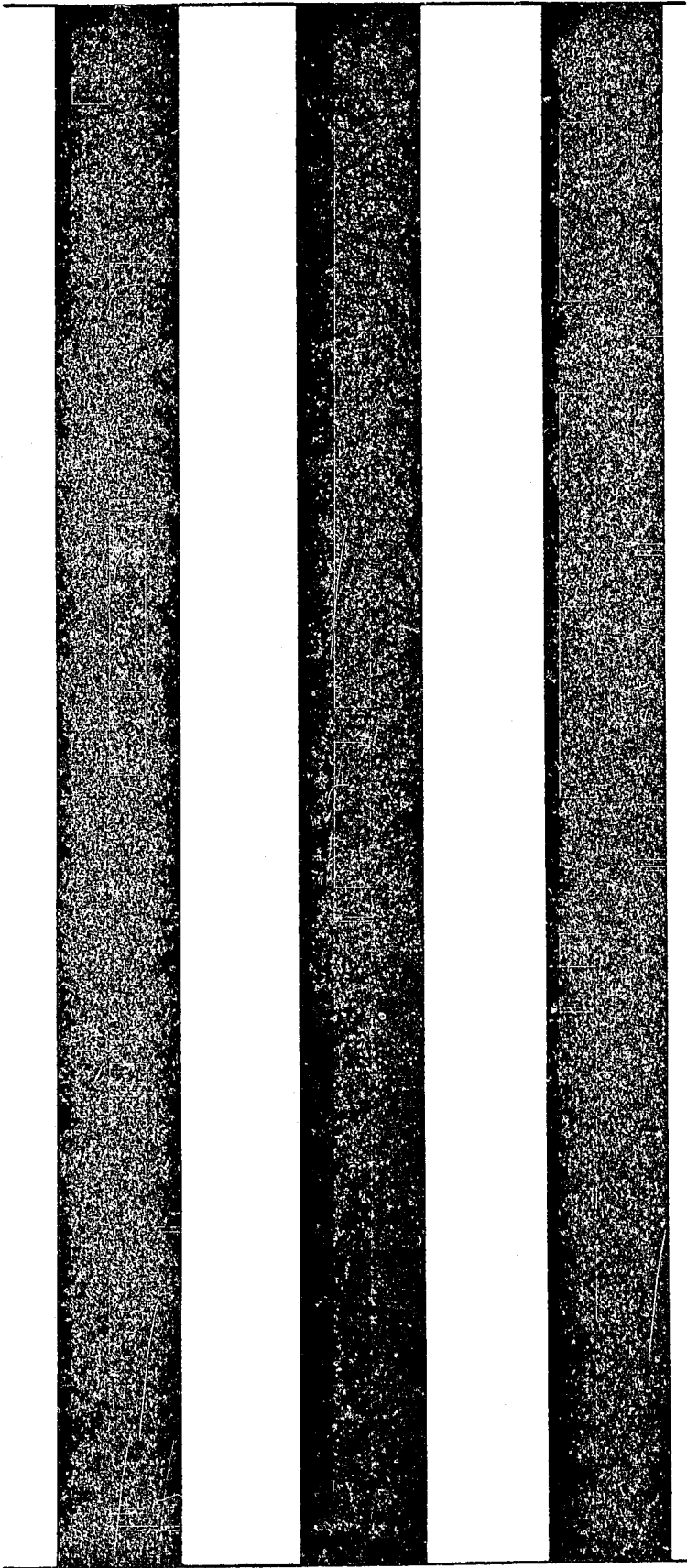

Gentlemen:

I am pleased to present to you the 1974 Agricultural Crop Report as required by Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The gross value of Crop and Livestock products in Sutter County set a new record high of \$179,719,500 in 1974 which is \$20,539,500 higher than the 1973 figure of \$159,180,000, an increase of almost 13%.

Values were up for rice, beans, peaches, seed crops, canning tomatoes, grain sorghum, safflower and alfalfa hay.

Products showing a decline in value were prunes, walnuts, almonds, cattle & calves, sheep and lambs.


Chemical, equipment, labor and other related costs continued to rise at a rapid rate.

These values are gross values and do not reflect these steadily rising production costs.

In 1973 Sutter County ranked 15th in the State in production value in spite of her smaller size and should easily maintain that position in 1974.

To all those individuals who so willingly provided the information necessary to compile this report I again express my sincere appreciation.
